PROJECT PILGRIM PHASE TWO: BEACON OF HOPE

Phase One of Project Pilgrim saw us transform a car park into a new green public space, as well as a beautiful setting for this extraordinary building. Creating a new welcome space and improving accessibility across the site, as well as introducing an award-winning interpretation scheme, has transformed the Cathedral into a world class heritage destination and increased visitor income. Lastly, conserving and representing the "at risk" 15th century Lady Chapel has breathed new life into a tired part of the building.

In Phase Two our vision is to re-establish the Cathedral as a beacon of hope at the heart of the city and county. We will reveal our abbey history to inspire a sustainable future for all, working with partners to deliver against social responsibility priorities which make a difference to the lives of Gloucester's diverse communities. We will ensure our catering and visitor facilities are as outstanding as the rest of the Cathedral and able to support our finances into the future.

It's time to deliver the rest of our Project Pilgrim Vision, refined to respond to the impacts of the pandemic and the devastation threatened by the climate emergency. We'll use our heritage, plus our partnerships and platform, to showcase the potential within all Cathedrals.

1 CHAPTER HOUSE

We will create a hub for our growing social responsibility work, whilst ensuring our musical heritage contributes to the city's cultural journey by developing a dynamic music and performance space.

② GARTH AND GARTH EXTERIOR CLOISTER WALLS

We will carefully restore and conserve the stonemasonry of the cloister walls and landscape the Garth to create a wellbeing garden.

3 NORTH NAVE

We will conserve and repair the weathered stonework to keep the building watertight and weatherproof for future generations.

4 INNER CLOISTER PILOT

We will conduct crucial piloting of the necessary restoration of this world-renowned cloister to prepare us for the long-term Cloister Project (See p13).

3 PARLIAMENT ROOMS AND CAFÉ

We will breathe new life into the grade one listed Parliament Rooms and connected buildings, revealing their history and making them accessible, hospitable, and versatile, while also offering a welcoming secular space for learning activities for all ages and backgrounds.

6 GREEN SPACES

we will develop every bit of green space into "GLOUCESTER'S GARDEN", restoring people and nature through distinct but connected areas.

THE ORGAN PROJECT

We are proud to have one of the most significant instruments in any cathedral accompanying daily worship. It is time for a sensitive refurbishment of our much-loved organ to ensure its future at the heart of our musical life.

Last refurbished in 1971, the organ is renowned for being so much more than just a liturgical instrument, attracting the best organists for our recital programme, inspiring visitors and worshippers from around the globe and playing a key role in the success of the oldest music festival in the world – the Three Choirs Festival.

We will ensure the organ's future as a thoroughly versatile and exciting instrument for both worship and recitals.









ORGAN REFURBISHMENT

Developing the tonal scheme for the organ to accompany the Cathedral's choirs with colour, sensitivity and to complement the liturgy throughout the year.

Ensuring the organ has sufficient weight and gravitas to support the enthusiastic singing of large congregations.


Enabling the organ to continue playing a key role in other artistic expressions as an appropriate symphonic instrument for the Three Choirs Festival and other recitals.

2020 2021 2022 2023 2024 2025 2026 JANUARY 2024 – DECEMBER 2024



THE CLOISTER PROJECT

The GREAT CLOISTER is widely regarded as the first and best example of fan vaulting in the world and is now known as 'Hogwarts' to Harry Potter fans. We will use the long-term conservation of this extraordinary built heritage (including the North Nave and Transept) to develop our stonemasons training and mentoring programme. We will offer opportunities for at least eight talented craftspeople to develop their careers through a once-in-a-millennium opportunity to work on this extraordinary fabric whilst gaining a foundation degree in Heritage Skills. Visitors will experience conservation first-hand, learning about the people and techniques which protect heritage for future generations and we will open the Cathedral Workshop to wider uses, including tours and training.

FOUR CLOISTER WALKS

Before its current incarnation, Gloucester Cathedral was a monastic community of men and women, thereafter an abbey where every aspect of daily life from food growing and preparation, learning and democratic decision making to hospitality, almsgiving and medical care took place alongside worship. The GREAT CLOISTER was the centre of this life.


Built in the 14th century, Gloucester's Cloister represents the first example of fan-vaulting in the world. It remains internationally significant today but a 2019 survey confirmed it is at risk.

Through the Cloister Project we are committing to train a new generation of stonemasons and ensuring continuation of the craft. We will deliver a long term stonemason apprentice programme to offer aspiring stonemasons an opportunity to train under the watchful eye of our talented and well recognised master mason – Pascal Mychalysin.

As part of our commitment to train future generations of stonemasons, apprentices will work with our skilled team to carefully clean and conserve the stonework, removing the cement pointing and replacing with lime mortar, and renewing decayed stone elements. This isn't a job to rush and since much of the work will be taking place indoors and at ground floor level we will be able to show visitors both the exceptional architecture and human skill and care up close.
