Present Text Vernon Street and Blenheim Walk 1 March - 23 March




'Recording' by Qiongjie Yu

Regretfully – Hopes and Dreams Cannot be Exchanged or Refunded A Visual Discourse on Maternity

"My current art making practice explores the dilemma of what it means to inhabit a female body. I create installations and individual works that contain multiple layers of meaning; the work is subtle and surprising, disturbing and amusing. I alter and adapt ready-made objects that

stand in as signifiers for the maternal body. I cast objects in unusual or unsuitable materials with the intention of suggesting an alternate reading of the original object. My intention is to promote in the viewer a complex response encompassing the cultural, political, social, historical and mythological agendas that inform our current perspective on motherhood and its role in contemporary society."

"Most of these paintings construct places and spaces that we feel we should recognise and have perhaps already seen, if only momentarily. But probably not in this heightened, uncertain and dreamlike state. The ordinary, the quotidian, is hopefully charged and energised enough to take on another form or character."


Comicks Blenheim Walk 6 April - 29 June

Bristow / Lloyd is a collaborative project between community worker, Lisa Bristow and educator, artist and designer, Christian Lloyd.


Northern Soul

During the early 1960s photographer John Bulmer travelled across the north of England recording everyday life in the industrial heartland. What is exceptional about most of this work is the decision to use colour. In a recent interview Bulmer recalls "It didn't occur to anyone to take the north of England in colour – that was considered a black and white subject".

The result was Bulmer's own perspective on life in the North and together these photographs reveal a region on the verge of change, which has seen it move from one of the largest industrial centres to one of the most culturally rich and diverse parts of the United Kingdom. Incompatible. (Identity-Codes-Histories)

When we take a photograph we create a record of people, a place, an event, a moment in time. Over time, the photographs that we take become important, personal and sentimental documents that act as a trigger for memory.

The work in this series are digital photographs taken on a family outing,

which have unfortunately become corrupted through outdated and incompatible data systems, the digital files now appearing only as a mass of abstract codes.


This work challenges the digital image as a reliable historic document and tangible record for prompting memory and acts as a metaphor for the fragility of memory in our delicate human and technological relationships.


Holly Mulveen Blenheim Walk 16 July - 24 September




Recently graduated from Leeds
College of Art, Holly Mulveen's work
predominately questions the nature
of the considered sublime in modern
culture, with the evermore prevailing
dominance of the artificial or manmade, over the natural. Her images
usually reflect that of a typical day,
orientated completely within 'four
walls', our 'box' and safe place, where
such familiarity creates a sense of
solitary limbo for its inhabitant.

In her most recent works, Mulveen has considered each composition with a fusion between media imagery and real objects. There, stands recognition of a reconstructed vision, where through sensory detachment from external surroundings, sights become somewhat composed with influence from a virtual world.

Jenny West Vernon Street 16 August - 7 September






Projection

Jenny West's work explores the relationship between architectural space and domestic objects through the process of drawing. She constructs precise, light and linear, essentially ethereal works, using mathematical drawing systems such as perspective; by extracting information from objects through their measurement and applying methods of projection,

to develop both two and threedimensional spatial works.

States of uncertainty and indecision are countered/contradicted by the use of logical and exact methods of production; the work oscillates between clarity and doubt, fragility and strength, visually combining opposing conditions. The drawings possess a delicacy and vulnerability, offset by their implied architectural scale.


