## Helping elderly in care live well

When the Guernsev International Insurance Agency (GIIA) gave us a grant towards a project, at the time to be decided, the committee set about discussing how best to use these precious funds in a way that would benefit the maximum number of people with Dementia.

It didn't take us very long, in conjunction with Susan Steer of the HSSD Adult Mental Health Team, to come up with the inspired idea of arranging a training seminar. The project was aimed at training a large number of employees from the care homes in how best to provide occupational therapy for the people with Dementia who they care for. their family and friends So with Susan's guidance and knowledge a program was put together, a trainer arranged and pre-training sessions commenced.

At our Delancey Centre on the 14th January the actual training session started at 9:00 and went on until after 4:00. A variety of topics were covered during

the day, with the overall aim being to encourage occupational therapy in the care home environment using a toolkit supplied by the trainer Karin Orman. Karin an occupational therapist is quoted as saying "keeping elderly care home residents active is essential for their mental wellbeing". Karin also spoke of the importance of activities taking place in care homes to prevent the resident from "just existina".

The toolkit which was used by Karin and given to all who attended took the form of leaflets and included key elements for staff, residents and to consider such as "Am I making the most of living in a care home?", "Why is being active important to me?" and "What are the key elements to ensure a good home life?"

We would like to again thank the Guernsey International Insurance Agency for providing these

# Cathy Gill's Visit to Jersey Alzheimer's Association

Cathy was kind enough to write us an article on her visit to Jersey. "In February I spent the day with members of the Jersey Alzheimer's Association. I met Mark Blamey (Association Manager) and we spent the first hour discussing the work of the Associations in our respective islands. Whilst the main purpose of the trip was to learn about the musical activities offered by the JAA for dementia residents on the island, it was advantageous to learn about the background of the Association in Jersey.

The head office is situated in St Helier and makes a corner in a busy part of the town. The number of people dropping in for information has increased greatly since they moved their office to St Helier. The receptionist/secretary Beverly, is present 5 mornings a week for 'drop in' chats, advice and coffee.

The JAA has forged close links with art therapists, occupational therapists and swimming facilities to offer clients and carers diverse opportunities for activities. They offer lunches on a Saturday. They also employ an educator/facilitator Michaela, who goes into educational establishments and organisations to tell people of what the JAA has to offer. In the short time that Mark has been working for the JAA the volunteer base has expanded greatly.

The JAA hold a Musical Memories afternoon every Friday from 2-3.30pm. The afternoon starts with tea and social time followed by the music session which lasts one hour. It takes place in a beautifully renovated church in St Saviour, in the centre of the Island. The Musical Memories afternoon is the

only music session the JAA offers to the community. Mark was interested to hear that the GAA take their Singing Down Memory Lane sessions into residential homes, nursing homes and Day Centres and agreed it may be a way forward for the expansion of music into the Jersey community. The JAA is very keen to get active in the community on a parochial level.

The Musical Memories afternoon session is taken by Fiona Speller, an experienced music therapist and former special needs teacher. Fiona works on a freelance basis and is employed by various establishments all over the island in her specialist role.

A meeting with her over lunch was very informative and I had the privilege of attending a JAA music session run by her. Obviously there were differences in the way that the Jersey and Guernsey music sessions are set up and the range of clients differ, but essentially our sessions operate along similar lines in terms of repertoire, action songs and percussion. It was a very interesting and different experience for me to be present as a participant rather than as a leader.

My day with the JAA was valuable indeed and I gained so much seeing first-hand what is happening in our sister island. We agreed that as both islands are geographically so close it would be advantageous to both the GAA and the JAA to have a closer relationship. We felt this would help us keep more informed and provide a broader service to the ever increasing demands of our respective communities."

This year we were delighted to be invited by Christian Morris, the curator of the museum to be present at the opening of this little gem of a tourist attraction. A small group of us were given a warm welcome by Christian and then a guided tour of the museum. It is worth noting that there are in the region of 20,000 artefacts within the museum, and it is well worth a visit should you find yourselves with an hour or two spare. ## Alzheimer's Research UK - House of Lords reception



Our Chairman was very privileged to be invited to a reception in April at the House of Lords in Westminster Palace. This is her account of her visit. "I arrived at 'Black Rod's Garden Entrance' just before 3:30pm where my identification was checked more than once before I was allowed to enter the inner area of the Palace of Westminster, a very grand and stately looking building. All the guests were then shown into the Cholmondeley Room and Terrace with beautiful views overlooking the Thames ready for the reception. Champagne awaited everyone together with very dainty sandwiches and miniature desserts

Guests at the reception probably numbered around 100, so I mingled with Lords and Ladies for a while until we were all informed that the afternoon interview would commence. Baroness Susan Greenfield, who was sponsoring the afternoon, thanked Quilter Cheviot Investment Management for supporting the event. After a short introduction by a member of the Alzheimer's Research UK team, I sat to hear Mariella Frostrup, a well-known journalist and broadcaster, interview Prof John Hardy. In November 2015 Prof Hardy was the first UK researcher to be awarded the \$3 million Breakthrough Prize in Life Sciences for his pioneering work on the genetic causes

of Alzheimer's disease, other dementias and Parkinson's disease. Prof Hardy recently became one of the Lead Academic Scientists at Alzheimer's Research UK's Drug Discovery Institute at UCL. Prof Hardy talked about his experiences of dementia research and gave the attendees his thoughts on how far away we are from new dementia treatments, providing everyone with a unique opportunity to hear from one of the world's most renowned dementia scientists. He has been conducting a study on Amyloid proteins for some considerable time, the results of which should be available by either the end of the year or early next. It

is interesting to note that no new drugs have been brought onto the market for nearly 10 years."

On 1st May it was reported that Alzheimer's Research UK is to put £50,000,000 into a new research institute dedicated to defeating Dementia. The Alzheimer's Society will put in a similar amount and the government a further £150,000,000. The Institute will be staffed by hundreds of scientists. The science minister said "the institute will pull together the UK's world-leading scientists and cutting edge research tools".

We end our Spring Newsletter on a sad note. Due to the sudden death of the Lieutenant Governor Air Marshall Peter Walker, our patron, Mrs Lynda Walker, has left the island earlier than expected. Lynda has been our patron since her arrival to the island and has always been the kindest and most caring friend. We shall miss her greatly and wish her a happy retirement in her new home.
