WEEE/BATT/PACK at Tobii

Electrical and electronic equipment (EEE) has permeated into every aspect of our modern life. But old electrical devices are a potential danger for humans and the environment. To curtail the negative effects, electronic scrap and used batteries must be sorted and disposed of properly, with the benefit of retrieving raw materials for the production industry at the same time.

Producer responsibility for electronics and batteries means that all companies that produce and sell electronics or batteries must make a contribution to help cover the costs of collecting and recycling the products. Producer responsibility is based on an EU directive from 2005 and aims to promote increased sustainability.

1. Information about WEEE management

In the European Union, the recycling of Electrical and Electronic Equipment (EEE) is regulated through the WEEE Directive and its national transpositions in the different Member States. The EU Commission drafted the first European directive in 1988, covering the introduction, the recovery and the environmentally friendly disposal of electrical and electronic equipment and establishing the obligations of producers.

The directive provides the legal framework, but each member state has implemented it on a national level in a different manner. Based on the polluter-pays-principle and product stewardship, producers are obliged to finance waste collection and recycling – the so-called WEEE costs.

That old electrical devices must not be disposed of with household waste is indicated by the crossed-out wheeled bin symbol.



Sweden

Tobii's headquarter is located in Stockholm, Sweden. Under the Sweden Regulation on Producer Responsibility for Electrical and Electronic Equipment which came into force on August 13th, 2005, for equipment that you buy from Tobii AB after August 13th, 2005, Tobii AB is required to provide arrangements for the collection, treatment, recycling and recovery of any electrical and electronic equipment that you buy from them after August 13th, 2005, when that equipment eventually becomes waste. The financing of collection and recycling of any waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE) arising from equipment bought before August 13th, 2005, is the customer's responsibility.

1.1 How to recycle your Tobii product

For consumers:

Tobii is a member of various compliance schemes for collection, recycling and re-using of electronic waste (WEEE), batteries and packaging. We have partnered with local organizations within the European Union as well as in UK, Switzerland and Norway to avoid unnecessary transport of electronic waste and batteries for take-back.

You can return your used Eye Tracker to one of the municipality's recycling centers free of charge.

Businesses Customers:

For all products, except those listed below, please turn in your used Eye Tracker to your local recycling partner.

For Spectrum, TX300, and T60 XL customers

We encourage our customers to arrange recycling with a local recycling partner, but due to the size of the monitor, these Eye Trackers are eligible for our take -back program and it is possible to return them to our Stockholm office.

Tobii pays for the costs of treatment, recycling and recovery of the WEEE to meet the targets set by the Swedish Regulations and pays for the costs of data management and reporting to the Swedish Environmental Protection Agency to demonstrate compliance with all administrative requirements of the Swedish Regulations.

In case of returning your Eye Trackers to our Stockholm office, you take responsibility for the transportation costs.

It is possible to return non-Tobii branded electronics with the purchase of a similar Tobii system. For doing so, please inform your Sales representative when ordering a new Tobii product.

Return to Stockholm: Contact Tobii's Customer Care via our customer portal and inform them about the return. Please make sure the unit is properly packed and add a comment "to be recycled" on the package itself or the label. Feel free to choose any carrier of your preference. Having tracking service to the package is helpful for later reference.

Recycle via your own local recycling partner: Please contact Tobii's Customer Care. You will receive a manual for correct preparation for recycling of your Eye Tracker to give to your recycling partner if needed.

Tobii complies with the regulations for consumer electronics in EU and on relevant markets and uses only materials and components that meet the RoHS and REACH standards.

1.2 WEEE registration numbers

In Germany and France, producers need to maintain a WEEE registration number. In other countries, no registration number must be provided but you can search for the producers name in the national WEEE register.

WEEE in Germany

The so-called ElektroG2 came into force on October 24, 2015. It implements the EU directives 2002/95 / EG1, 2002/96 / EG2 and 2012/19 / EU. The purpose is to avoid waste from such devices and to recycle them as best as possible to protect the environment. Private customers can hand in their old devices at municipal waste disposal sites.

Producers are responsible for financing the costs of taking back, environmentally friendly treatment, recycling and disposing of waste electrical and electronic equipment that is handed over to municipal waste disposal sites. Tobii fulfills the obligations arising from this and registers with the European Recycling Platform (ERP) Deutschland GmbH.

The registration number for Tobii AB is DE71041126.

WEEE in France.

The WEEE sector entered into force for the general public in France on November 15, 2006. The objective of this sector is to organize and finance the recycling of devices that have reached the end of their useful life on the national territory.

Tobii fulfills its obligations regarding WEEE by being a member of ECOLOGIC www.ecologic-france.com.

Our registration number in France is FR022945.

2. Information about battery management

The European Battery Directive 2006/66/EC was adopted in Europe from 26 September 2006 and requires European countries to transpose the Directive into national law. The aim of the Battery Directive is to increase the percentage of batteries that are returned and recycled, because they contain not only valuable raw materials but also substances that are environmental and health hazards. On top of this, it sets limits for the use of harmful substances such as lead, mercury and cadmium. The Battery Directive requires manufacturers, distributors or importers of batteries to contribute to the cost of disposing of the batteries.

We have partnered with local organizations within the European Union to avoid unnecessary transport of batteries for take-back.

Sweden

In Sweden, Tobii complies with Swedish battery legislation by being a member of EI-Kretsen, which reports for us to the Swedish Environmental Protection Agency (Naturvårdsverket), and thus fulfills the producer responsibility for batteries (SFS 2008:834). The municipalities are responsible for collecting used batteries and accumulators. EI-Kretsen operates a collection system and guarantees that collected batteries are disposed of and recycled in an environmentally and correctly correct manner in accordance with applicable laws.

In Germany and France, producers need to maintain a battery registration number. In other Countries, no registration number must be provided but you can search for the producers name in the national battery register.

Germany

Tobii is a member of the Joint Take-Back System for Batteries (GRS). GRS fulfills the obligation stipulated in the Battery Ordinance for manufacturers and importers to take back used batteries free of charge, to recycle batteries in accordance with German waste regulations and to dispose of non-recyclable batteries.

For this purpose, GRS Batteries provides return containers and organizes the disposal services, i. H. Logistics, collection, transport, sorting, recycling and / or disposal. As of 2022, GRS is reporting Tobii's data to the German EAR Foundation as required by the newest revision of the regulation on Producer Responsibility for Electrical and Electronic Equipment.

France:

In May 1999, the French government signed a decree relating to the sale and disposal of batteries and accumulators. Tobii has a partnership with Corepile and complies with the obligations of this decree. 3. Information about packaging waste managing

Global we can see increasing quantities of packaging waste, which cause environmental problems. The EU Packaging Directive 94/62/EC, which is valid throughout Europe, serves to ensure that packaging and packaging waste are of a uniform, environmentally friendly and health-friendly nature. In addition to the substances contained and their effects, it includes the objective and achievement of recycling.

All packaging placed on the EU market has to comply with essential requirements related to its manufacturing, composition, and reusable or recoverable nature.

Sweden

Producers' responsibility for recycling / reuse of packaging is mandatory under the Ordinance on producer responsibility for packaging (SFS 1997: 185). Tobii complies with Swedish packaging legislation through its membership in FTI.

T60 XL In Germany and France, producers need to maintain a packaging waste registration number. In other Countries, no registration number must be provided but you can search for the producers name in the national packaging waste register.

Germany

France

Tobii complies with French requirements on packaging waste in adherence to the Eco-Packaging system. The decree of 1 April 1992 stipulates that any person in the market for packaged products destined for households should contribute to, or take charge of, the elimination of used packaging. Tobii uses Citeo as a partner. Citeo organises collection, sorting and recycling and provides.
