LOTA presentation	Craig Hidalgo presented information to OTAC the use of dry needling in OT practice.  It was noted by Craig that OTs have knowledge of anatomy; dry needling can help with injury affecting roles (occupation) within daily lives; helping with pain management, resenting muscle to a resting state, helps patient to move forward with ADLs with minimal pain.  Discussion with Craig and OTAC included: need for specialized training for dry needling that should involve a certain number of hours to ensure that the practitioner was well trained; discussion of why OTs should be considered to have authority to utilize this method/modality; Billing for this is neuromuscular re-	Action: Craig is to find literature that supports dry needling clinical value.
