- give something back to a special place that is important to you and leave a long-lasting legacy to impact the local community


HOW YOU CAN HELP

A Lasting Gift

How a legacy from a lady whose love of Gloucester Cathedral enabled us to establish our award-winning education centre.

In 1998 Mrs Nigella Greening left a generous gift to support education at the Cathedral in her will. At the time there were no adequate facilities for groups of children to use, and little provision for them to get the most out of their experience here. Mrs Greening's wonderful gesture helped to kick-start an ambitious project tackling this problem by creating a new education space and developing engaging learning programmes for local schools.

Today, our education department continues to go from strength to strength with over 7,000 children now taking part in inspiring activities each year. It is a wonderful example of just how much impact a legacy can have. We are forever grateful to Mrs Greening for this gift and for all it continues to achieve for children today.

 - o Our world-famous cloister, famed for its remarkable fan-vaulting
 - Stunningly crafted gargoyles and pinnacles
 - The birthplace of perpendicular architecture
 - Historic chapels and monuments including the tomb of King Edward II
- Protect the centuries-long tradition of craftsmanship in the Workshop of St Peter, where our talented stonemasons provide world-class training in heritage, conservation and maintenance to apprentices.




Unrestricted Legacies

It is impossible to predict what challenges lie ahead. Unrestricted legacies can be directed towards the area of most urgent need at the time they are received, responding to the immediate needs of your Cathedral and community.

Unrestricted funding can have a substantial impact on a range of activities. This includes all areas highlighted in this leaflet but also other parts of the Cathedral daily life, such as:

- Representing 1,300 years of Christian faith, Gloucester Cathedral remains a central place of worship for thousands each year. Your support can help fund costs such as vestments, altar cloths, provision of flowers and our dedicated clergy salaries
- Investment in technology to continue bringing worship to a wider audience through live streaming and future digital methods
- Almost 400,000 visitors flock to the Cathedral each year to experience worship, heritage, and culture through world-class exhibitions. The running costs to keep the lights on, the building warm, and to staff all areas of the Cathedral during services, daily visits and events is substantial and relies on donations
- We could not exist without every member of the talented and invested staff team. They play a critical role in looking after the needs of all our community, spreading news to the widest audience, attracting frequent and new visitors, and protecting and caring for this medieval jewel for future generations. Without government funding, we rely solely on generous individuals to protect their future too.

Give continuous support to a wide variety of projects through a legacy to the Friends.

Annual grants to the Cathedral are made from the Friends of Gloucester Cathedral, a separate charity set up wholly to support the Cathedral. Grants are awarded by the Friends' Council to assist with various projects.

Legacies can be given to the Friends for the general needs of the Cathedral to be granted at the discretion of the Friends' Council, or for a restricted purpose, for example: -

- 1. To conserve and maintain the fabric
- 2. To support the Cathedral music
- 3. To support the work of the stonemasons

The support of the Friends is essential to ensure that almost 1,000 years of heritage and music are maintained for future generations. Legacies are a very valuable part of the income received by the Friends

Leaving *a gift to* Your Cathedral

Your will is a sensitive matter and is best discussed with a solicitor. However, if you have already made, or are looking to make a bequest (immediate or endowed) and would like to discuss it or seek advice on what to do next, please contact the Development Office. It is worth noting that leaving a charitable gift in your will is an astute means of tax planning for you and your family. In 2022 the Inheritance Tax (IHT) threshold is 40%. If your estate is over a certain threshold, £0.40 of every £1 could potentially be 'lost' in tax. However, a legacy to a charity is automatically free of IHT. This could take the form of money, shares, a work of art, land or simply what remains when all gifts have been made. If you leave 10% or more of your net estate, then IHT overall is reduced to 36%. This means family will pay a substantially smaller tax liability.
