

# LONDON DESIGN FESTIVAL ANNOUNCES CITYWIDE PROGRAMME CELEBRATING LOCAL AND INTERNATIONAL DESIGN TALENT

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**18 August 2022 - London, UK:** London Design Festival today announces the Partner programme of activity for its 20th edition in September. Against the backdrop of the Coronavirus pandemic, cost of living crisis, and a looming recession, the Festival's role in providing a platform for the creative industries has never been more important.

Design is now understood to be fundamental to enterprise, supporting health and wellbeing, and managing our cities and societies. As climate change, pollution and resource depletion intensifies, there is also a need to drive towards a circular and more sustainable economy. With that in mind, this year's Festival will showcase new thinking and creative ideas that demonstrate the crucial role of design today.

Over nine days, Design Districts, Design Fairs and Partners will host over 300 different events, exhibitions and installations, playing a key role in the Festival by curating an ambitious programme of projects across the city. With a majority of activity free to access, Londoners and visitors will have an opportunity to experience, discover, and be inspired by world class design.

There will be 12 Design Districts as part of this year's Festival each with its own unique personality that reflects the local community and enables visitors to explore events a short walking distance from each other.

This year's Districts are: Brompton Design District, Clerkenwell Design Trail, Islington Design District, King's Cross Design District, Mayfair Design District, Shoreditch Design Triangle, Southwark South Design District, William Morris Design Line, returning after a successful debut last year Greenwich Peninsula and Park Royal Design District, and relaunched for 2022, Bankside Design District and Pimlico Road Design District.

As part of the Festival programme, London Design Festival stages major trade shows, known as Design Fairs (formerly Design Destinations). These are the commercial pillars of the Festival and are key meeting places for designers, manufacturers, buyers, specifiers, the media and design enthusiasts to discover new product releases and identify current trends.

Ben Evans CBE, London Design Festival Director, said: "Each year, the Festival provides a platform for design businesses across the UK and internationally to reach a global audience. From new product launches and immersive experiences to engaging talks and hands-on workshops, the events provide an opportunity for everyone to experience the best in design. This year, we are thrilled to host twelve Districts each with a unique creative personality, as well as two Fairs offering a look at the latest trends in the industry, and a myriad of other activities for the creatively curious to enjoy."

**DESIGN DISTRICTS** 

**BANKSIDE DESIGN DISTRICT** 

With a rich industrial heritage and home to world-famous destination brands such as Tate Modern, Shakespeare's Globe and Borough Market, Bankside is one of the most visited districts in London and an area of landmark commercial and residential developments.

Running East to West along the Thames from Borough Market to Oxo Tower Wharf, Bankside will celebrate the area's thriving creative and design industries. The programme will showcase the very best in design, craft and innovation from sustainable public realm activations, light installations and craft exhibitions.

Better Bankside will present two public installations. To mark the 50th anniversary of London Pride, The Fandangoe Kid Studios will produce a hand-painted artwork on the Hope Exchange triangle, creating a new public space that celebrates the LGBTQ+ community. Celebrating 25 years of the iconic Shakespeare's Globe, an immersive Shakespeare Art Trail with 25 Shakespeare quotes appearing throughout the area, with works of photography and illustration, textile and graphic design, sound and light based projections alongside street art and installations.

Oxo Tower Wharf, home to over 25 designer-makers will host open studios across two floors of the iconic building. From millinery to ceramics, weaving to leather-working and much more is waiting to be discovered. Elsewhere at Oxo, brand new design fair, Material Matters will be taking over Bargehouse and gallery@oxo. The event is an extension of the critically acclaimed 'Material Matters' podcast and will celebrate the importance of materials and their ability to shape our lives. Xena Kalouti will celebrate materials, heritage and traditional craftsmanship through a series of made-to-order design objects as part of the fair.

The Liminal Space in partnership with Wellcome Trust will present NIGHT CLUB an engagement programme that brings together shift workers, employers, sleep scientists and policy makers to help mitigate the negative impact of working night shifts. At Borough Yard, Cluster London and Patrick Nash will present an immersive installation of neon figures which respond directly to the movement of the viewer as they traverse through and engage with the space.

From the Sky presents a new collection of sculptural lighting, designed to create calming, consciousness enhancing atmospheres. Yasemin Toygar will launch its debut furniture collection "Plato" featuring an exclusive selection of sculptural pouffes, hand-crafted in an artisanal atelier in Istanbul. The Africa Centre, London's hub for African arts will celebrate the publication of 'Africa in Fashion' by Ken Kweku Nimo, with a book launch, in conversation and screening of 'Fashioning West Africa' by Arieta Mujay-Barg, alongside a workshop examining Batik dying techniques.

# **BROMPTON DESIGN DISTRICT**

Established in 2007 by South Kensington Estates, Brompton Design District is the oldest of London Design Festival's Design Districts and is unique in its close dialogue between established design brands and a temporary programme curated by Jane Withers Studio around an annual theme.

Stretching from the V&A to Brompton Road, Brompton is an international destination for design; a cluster of global design brands sit within an ecosystem of fashion shops, local cafes, established restaurants and one of the world's most important cultural quarters.

This year, the District will host a range of exhibitions, talks and events showcasing the work of emerging designers as well as celebrating the work of leading brands. The District's hub will be at Cromwell Place, hosting four design exhibitions from Brompton's curated programme in addition to the Landmark Project INTO SIGHT, a life-sized media platform installation, where Sony Design plays on sensorial effects that transform simple boundary surfaces into an infinite vista through shifting light, colour and sound.

The theme for Brompton Design District is 'Make Yourself At Home'. Recent events have heightened our awareness of home, its importance and fragility in turbulent times. Curated by Jane Withers Studio, Brompton invites designers to reflect on the places we call home and the role of design in transforming these spaces.

Martino Gamper and Friends return to create *No Ordinary Home*. Centred around objects to hold a plant, the project will bring together a selection of fourteen designers including Martino Gamper, Gemma Holt, Jochen Holz, Max Lamb and Bethan Wood, and will culminate in a workshop.

SEEDS Gallery will present TWO KETTLES, NO SOFA. Designer James Shaw and writer Lou Stoppard explore themes around moving in together. Tastes and desires collide when two households combine to become one. A presentation of Shaw's design objects is mixed with design classics to create a fictive environment which tells the story of a couple negotiating conflicting tastes as they build a home together. Shaw's display has been shaped by a new short story by Stoppard, which was inspired by Shaw's objects.

**1882** Ltd presents *Disco Gourds*, a new exhibition of ceramic work by Bethan Laura Wood. The collection is focused on sharing. There has been much discussion around loneliness and Bethan's belief is that people and community are intrinsic to making a home.

Studio Sanne Visser presents *Extended*, a new series of eight mirrors which reflect on our sense of comfort and belonging in hairdressers and barbershops and are made using hair rope and recycled mirror glass collected from barber shops and hairdressers in Kensington and Chelsea.

For the exhibition *I Was Lost But Now I Live Here*, students and graduates from the Design Products programme at the Royal College of Art present work reflecting the call to designers to part with old practices, to seek new spaces and be transformed by them. The exhibition features OPPO X RCA, a collaboration project exploring what lies 'Beyond Smart'.

The Design Museum presents three exhibitions. Yinka Ilori: Parables of Happiness which will bring his distinctive aesthetic of playful colour combinations and patterns to the museum with a nod to British postmodernism. WEIRD SENSATION FEELS GOOD: The World of ASMR explores the emerging field of creativity that has grown around the world of ASMR. The Future of Ageing curated by Design Age Institute and the Design Museum explores how designers are reimagining ageing.

Molteni&C|Dada presents its new collection. The brand also interprets the District theme with a multimedia installation conceived by creative director, Vincent Van Duysen. Also responding to the theme will be Kyiv based design studio NOOM, whose exhibit *Ukraine: Design for Real Time* presents the Gropius Low Chair Military Edition by Kateryna Sokolova.

Seven partners from Pentagram's London and New York Studios have joined forces with Astrid Stavro and Huguet to create unique products. Ranging from tiles that gently shimmer in the dark to a coffee table with millions of different combinations. Modular sofa company Cozmo will present a special edition sofa jacket designed by Raw Edges, using Kornit's game-changing digital fashion and textile production technology.

Béton Brut presents *Paper* by David Horan, the designer's inaugural collection informed by decoupage and the Japanese Mingei movement. Horan layers handmade paper over seating, a screen and coffee table in a new applied 'vegan vellum'. The Conran Shop partners with It's Nice That to present *Meet Me in the Metaverse*, an immersive installation taking over the brand's Chelsea location where the digital and physical collide in a playful exploration of design's role in this intriguing new world. European design studio Sé will unveil the second instalment of the disco inspired exhibition. The immersive show will interpret the bold and sophisticated interior styles of 1970s London and combine design, sound, movement and illumination.

Cassina invites audiences to discover the new collaborations, products and editions as well as the debut of Cassina Details, a complete collection of accessories. Poltrona Frau presents the *True Evolution 2022 Collection*, embodying the essence of the company's 110 year anniversary Meridiani showcases the latest collection: the René sofa and the Jasper writing desk. On the occasion of their 50th Anniversary, B&B Italia present Le Bambole by Mario Bellini, in a radically renewed version. Boffi|DePadova presents the *Paul Smith + De Padova* collection. In addition, Boffi announces a new iteration of the Case System 5.0 kitchen by Piero Lissoni.

Poliform presents "Incontri", a special project with photographer Paolo Roversi at its flagship Chelsea store. Liaigre London presents its new furniture collection alongside a selection of work by British artists Erin Lawlor and Oliver Marsden, in collaboration with the Vigo Gallery. 15 artists showcase their latest work in Unfamiliar forms - Where art meets design. Andipa will present *Britain is Best*, an exhibition of five important British artists with paintings, sculptures, tapestries & works on paper.

Slamp's first UK flagship store will open its doors in Knightsbridge, showcasing the brand's most iconic collections. Tai Ping will launch an exclusive new range of crafted rugs under its new prêt-à-porter label, Studio by Tai Ping. Day True will launch the Vision ranges by Rexa, and will invite visitors to learn about the new range of storage and bathroom products. Japan House will celebrate Japanese design with a window display featuring a collection of award-winning products available for purchase.

# **CLERKENWELL DESIGN TRAIL**

From 20-21 September, Clerkenwell Design Trail will take over EC1 as Clerkenwell Design Week and London Design Festival collaborate. The two-day celebration will feature engaging events which are within a short walking distance of each other, enabling visitors to navigate the area with ease.

From high-end furniture to lighting, kitchen and bathroom brands to material manufacturers, Clerkenwell Design Trail enables visitors to explore participating showrooms in and around the area's historic cobbles. Audiences can take their pick from workshops to product launches, installations and showroom tours.

To celebrate the 100th anniversary of Vilhelm Lauritzen Architects, Carl Hansen & Søn will bring his most iconic works to life. They will also preview new releases alongside a programme of activities including a talk with CEO Knud Erik Hansen and Anne Møller Sørensen from Vilhelm Lauritzen Architects. VitrA will host an immersive colour installation using artwork by art and design duo Carnovsky. In addition, they will host drop-in virtual reality sessions featuring a fully immersive virtual bathroom.

Arper will showcase their latest collections including by Doshi Levien, Peter Kunz, Altherr Désile Park, Jean-Marie Massaud and a new edition of Juno 02 by James Irvine. The brand will also launch their new concept *The Project of Living*. To celebrate their 150th anniversary, Fritz Hansen explores the theme of hospitality, replicating Suite 606 - a closed room in the SAS Royal Hotel - preserved since the 1960s. They will also host a discussion with Stylus, delving into how the design of hospitality spaces has evolved.

Knoll presents its new collections together with classics by designers including Florence Knoll, Mies van der Rohe, Eero Saarinen and Harry Bertoia. Viaduct celebrates 10 Years of Muller Van Severen with an exhibition of their furniture and lighting. Modus Furniture launches Edge Free, a foam free seating platform for the modern workspace designed by Pearson Lloyd. Morgan celebrates its 30th anniversary with a Celebration of Design, including a new collection by Tim Rundle and a design-themed quiz. Also on display, is an art installation by Olly Fathers and lighting by Bert Frank.

On 22nd September Bolon will host breakfast with their Head of Sustainability and Co-founder of Greenpeace Sweden, Håkan Nordin, to delve into the topic of the circular economy and all things sustainability. Solus Ceramics hosts a panel talk with Ben Channon, Maria Cheung, and Eleanor Ratcliffe considering the intersection of design and wellbeing.

Ceramiche Caesar Spa will host the international preview of their new porcelain tile collections and host a panel event. Marazzi presents the latest ceramic and stoneware collections. Formica Group reflects on 20 years of interior design with Musa Art & Communications Director Sandro Marini. Workstories will host an open showroom to discover the range of fabrics and finishes available to customise a workspace.

Cosentino will celebrate the launch of their award-winning ultra compact, carbon neutral material Dekton's new collection 'Onirika & Kraftizen'. The brand will also host a sustainability panel. COAT paints will host an open studio, allowing visitors to discover the climate positive paint company. Forbo Flooring invites visitors to learn about the CO2 neutral floor covering, Marmoleum.

Designers Holloway Li will unveil the T4 series, a lightweight composite modular sofa with fitted upholstery designed by the studio and produced by Uma. Industrial Facility will present an exhibition of projects, prototypes, first productions and books for international companies including Santa & Cole, Thonet, Mattiazzi, Ishinomaki, Herman Miller and Takt.

# **GREENWICH PENINSULA**

Home to iconic London landmark The O2, Greenwich Peninsula returns as one of the Festival's newest districts. Design District, London's permanent home for the creative industries, and

Design London, the largest destination for contemporary design during the festival return for their second iteration.

Hosting a week-long programme to celebrate the achievements in its first year, Design District will scale up substantially, and showcase the diversity and dynamism of its rapidly evolving creative community. From 19–25 September 2022, Design District will bring design lovers from across the capital to the heart of Greenwich Peninsula for Design District Creates, a festival of design and making, ingenuity and imagination, that spans every creative discipline.

Bureau Talks, a series of three keynote talks from leading design-industry figures will explore some of the most pressing issues and ideas shaping the sector today. Tom Dixon will talk about failure, sharing the mistakes he's made in his career, how they've helped him and what it means to be able to learn from them. Other speakers will explore how today sustainability is not only a differentiator, but a necessity for every creative business, and a third talk will take a deep dive into digital, looking at how Web 3.0 and the expanding metaverse impact the life and work of real-world designers.

The Design District Experience Trail and Retail Trail will showcase the creative talents operating within this creative hub. Helen Kirkum will show visitors how head-turning trainers can be created from recycled and dead-stock materials. Lighting-design studio Haberdashery will invite guests into its serene world of light. Uncommon Projects lifts the lid on architect-designed kitchens. Skincare and scent specialist Homework reveals how its fragrance experts create natural products inspired by traditional Chinese medicine. Ceramics brand Made by Manos throws open the doors of its experimental studio along with practical workshops. Accessories brand Ryan London provides insights into the intricacies of leather craft. The Photography Foundation will offer the chance to have headshots taken. Wizard Works' workshop lets visitors in on how its cult bike bags are created. Tattoo studio Aura Ninety Four offers the chance to see its inksters. Lighting studio Luum shares the secrets of creating architectural light sculpture.

In addition, Channel Twelve will present Creative Quests, a time-themed trail around Greenwich Peninsula. Here.We.Go. Studio will bring the sound of nature to the urban jungle in a sensory exhibition. NOW Gallery will showcase an installation by Korean artist JeeYoung Lee and a pop up art installation by designer Bibi Ahmed. University of Brighton graduates from 2022 and 2020-21 will present an exhibition of future-facing design projects exploring materials and methods addressing environmental and social challenges.

### **ISLINGTON DESIGN DISTRICT**

Renowned as one of London's creative enclaves, Islington is home to independent design shops, studios and designers from across the creative industries. Islington Design District will bring together a diverse range of local talent and international brands around the theme of Design Journeys. This might be a literal journey from one country to another, the journey we go on as part of the creative process or the universal experience of journeying through life.

Pith invites visitors to explore the tactility of paper with drawing workshops, product launches and a pop-up shop. In addition, the brand demonstrates reuse possibilities inviting participants to design and create their own, one-of-a-kind Yuzu Notebook.

Craft's Council will present Cotton: Labour, Land and Body, an exhibition exploring the impact of historic and developing relations between Britain and South Asia through the cotton industry in Lancashire. The Kasama Potters project brings together thirty-two Japanese ceramicists, displaying some of the ceramic highlights to be found within their community.

Adventures in Furniture will launch a curated selection of eclectic and abstract photography and paintings. twentytwentyone will launch Edit '22, the fifth iteration of the exhibition series that brings together some of the most compelling furniture, lighting, and designs of the year. To mark their 30th anniversary, Wallace Sewell will showcase a mini-exhibition and reveal a limited-edition Triangle Weave Throw in their brand colours of orange and pink.

Grestec will showcase six sustainable tile ranges, with 40-62% recycled material, inspired by the latest design trends. Little Greene invites visitors to one of their London showrooms to explore the complete colour palette to inspire your next interior decorating project.

Travel Things Museum present 'Translations of everyday objects' which explores how ordinary objects can hold meaning across different cultures, people, and places. Indian design studio The Architecture Story present *Celestial Nest*, an immersive installation that celebrates an ancient mirror making process.

### KING'S CROSS DESIGN DISTRICT

King's Cross is a unique setting with a rich history, and one of the largest regeneration projects in Europe. It has a mix of new and cleverly restored buildings, a first-class arts university and cultural programme as well as 26 acres of open space. At its heart is the Heatherwick Studio-designed Coal Drops Yard; London's newest shopping district housed in a pair of artfully reimagined industrial Victorian buildings. 2022 will mark the fourth year of King's Cross as a Design District. Resident design brands will come together, opening their doors to the public.

Wolf & Badger will bring an exclusive showcase of California-based design brands as well as events with their British partners. Highlights include live illustration with Johanna Fleming and Rosanna Corfe, block printing with Daughters of Gaea, dried flower workshops with Wolf & Badger concession Edie Rose and a talk from Robert Poynton, the author of Do Improvise and Do Pause. In addition, they will showcase Alice Straker's 'The Odyssey of Deliciousness', display of the artist's new work of all things sweet including pavlova, cake and trifle.

Discover the renewable energies of the future – curiosity, creativity and imagination – through graduating work from across art, design and performance at Central Saint Martins. Atelier Vidrio welcomes visitors to discover the work of artist Elisabeth Adriel. Lomography in partnership with The Standard will host a design-themed LomoWalk using the La Sardina 3We 5mm camera.

Tom Dixon presents TWENTY a thoughtfully curated selection of unseen creations, some new; some reformed and some in embryonic experiment-mode. Highlights include: a gigantic MELT Dichroic chandelier, a BIRD chair made of eelgrass from Denmark, a latex S-chair and giant mycelium sculptures.

### **MAYFAIR DESIGN DISTRICT**

Established in 2017, Mayfair Design District exists to celebrate the very best in collectible and contemporary design and cement Mayfair's position as a leading international destination for the decorative arts. Championing art and design led exhibitions, architecture, interiors, installations, collaborations, auctions, festivals, fairs and special projects amongst other activity, the district has been formed around the notion that there is a greater benefit to all by working together to more positively promote the creative and cultural identity of this illustrious enclave.

SCENTMATIC Ltd will present KAORIUM, the world's first AI system that can express each scent and flavour using a wide range of vocabulary, while its unique UX guides people towards finding the scents they desire. Jo Malone London will open the doors of its Marylebone Townhouse, showcasing new work by Martyn Thompson including photographs, textiles and ceramics alongside the second Design Edition collection.

Vintage furniture gallery Béton Brut takes up residency at Paul Smith's London flagship shop. In a special curation by Sophie Pearce, Béton Brut evolves its monochrome palette in response to Paul Smith's signature vibrancy. For the launch of their new interior ranges with inventive twists on traditional craftsmanship, Laz Emporium will host a Q&A with founder Steve Lazarides in conversation with Justyna Medon. The lifestyle brand will also host an open house with drinks.

New online design platform Curio will explore modern making and cultural vernaculars. The show will feature works by a selection of designers, artists and makers reinventing the application of heritage craft skills. 'Shoonya' by Madhuria will bring together designers, writers, performers and climate experts in a unique multi-disciplinary exhibition, featuring dance, sustainable interiors, fashion, engaging fireside chats and a book reading by a leading climate action voice.

Inhabit Hotels will co-host a series of events with design and social enterprise partners on the theme of 'circular design'. Activities will range from wood marbling, leather and mobile making workshops alongside a panel talk with industry experts on the importance of sustainable craftsmanship. Bethan Gray, Moritz Waldemeyer and Tannaz Oroumchi reimagine sketch through their own eyes, each creating a specially commissioned site-specific installation for a distinct area of the iconic London destination.

Achille Salvagni Atelier will present *The Wonder Room*, featuring a selection of objects from Achille and Toyine's personal collections. The installation will uncover the myriad stories that make up the inspiration behind their designs. *Haptic Nature* at Gallery FUMI presents work by Andreas Voukenas and Steven Petrides as they continue to explore new sculptural furniture in polished bronze, plaster and textured cast aluminium. The New Craftsmen will unveil *Claylarks*, a new collection of unique pieces by a group of makers from a variety of practices.

Sadie Coles HQ presents *Interior Eulogies*, an exhibition curated by Simon Andrews on the enigmatic architect, interior and furniture designer, sculptor and artist Max Clendinning. *'Gestures, London 2022'* at Sotheby's will unveil Joseph Walsh's Gestures series, a new body of work which is functional and yet boldly sculptural. Each work is completely unique, designed to sit together in harmony as an exhibition and to stand alone as both a sculptural and functional work.

The Reborn project by Ginori 1735 in collaboration with David Gill Gallery will offer a second life to porcelains. A selection of artist have designed a service of 54 pieces from the abstract to the figurative. To celebrate its Duke Street launch, Mint curates *The Futurists*, an exploration into the

role of interiors in the circular economy. Emerging and established designers have been selected for their pursuit of considerate design.

PATERSON ZEVI will debut a new body of work by Yali Glass, designed by Marie-Rose Kahane in Murano. PORCELANOSA and Jestico + Whiles will present *Light, battle between space and time*, highlighting the importance of light and lighting in design and architecture. EDGE will welcome all to visit, explore and learn about sustainable design and build alongside celebrating its first birthday with a debate on sustainability curated by futurebuild.

## PARK ROYAL DESIGN DISTRICT

Now in its second year, Park Royal Design District is an exciting new hub to discover innovative designers, artists and makers. Visitors to the area will uncover an inclusive, collaborative community of new and established creatives, thriving within buildings repurposed from the area's rich history in the automotive and culinary industries.

An incubator for fresh design talent, the district will offer an engaging programme of exhibitions, open studios, demonstrations, workshops and product launches from a diverse range of disciplines. Designers and makers' specialisms include leathercraft, millinery, art, furniture design, glasswork, sustainable fashion and product design.

A number of Park Royal's studios will open their doors, inviting the public to discover the work of the innovative artists, designers and makers working in the area. These include: Queensrollahouse, a 12,000 sq ft former Rolls Royce warehouse; Orsini Studios, a converted mid-century warehouse turned creative studio designed by architects OrsiniBrewin; Standard Studios which is home to NoOk - Park Royal's first micro gallery, micro bar, micro social club, micro shop and micro studio space; Multidisciplinary community, Gorst Studios who will also host a still life workshop with resident artists Victoria Noakes and Naima Elbouihi; and Excelsior Studios which will open its doors for a weekend of workshops, exhibitions and events. In addition, Excelsior Project Space, a new hub for creative projects and sustainable innovation will showcase a number of artists and makers working with recycled and found materials, as well as hosting talks, panel discussions and events.

Bill Amberg Studio will launch a new collection of sustainable wood and leather furniture for a new café at Knepp Estates, renowned for its ground-breaking rewilding project. Amberg has created the range using raw materials sourced from the estate including ash wood, cattle and deer hide.

Blast Studio will host an open studio and pop up shop showcasing their 3D printed furniture and artefacts made from London's waste materials and living organisms. Swedish artist and maker Tom Hertz will host an open studio to discover his playful material approach and impactful furniture and sculptural objects. # SHOREDITCH DESIGN TRIANGLE

Shoreditch Design Triangle is a cultural event that celebrates the creative industry in East London. Established in 2008 as a vehicle for the designers, companies and institutions situated in the East End to collaborate on the promotion of their activities during the London Design Festival.

It is a true celebration of the East End, hosted by the creative companies who work here. Blending together product launches, exhibitions, installations, workshops, talks, tours and culinary

delights – the event gives visitors the opportunity to spend the day wandering around the East End on foot and still not see everything there is to see.

Grady + Robinson, the first producer of leather from cattle raised on regenerative farms in the UK, will present *Leather from British Pastures*, highlighting leather's connection to agriculture. They will also host a talk exploring perspectives from farming, design, and leather production. Pearl by Central Saint Martins' BA Jewellery Design will bring together work that spans different fields and subject matter, yet shares a mutual fascination with the pearl.

Combining unexpected spatial design, functional pieces, sculptural elements and their signature textural finish, Jan Hendzel Studio has reimagined the design of two suites for the Grade II listed Town Hall Hotel in Bethnal Green. Lee Broom will showcase *Divine Inspiration*, his new collection of ethereal lighting which will be presented alongside existing designs in the lifestyle environment of the Lee Broom showroom.

Calyah will present its first pop-up studio in London with new editions from designers Margrethe Odgaard, Boris Berlin, and Satyendra Pakhalé. Founder Nigel Majakari and Boris Berlin will discuss the relationship of contemporary design and traditional craftsmanship in light of major climate and cultural challenges facing humanity.

Bethan Laura Wood collaborates with Christopher Farr to show the prototype CF Editions rug 'Jelly Salad', which continues Bethan's exploration of food presentation and representation. FLOOR\_STORY will reveal a new multi purpose home as well as a new collection in collaboration with Kangan Arora. Hart Shoreditch has partnered with Atelier Roc to showcase their first limited-batch throw collection

Pearson Lloyd celebrates 25 years of design through 'Change Making'. Exhibits will encourage visitors to think about how and what we're designing now, and challenge them to imagine how things might change in future. The Future Collective will co-host a series of engaging talks, panel discussions and creative workshops exploring the themes of circularity, social cause and becoming a B Corp. AKT II will present Crinkle-Crankle Concrete, an installation showcasing a cutting-edge cement-replacement technology, Seratech developed by researchers at Imperial College London.

Fred Rigby Studio will launch their debut Homeware Collection 'Towers and Totems' at their recently launched showroom. Art Practice will present two exhibitions *Paintings with Legs* showcasing work by Daniel Eatock and *COPSE*, a collection of ceramics by Patricia Qua. Studio Sahil presents *Coastal Myths* an exhibition of objects, predominantly in glass, that explore narratives around belonging, place and cultural heritage. Solid Floor will invite Rupert Bevan to demonstrate the colourful art of marbling. Surface Matter will provide a look at their recently revamped studio and materials library.

From the new and emerging, to more established creatives in the district, Southwark South brings together an explosion of talent throughout London Design Festival.

Southwark South's headline event will be 'Permanent Temporary', a two day celebration of local design, art and culture. By showcasing the work of local residents and creators, the District will reinforce the point that their voices need to be heard and considered, while celebrating the diversity of talent that comes out of the area and highlighting the fact that young people and local residents could have the power to shape Old Kent Road. Design London, the largest official destination for contemporary design at London Design Festival, returns to North Greenwich with its second edition between 21 – 24 September 2022.
