Some programmes have been designed by artists and some by partner arts organisations in the area, but we hope you'll find something here to suit you!


Welcome to the NEIC's first *Try it Out* Programme for the Spring/Summer of 2022.



Fighting words are launching a new creative writing initiative called Story Seeds and we would like to invite you to take part. The Story Seeds project supports people to write their own stories with the aim of enabling them to begin to understand their own life story (their personal, circumstantial and emotional story) and their place (be it geographical, social, imaginative). This is aimed at not only introducing them to creative writing but also to strengthen their positive sense of themselves and to allow them to reimagine the negatives in their lives and transform their sense of place and possibility.

In all cases, Fighting Words are equipped to deliver programmes with live or online workshops, or a combination of both. In addition to Fighting Words staff, workshops will be facilitated by experienced creative writing tutors.

Max numbers: 10 per class.



This Printmaking Programme can be three x 1.5 hour sessions once a week or a once off 1.5 session.

## Introduction to Samba with MaSamba


