The Sustainable Markets Initiative Health Systems Task Force has developed a set of joint targets for suppliers

- Private sector members within the Task Force each have **supplier targets on climate and sustainability**
- Task Force members have now aligned on a **set of joint, minimum targets for climate and sustainability** which aim to reduce complexity for suppliers
- The Task Force considered industry best practices and engaged suppliers prior to finalising the targets
- Key dimensions were announced at COP27, with this further detail now being shared
- Each member will **implement these targets** as part of their existing supplier engagement programmes
- The Task Force also aims to develop solutions to **support suppliers** to decarbonise and achieve these targets

Note: These standards do not replace higher targets already set by individual SMI members

		Set science-based targets By 2025, commit to set near-term targets aligned to the 1.5°C pathway (SBTi)
		Reduce, recycle and reuse waste and energy By 2025, set targets to reduce waste (incl. solvents) & energy and reuse materials in manufacturing
	Continuous beyond 2025	Switch to renewable power ² Commit to switch to at least 80% renewable power² by 2030 & make commitment public
	Switch to renewable heat By 2030, explore options to source green heat	
	Cascade targets upstream Commit to set standards for own suppliers	
	Reduce water usage Set targets to increase water efficiency and commit to adopt water stewardship standards	

Note: These supplier targets apply only to suppliers of the healthcare business of each private sector member; 1. All of scope 1 & 2, and 3.1, 3.2, 3.3 & 3.4; 2. Excluding nuclear, & for biofuels, ensuring that feedstock meets sustainability criteria (including having low LULUCF emissions). Target may vary by market based on local market constraints
