
What We Do

Leadership Development: We offer scholarships and programmatic experiences that help students develop the personal and professional skills necessary for careers in food, agriculture, and natural resources.


Career Preparation: Through hands-on experiences and strategic industry partnerships, we equip students with practical knowledge and give them a head start on their career trajectories.



The AFA Sustainability Institute equips students with the knowledge and leadership skills needed to drive meaningful change in conservation and natural resource management. In collaboration with the National Association of Conservation Districts, this immersive experience exposes delegates to the critical intersection of sustainability, policy, and production agriculture.

Through on-site learning and industry engagement students explore diverse career paths while grappling with the real-world challenges shaping the future of land, water and resource stewardship. The Institute prepares leaders to not only participate in sustainability conversations, but to lead them with purpose and clarity.

Leaders Conference

At AFA Leaders Conference, students don't just attend, they level up. This four-day experience equips college students with the skills, confidence and connections to lead in a rapidly evolving agriculture and food industry. Organized into four distinct Tracks aligned with academic year, the Conference meets students where they are and challenges them to grow. Delegates develop six essential leadership competencies: relationship development, collaboration, career management, cultural EQ, interpersonal IQ and systems thinking. Through interactive sessions, real-world scenarios and guided reflection, students leave with a clearer sense of purpose—and the tools to pursue it.

A Measured Investment

Leadership isn't just a title, it's a measurable skill set. AFA Leaders Conference participants can earn a digital badge that recognizes their growth in AFA's six core leader competencies and their commitment to lifelong learning. Each badge — Motivated Learner, Skilled Learner, Committed Learner or Accomplished Learner — represents not only the delegate's year in school, but their developmental progression. Backed by pre- and post-Conference assessments, this credential signals to employers and industry partners that these students are serious about their growth, intentional about their leadership and ready to contribute.

Skills and Connections Meet

Beyond professional development workshops, students explore topics often overlooked in traditional curriculum like finance management, body language, and how to navigate career pivots. Just as important, they network with hundreds of students and industry professionals from across the country, expanding their perspective and sharpening their communication skills. Whether it's a hallway conversation with a recruiter or a roundtable dialogue with a C-suite leader, delegates leave with contacts and confidence.

Lasting Impact

The AFA experience builds more than skills, it builds community. Through the Alliance Alumni Network, graduates are empowered to create lifelong relationships, give back to the next generation and continue their leadership journey. At the heart of this effort is the National AFA Alliance Advisory Council, a ten-member volunteer body that champions alumni engagement year-round. From fostering connections to supporting AFA's mission, the council plays a key role in keeping alumni involved, inspired and aligned with AFA's commitment to developing the next generation of agricultural leaders.

Leadership Across Borders

Through Destination Alliance, AFA alumni take their leadership journey global by immersing themselves in agriculture through an international lens. This exclusive opportunity allows alumni to explore how tradition and innovation collide across borders, while gaining new perspective on the global food system. In 2024, the experience took participants to Spain and Portugal, offering firsthand exposure to Mediterranean production systems, export strategy and agritourism.

In 2027, the journey continues in Vietnam and Thailand, where alumni will examine emerging markets, rice and aquaculture systems, and the cultural forces shaping agriculture in Southeast Asia. Her leadership continues to shape the future of agriculture by ensuring more voices are heard, more connections are made and more young professionals are equipped to lead boldly.


