

Flooding Advice

Seven ways to protect your property from floods



Listen for flood and any high tide warnings in your area. Follow any advice such as evacuation notices.



In the event of a flood, if possible, raise ground floor furniture off the ground and if any electrical equipment is wet do not touch it.



If safe to do so, turn off gas, electricity and water supplies, if water is about to enter your property.



Check your gutters and drains around your property are clear of any obstruction or debris. Gutters should be checked and cleared regularly.



If required, take preventative measures to mitigate a loss by protecting your property with sandbags.



If your property is in an area vulnerable to flooding consider installing preventative equipment such as flood gates.



When the water level begins to go down, open your windows. The air outside will be drier than the air inside your property.
