V&A Dundee is being delivered by Design Dundee Limited, a new charity established by a ground-breaking partnership between Dundee City Council, the University of Dundee, Abertay University, Scottish Enterprise and the Victoria and Albert Museum, the world's greatest museum of art and design.

Founding partners

The Victoria and Albert Museum, London (V&A) is the world's leading museum of art, design and performance with collections unrivalled in their scope and diversity, spanning 5000 years of human creativity. It was established in 1852 to make works of art available to all and to inspire British designers and manufacturers. Today, its purpose is to champion creative industry, inspire the next generation, and spark everyone's imagination.

The **University of Dundee** is one of the UK's leading universities, internationally recognised for its expertise across a range of disciplines, including the life sciences and in art and design. It includes the highly regarded Duncan of Jordanstone College of Art and Design and School of Architecture.

Abertay University is a world leader in computer games education, having launched the world's first computer games degree in the 1990s. The university offers courses in a range of areas, including cybersecurity and science disciplines, placing a strong emphasis on widening access and preparation for work.

Scottish Enterprise is Scotland's main economic development agency and aims to deliver a significant, lasting effect on the Scottish economy. Key funders

Since 1994, HLF has supported over 42,000 projects with over £7.7bn across the UK, including over £835m to over 4,000 projects in Scotland.

We enable people and organisations to work in and experience the arts, screen and creative industries in Scotland by helping others to develop great ideas and bring them to life.
