Geoff was a fund of information about the mills and factories along the route e.g. The Strachan family who bought Lodgemore Mills in 1865 and are still operating from this site. The Strachan brand today is the benchmark in quality for snooker and pool tables. As the sun went in and the cold predominated, we arrived at the Lock Keeper's Café at Wallbridge for a delicious lunch. After a quick look round Stroud, we returned to Gloucester on the 3:30 bus and were home before the hailstones came down.
