

# LONDON DESIGN FESTIVAL EXTENDS ITS PUBLIC PROGRAMMING WITH OPEN MONUMENTS BY MELEK ZEYNEP BULUT

1 - 14 DECEMBER 2025 londondesignfestival.com #LDF25 **19 November 2025 - London, UK:** Following the success of the London Design Festival's 23rd edition, which drew thousands of visitors to experience innovative design in the public realm, the Festival is excited to extend its public programming.

Building on the impact of Landmark Projects *What Nelson Sees* by Paul Cocksedge in collaboration with Google Arts & Culture at Trafalgar Square, and *Beacon* by Lee Broom supported and produced by BROKIS and Materials Assemble at the Southbank Centre, which will continue to illuminate the South Bank until January 2026, LDF will present Open Monuments by Melek Zeynep Bulut at the Design Museum from 1 - 14 December 2025.

This extension of LDF's public programming reinforces the Festival's commitment to bringing world-class design directly into London's cultural landscape, creating lasting dialogue between contemporary design and Londoners. *Open Monuments* at the Design Museum's entrance courtyard will demonstrate design's power to transform public spaces and foster meaningful community engagement.

# OPEN MONUMENTS BY MELEK ZEYNEP BULUT AT THE DESIGN MUSEUM 1 – 14 December 2025

Open Monuments by Melek Zeynep Bulut is an installation comprising monolithic urban objects that will transform the entrance courtyard of the Design Museum — London's leading museum devoted to contemporary design — into a site of ongoing performance and experimental experience that reimagines public space.

These sculptural yet functional structures occupy a blurred boundary between installation and product. Thet are not simply objects to be seen, but rhythms to be felt. *Open Monuments* is a meeting point to connect with others, a place for mindful reflection and rest, as well as an invitation to interact with the work itself, which never truly begins or ends but instead unfolds and evolves through the participation of those who encounter it.

Formed from the most elemental shapes, the point, the line, the circle, and the square, the pieces are conceived as "performers" in the city. Their arrangement and role can be shaped and reshaped continuously as much by the context of their surroundings as by the mood of their users. These components initiate open-ended staging, responding simultaneously to the needs of the user and the character of the city.

The works encompass the functions of urban furniture, providing space for sitting, resting, gathering, or simply passing through. At the same time, they create an abstract spatial construct that integrates rather than imposes on its environment, offering an inviting setting for encounter and memory. Subtle lighting lends the objects a second life after dark, their soft glow extending the invitation into the evening and deepening the sense of rhythm and interaction.

Melek Zeynep Bulut, said: "Its ever-changing form and function makes Open Monuments a site of unexpected interactions, meaningful confluence and human memory – embodying my ideal of the open city. My intention is to propose that the public realm should be a space

that is living and mutable: a setting that gains its meaning not from a fixed design, but from the shared experiences, encounters, and stories it hosts over time."

## **ABOUT MELEK ZEYNEP BULUT**

Melek Zeynep Bulut is a London-based Turkish multidisciplinary artist and designer. Melek's work synthesises space, experimental architecture, behavioural sciences, and visual arts. She focuses on the complex interplay between material, experimental circulation fiction, and human consciousness, exploring and exhibiting how existence and subjectivity are shaped by space. Her practice employs a multilingual production technique, encompassing sculpture, installation, photography, performance, painting, and video art.

The dynamic relationship between design and art, both distinct and ambiguous, has formed the central line of her work from the very beginning. In Melek's creations, the connections we establish with time, body, consciousness, society, and the abstract aspects of everyday life transform into objects and materials, which are continually reshaped as spaces and visual connections. This process represents both a new and ancient language of communication.

Three recent critically acclaimed installations have cemented Melek's presence on the

international stage: *The Recursion Project: Levh-i Mahfuz*, a solo exhibit at the London Design Biennale 2025; *Duo*, showcased at the 2024 London Design Festival; and *Açık Yapıt: Open Work*, the official Pavilion of Turkey at London Design Biennale 2023, which was awarded the Public Award.

Melek's exhibitions have been highly praised by industry peers and the public alike, winning numerous awards including, London Design Biennale: Public Award, Red Dot: Design Concept, Createurs Design Awards: Excellence in Art and Design Curation and D'Arc: Best LightArt Scheme – Bespoke.

Melek's work continues to evolve at the intersection of disciplines, creating spaces that function as portals between the physical and the metaphysical, inviting reflection on the rituals and patterns that shape human experience.
