CCQ offers a wide range of cancer support services to assist patients and their families. In 2021, we provided thousands of people in the Mackay region with support.



2216 nights of accommodation provided to people from Mackay.



131 contacts were made with 13 11 20, providing support to those impacted by cancer.



14 people referred to our Cancer Counselling Service.



\$6,196 of financial assistance provided through Cancer Council services, supporting 31 patients.



16 wigs and turbans were provided to Queenslanders who experienced hair loss as a result of cancer treatment.
