WHAT WE DO

We started in Sierra Leone in 2008, and we have reached over 706,887 children in low resource environments and emergencies with services such as direct access to education and mental health provision.

We have also supported over 82,387 adults to set up businesses so they can pay for their children's education.



Educating Children

Street Child build schools, train teachers, and share how important education is.



Protecting Children

Street Child works to protect children, improve their situations, and their mental health and wellbeing.



Children in Emergencies

Street Child helps refugees, children caught in conflict, or those hit by natural disasters. Our teams act to protect children and their futures through education.

WHERE WE WORK

We work in 20 different countries across Africa and Asia, including an emergency response in Europe. Street Child works in the world's most difficult places.

We go where others won't, including those that are hard-to-reach and fragile, disaster-affected areas.





EMMANUEL'S STORY



Emmanuel* is 15 years old and lives in Margibi, Maryland County, Liberia, a very remote part of the country. He lives with his mother who makes baskets to catch fish, and his siblings.

Families like Emmanuel's often cannot find enough food to eat. Instead of going to school he used to spend the day setting traps to catch animals to feed his family. He would sell any left overs at the local market, but his family never had enough to eat or enough money.

Emmanuel used to hang around the school field watching the other children go into the classrooms to learn as his mother did not realise that attending school was free.

When Street Child explained that they did not have to pay for school, Emmanuel began attending with the other children. He was so happy. He no longer spends time watching other children from the school field but enjoys playing football there with his friends.

Now he is safe, in school and learning, Emmanuel enjoys studying social studies and wants to be a doctor when he grows up.

"I didn't even know how to hold a pen, now every year because I go to school, I try the best I can do in school. Now I am the president in my class. I want to say to Street Child thank you."

Here are some examples of what your donation could do:

Afghanistan. Could provide hot meals consisting of basic food and water for a £30 Rohingya refugee family of 7-8 members for 30 days in Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh. .

Could provide training and support to a community volunteer £60 teacher to deliver quality teaching to conflict-affected children and prepare them to return to formal school in Nigeria.
