# Stitching Life Back Together

*How Yerlin's life was forever changed by the sewing ministry of her local church.*

In a small town in the Chinampas area of Costa Rica, many families struggle to make ends meet. Basic necessities, such as access to clean drinking water and affordable, nutritious food, are difficult to acquire in the mountains. As in countless communities across the globe, life is hard and opportunities are scarce.

Yerlin, a mother of three, had firsthand experience with struggles common in her community. Along with the responsibility of providing for her children, she carried the weight of loneliness, anger, and resentment from her past. She did not attend church and was disconnected from supportive community.

In 2022, things began to change for Yerlin. She heard about a sewing school that Pastor Emanuel and his wife, Maricel, were starting in the community. Intrigued, Yerlin started attending and found herself drawn into belonging, each stitch she learned strengthening the fabric of community around her. These new friendships opened up new possibilities, including a desire to connect with the church community. When she was invited to an event, Yerlin took a chance: *"I went to church with my husband and children and we liked the way they received us,"* she said. *"The event was on Saturday, and then on Sunday we went to the church service for the first time. Everyone was so kind to us. And since then, around April*

*2023, we started going to church, and we never stopped. We went through the rain, through the sun. Not just on the days of the services either."*

Yerlin has seen God move in significant ways. She experienced a miraculous pregnancy with their third child. Yerlin shared, *"God is faithful, and God is good, because medically they told me 'you can't,' but I said 'yes, you can.' And when they told me it was very likely I would lose the baby, I knew that God said, 'I gave it to you.' And today, that little girl is a miracle in our lives, because of Him."*

Choosing to follow Jesus has transformed Yerlin's life inside and out. *"When I came to Christ, it was through the love of God. I felt God loved me, so I felt that I had to love others, and that's how it was,"* she said. *"It was beautiful because, after I forgave everything that had been done to me, the people who hurt me, it was something beautiful. I felt I had an empty heart, but after that, I felt love for the people, even those who had harmed me. Honestly, I don't even have words to tell you what I feel now: I feel good, I feel happy because God fills my heart."*

The church in Chinampas has become a vital part of Yerlin's life. She and her husband were married in the church and have received care and counseling from the pastors. Yerlin shared, *"I had things in my heart, in my mind, that I couldn't handle. I couldn't find a way out. I cried and I cried.*

*And even now, sometimes I cry, but if God hadn't taken me out of where I was, it would have all been impossible. I couldn't have done it alone."*

She continued, *"I think that, like me, many people are grateful, first to God and then to the pastors, because if it hadn't been for them, this church would have stayed locked and wouldn't have existed and I don't even know where everyone would be, because that was the only evangelical church in our small town. You see and hear that they [Pastor Emanuel and Maricel] are very active in the community and are part of the community board, and they like to help their neighbor. They care about the congregation and the neighborhood. They make sure that everything is well, that everything is working perfectly, and they organize activities. It has been a great blessing in our community."*

Before the church in Chinampas had an impact on Yerlin and others in the community, it was on the verge of closing. The lack of resources in the region made it difficult to sustain a pastoral presence until Pastor Emanuel and Maricel were able to minister in the small town through a PPM sponsorship. Read on to see how God wove together the threads of a Costa Rican mother, a former bar owner, and individuals from halfway around the world through PPM.

# Impact Highlight

## Meet Pastor Emanuel

*A clear call to ministry and to equipping his community alongside his wife, Maricel.*

Long before Yerlin joined the sewing school and her family joined the church, Pastor Emanuel had been ministering near Samara in Guanacaste along with his wife Maricel and their son. Growing up on a farm with his grandparents, they encouraged

him to attend church, but he never felt a genuine desire or calling to do so. He moved away, married Maricel, and they earned a living by running the bar they owned together. After spending some time separated, God healed their marriage and called them into ministry, so they closed the bar and turned it into their church building.

*"We closed everything at the bar; all that was left behind," Pastor Emanuel said. "It's incredible because many of the people who used to come to the bar and drink and do drugs, today they are in the church and are part of the church. Jesus can change things. God can make things new, and we must keep going hand in hand with Jesus."*

While growing and pastoring their first church, Pastor Emanuel was invited to lead a dying church in Chinampas. They discovered early on that, in addition to spiritual encouragement and community, there was a significant need for tangible help. Pastor Emanuel and the church began sharing small bags of rice and other essentials with those in need, but quickly realized they could not meet families' long-term needs.

*"We saw that it wasn't enough because even if a bag could last a week, then families were left wondering, 'What do I do now?'" Pastor Emanuel shared. "So God moved us and showed me a part of the Bible that says that we have to teach people to fish, which was something that Jesus did with his disciples. On one occasion, Jesus is with his disciples. His disciples tell him, 'We haven't caught anything.' So he tells them, 'Cast that net on that side.' We know Jesus could go and catch the fish, but He wanted His disciples to do it. So that's where I started asking God for a tool, a strategy, something many families can use to bring sustenance to their families."*

It was through this vision—of teaching people to fish, of providing tools rather than temporary relief—that women like Yerlin would find not just a skill, but a doorway into community, healing, and faith.

Maricel's mother taught her to sew as a young girl, and they saw potential in teaching women a practical skill that could be used to earn money and care for their families. The sewing school became more than a place to learn a trade; it became where lives were rewoven, where women like

Yerlin would discover both skill and community, stitching together new possibilities. The program started small, but has now served dozens of women in two locations near the two churches. Graduates don't just leave the school with new knowledge — they are ministered to and cared for, invited into community, and are able to contribute to the local economy in ways they may not have been otherwise capable.

The road to this successful ministry was not an easy one. A lack of resources for ministry and no pastoral pay make it challenging to invest fully in projects and opportunities that have the potential to make a significant impact in the local

and regional communities. Pastors are often underresourced, despite many turning to them with requests and needs. Pastor Emanuel explained, *"The church truly loves the pastor, but also the pastor as a person, as a husband, as a father, as a human being, also needs time."*

Partnering with PPM for over ten years and being fully supported in the church sponsorship program has provided Pastor Emanuel and his family with respite, support, and care. The first PPM teams they hosted were an answer to visions and prayers that he'd had for years. Throughout this long-standing relationship, Pastor Emanuel, his churches, and PPM

teams have accomplished many things together, including, but not limited to, food distribution, church construction, and the construction of a sewing school. After major flooding in their area, PPM also showed up for their community and mobilized local Costa Rican volunteers to help their community recover.

Pastor Emanuel appreciates the model PPM utilizes with their community and beyond: *"We are very grateful to PPM for the impact, for the response you all have had for us, for our church, our ministry, our community. Thanks to this organization, we have been able to carry out projects where God has put us on a mission to do something. We present the project and our vision, and our friends at PPM act in a very positive way to make those projects and that vision a reality. And thank God, we have been walking together for many years, serving hand in hand and having a long-term relationship, which is one of the pillars of growth."*

While they have been serving in other communities around Costa Rica for years, members from his church have recently gone on international trips with PPM to Guatemala and Panama as well. Pastor Emanuel explained, "For many years, groups have come to our church, they have given to us, they have blessed us, we have laid our hands on them, and they have given to us. Now it is our turn to give back and to go and do what Jesus is calling us to do."

Our staff is at the heart of all we do to build up, encourage, and assist the local Church around the world. Putting hands and feet to this mission on a daily basis, PPM's full-time local staff are an integral part of ensuring that partner churches, teams, and donors are connected and engaged in this incredible calling. 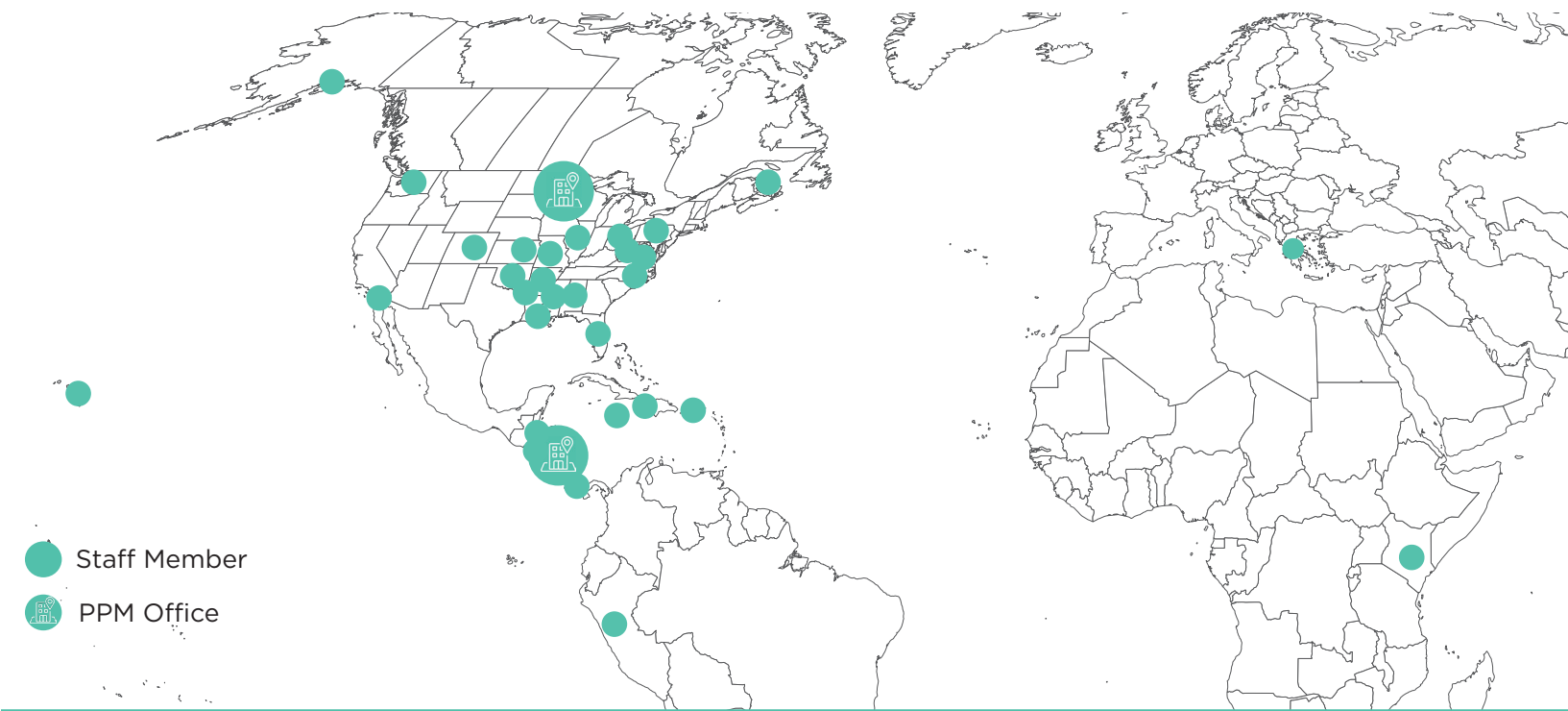

# OUR WORK

## Mission Trips

For the past 20 years, Praying Pelican Missions has been a leader in the short-term missions world. From our roots, partnering alongside a long-time friend and pastor in Belize, to now leading teams in over 40 locations throughout the US and around the world, we have seen time and time again that God does incredible things when his people join together in service to one another.

Our mission trips embody the hands and feet of Jesus, bringing volunteers from around the world to support the local Church. From renovating church buildings to staffing Vacation Bible Schools and partnering with local non-profits, PPM provides the extra hands to support these ministries as they fulfill their calling.

At the heart of every mission trip is the unwavering commitment to go into communities not with our own agenda, but instead putting fuel on the fire already burning. From Kenya to Alaska and everywhere in between, we see lives changed in host communities and sending teams nearly every week of the year, and we cannot wait to see what God has in store for the future!

### A FRESH START...WITH A FRESH COAT OF PAINT?

A few years ago, Pastor Jeremy felt a call to begin pastoring a church in Eagle River, Alaska, that had been through a significant split. As he spoke with his neighbors and began working in the community, trying to revitalize and refresh the ministry, he found that the church had a reputation. Consistently, he heard people refer to his new church as “the big red church that hurts people.” He and his church leaders realized that they had a big job ahead of them, to not only heal the wounds inside the congregation, but to reconcile the church with its community.

After several years of working diligently to love people well and truly seeing God revive and restore life and trust both inside and outside the church walls, much of that hurt and reputation had been healed. So when a PPM team came to partner with Pastor Jeremy this past summer, he knew it was time.

Now, there’s a bit of a stereotype about mission teams coming and spending their entire week painting things. But what better way to turn the page and initiate this new chapter in the life of the church than to give the church building itself a fresh start? As the team began to paint “the big red

church” into a cool shade of bluish gray, it was so much more than a coat of paint. Pastor Jeremy was so excited that he stopped by multiple times each day the team worked just to see the progress. The internal work had been done, and now the outside matched the renewal they had experienced on the inside.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Though a large percentage of our mission trip participants come from the United States, there are a significant number of PPM trip participants who are from other parts of the world, members of our partner churches who are mobilized to serve within their own nations or internationally to other countries!

When disaster strikes, the local Church is already on the front lines, acting as the hands and feet of Jesus and organizing grassroots efforts to meet the most pressing needs of their communities. PPM Disaster Relief aims to intentionally partner with these resilient local leaders, providing the essential resources and practical support needed to advance the vital work they are already doing in their darkest hour.

PPM is deeply committed to coming alongside existing and new partners for both immediate and long-term response, striving to maintain roots in communities for years after a disaster to ensure our partners are supported through the entire journey from relief to sustainable recovery. Over the years of intentionally responding in disaster areas, we see that volunteer groups and mission teams are an integral piece of long-term recovery

efforts. Long after most of the critical response organizations have left, PPM teams dive into a multitude of tasks, including debris cleanup, rebuilding damaged structures, replacing roofs, and assisting with food and supply distribution. And, just as importantly, PPM comes in with a heart for holistic ministry, prioritizing relational ministry to those recovering from a disaster event.



## HURRICANE MELISSA

Building on our commitment to long-term recovery, the response to Hurricane Melissa in Jamaica exemplifies the power of deep-rooted partnership in the face of crisis. Since 2008, PPM has cultivated a network of over 100 local churches and a strong local staff presence across the island, stretching from Montego Bay to Kingston. This established foundation allowed for immediate mobilization when the record-breaking storm made landfall in October 2025.

In the immediate aftermath, PPM utilized donated funds to equip and support local staff, who navigated significant losses to serve as the first sign of hope in their communities. By equipping

them with resources, our staff worked alongside local churches to prepare and distribute care packages to the community. Donated funds have already been leveraged to continue care package distribution, purchase project materials (roofing, concrete, etc.), answer specific needs of PPM partners, and ensure better communication signal where internet connection was destroyed or significantly damaged after the storm. In early December, mission teams began arriving to serve. Working side-by-side with Jamaican partners, teams have focused on:

### Infrastructure Restoration:

Repairing critical damage to schools, churches, and private homes.

### Resource Distribution:

Providing supplies to families who sustained total loss.

**Holistic Ministry:** Helping the local Church provide spiritual support, distributing new Bibles, and offering prayer

*“We know that even though it is devastating, we know that without your prayers, things could have been much worse. But you never ceased to lift up Jamaica before the Lord. And we are grateful. We thank God for life. Most of our partners suffered loss. The churches sustained a lot of damage. But the greatest thing we have is life, and we have great supporters, and we give God thanks for you.”*

# OUR WORK

## Church Sponsorship

The work of the Church is year-round, so our mission doesn't ever stop. PPM Church Sponsorship is a continuous effort to build up, encourage, and assist the local Church 365 days a year. We've seen countless times that the local Church is a key way that God reaches the world, and we

know that a healthy pastor is the spark that ignites a vibrant, Christ-centered community. Our sponsorship program is a tangible investment in these front-line ministry leaders, ensuring they receive the spiritual and physical nourishment needed to sustain their calling.

The PPM church sponsorship program operates on the promise of **C.A.R.E.**, providing our partner churches with:

- Consistent care and connection
- Aid in emergencies
- Relational network and training and
- Empowerment to go on mission

When a church is sponsored in the program, we ensure that these pastors and ministry leaders are never serving alone. We see the dramatic impact of this investment in three critical areas:



### CHURCH

The local Church is the catalyst for reaching our world for Christ. It is God's master plan - to use His people to love and serve our world, sharing the Good News of grace by faith to all people.



### PASTOR

An investment in a pastor is an investment in the Church. When pastors are healthy, both spiritually and physically, they are most able to lead a healthy, vibrant congregation.



### COMMUNITY

Communities benefit when the local Church is thriving. From support and care to meeting physical needs; a healthy church is vital to a community.



### SUSTAINABLE MINISTRY IN MOMBASA

Pastor Simon and his church in the Mombasa area of Kenya are passionate about getting practical help right out into the community. They believe strongly in providing real, concrete support to their neighbors in need: they are getting water to struggling families when supply is scarce, caring for orphans and vulnerable kids with meals and a safe place to stay, and handing out school resources to students who need them. This focus on practical care and action creates a powerful, local impact.

The support Pastor Simon receives through PPM Church Sponsorship has significantly boosted the effectiveness and reach of his ministry. When he's

personally doing well, it shows up in his ministry's capacity. The medical care he's received through the program means that his church community has a healthy pastor who is ready to serve. Additionally, earlier this year, the program supported him in getting out on a mission trip, which reignited in him a fresh excitement for evangelism. On that trip, he led a powerful door-to-door outreach where 150 people decided to follow Christ! And when a major crisis hit, the emergency aid promised through the PPM365 program arrived right on time. It was more than just help; it was a powerful, living testimony of God's faithful care. These experiences, from global trips to crisis relief, not only kept him going, but they refreshed his calling and fully equipped him

to lead his growing church of 70 members with renewed strength and vision.

Ultimately, Pastor Simon's partnership with PPM is a lifeline for the continued health and sustainability of his mission in Mombasa. The program ensures his family has full medical insurance, which gives him immense peace of mind, allowing him to release his health worries and focus completely on his spiritual calling. He sees this support as a direct way to empower his critical mission for the long run. By guaranteeing that he stays personally healthy and spiritually energized, the program ensures he is fully ready to lead the way in meeting the needs of the community for years to come.
