Despite all the challenges we faced in 2021, it was a hugely successful year for Calibre thanks to everyone's continued support. Many of the highlights are mentioned in this report.

We also hope to build on the initial work we began in 2021, working with schools and partner agencies to research and measure the benefit audiobooks can bring in supporting mental health and educational achievement for children with learning disabilities across the UK, helping them enjoy and engage in reading. As part of our commitment to strengthen our services for younger members we will form a youth board to help further shape and deliver our services.

Last but not least we will also commit to reducing our carbon footprint wherever possible and to increase our diversity of staff, volunteers and members as well as our book collection so we truly reflect the diversity of the UK population.

Why are we needed?

In a YouGov poll on Britain's reading habits (March 2020):

- one in five Britons (21%) describe themselves as an avid reader
- 43% of Britons say they read for pleasure at least once a week
- with a third (35%) doing so multiple times and
- 19% of UK adults reading every day

Yet for those members of society who are unable to read print, this simple pleasure would be denied to them without the availability of audiobooks.

Only a staggering 7% of print books are converted to audio, the format needed for print disabled people which, particularly for the younger generation, can have serious implications for their ability to learn and develop. It can be devasting for the elderly, socially isolated, or disadvantaged, to come to terms with their loss of sight as this is often accompanied by a decline in their health and mobility.

The proven benefits of reading (Source: The Reading Agency)

- Reading for pleasure is more important for children's cognitive development than their parents' level of education and is a more powerful factor in life achievement than socioeconomic background
- 16 year olds who choose to read books for pleasure outside of school are more likely to secure managerial or professional jobs later in life
- 19% of readers say that reading stops them from feeling lonely
- Children with reading difficulties are at greater risk of developing mental health problems later in life, including depression, anxiety, behavioural problems, anger and aggression
- Each week about 1 in 6 adults in the UK are affected by a common mental health disorder.
 Studies have shown that those who read for pleasure have higher levels of self-esteem and a greater ability to cope with difficult situations



Welcome to our new Patron

In 2021 we were excited to annouce the wonderful Dame Judi Dench as a new Patron of Calibre.

The Academy Award winning actress's career has spanned over half a century with roles such as Queen Elizabeth I in Shakespeare in Love and M in the Bond films, leading her to become one of Britain's best-loved actresses.

In 2012 Dame Judi was diagnosed with agerelated macular degeneration (AMD), a common condition that effects the middle part of your vision in later life. Age-related macular degenaration is the biggest cause of sight loss in the UK, affecting more than 600,000 people. Dame Judi has previously shared how her vision loss has impacted her life; she has had to find other ways for learning lines and can no longer read books. She is hoping that by supporting Calibre she will be able to bring the world of reading to as many people as possible who can not access printed books.

How we help

We continually add new titles to our collection, ensuring we provide a wide range of books that include bestsellers and new releases as well as classics and more unusual requests from our members. Our editorial team keep a close eye on the literary world, ensuring we keep as up-to-date as possible with events like **World Book Day** and the **Yoto Carnegie Greenaway Children's book awards**. We pride ourselves on our truly unique collection of over **13,000 unabridged audiobooks**, ranging over **70 categories**, with both fiction and non-fiction titles to suit all interests and ages.



Our dedicated customer service team provide a personalised and much-valued service to all our members, recommending books and responding to member requests. On hand throughout the working week, our team are contactable by telephone, email or our online chat function, offering support when and how it's needed.




We facilitate an inclusive community-outreach reading programme, collaborating with local authorities, libraries, schools and community groups nationwide, improving support and learning, and reducing social isolation and loneliness.

It's all about books...

To ensure our collection of titles continues to grow so our members have the best possible choice of reading materials, we are forging some great relationships with our colleagues in the world of publishing. During 2021 we increased our number of publisher partners and strengthened those links by joining the Independent Publishers Guild and by becoming a member of the Accessible Books Consortium.

We are also delighted to have secured an agreement with Penguin Random House to obtain their audio titles for free. This deal is ground-breaking for Calibre Audio and its members, with far reaching benefits. It will expand our audio offer and crucially will allow us to increase the diversity of our books, which in turn will help attract new members of all ages and backgrounds.


Going forward we hope this agreement will encourage other publishers to follow the example set by Penguin Random House and donate their titles freely for the use of our members who may have no other way of accessing them.





Leading the way with technology

Our digital offering to members is going from strength to strength with our own streaming site which also acts as a catalogue to our collection. Our collaboration with other organisations also gives our members more choice in when and how they listen.

Calibre Downloads on Dolphin EasyReader

In a collaborative partnership with Dolphin, most of our audiobooks are now available on their EasyReader app, giving even greater freedom for our members to download our titles and listen offline. Specifically designed for readers with dyslexia, low vision and blindness, the app is easy to navigate with accessibility features built in.

Our collection is also available through the Library App, Libby, and RealSAM technology on their pocket phones, and Google Nest and Alexa smart speakers.










Who we help

Our 16,600 members, aged from five to 105, have a wide range of conditions including:


- a learning disability, such as dyslexia;

- a vision impairment;
- those suffering with long covid;
- a physical dexterity problem such as multiple sclerosis, Motor Neurone Disease (MND), Parkinson's disease, arthritis, paralysis, terminal illness or early dementia.




Our Volunteers

Fundraising

Calibre Audio receives no direct government funding and relies on donations from our supporters and trusts to fund our free audiobook service.

Fundraising highlights

In 2021 we ran two very successful appeals.

Our annual appeal was very much centred around the pandemic and the need to keep our service running for all those who found themselves isolated and alone. We raised an incredible £110,000.

Towards the end of 2021, we focused on **our Christmas appeal**. We raised a total of £35,400.

Fundraising - trusts and grants







We were once again lucky to receive a grant from The Julia and Hans Rausing Trust. The amount awarded to us was an amazing £80,000 and we are hugely grateful to Julia and Hans Rausing for this money.

The Garfield Weston Foundation very kindly awarded us £30,000.



The CAF Resilience Fund awarded us £31,319; the funding has been jointly provided by the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) Community Match Challenge funding scheme as part of the Government's £750 million coronavirus support package for charities.

The **Draper's Charitable Fund** awarded us **£14,960** to support our visually-impaired members aged 70 and above in Greater London.


Sadly, Gerald died on 18th April 2021, and his granddaughter, Gemma decided that she wanted to raise money for Calibre in memory of her grandad. The challenge: to walk the Cotswold Way in 5 days, a walk that would normally take 7-10 days. Gemma set up her JustGiving page, aiming to raise £300 and the challenge was on. Gemma completed the task with the support of her partner, George, and they raised an amazing £520.

Calibre Audio was the best charity we could have ever hoped to find to help my grandad get back his eyes through his hearing. Having books being read to him through a machine was pure joy. This enabled him to still engage in conversation with friends and family over books, characters and authors they all knew and had read. Secretly I think sometimes one of the best bits for him was that he could put his headphones on, sit in his chair and often not even turn the book on. Just so he could get some peace from my nan, as she wouldn't nag him when she thought he was listening to one of his books!




