Rules

- **Maximum length 14 lines**
- **Entries should be in English, typed or submitted online in Word or PDF format, and fit on a single A4 page.**

The prize is open to anyone except those involved in organising the competition. Entries must be entirely the work of the entrant and must never have been published, self-published, published on any public website or broadcast, nor winning or placed in any other competition, as of 15th March 2026.

You may send as many entries as you like. Payments must be made by cheque, postal order, or online. Cheques should be from a UK bank and made payable to 'GLF - Poems on the Move' with the sender's name and address on the back.

- **Please DO NOT write your name, age or residency in the same document as your poems, as they will be judged anonymously.**

Enter each poem (with title) on an individual page. Separately, enter online in the spaces provided (or enclose) your name, address, telephone number, email address, plus the title(s) of your poems. Winners will be contacted by 15th March 2026. Winning poems will be rotated on Guernsey buses. The top nine poems will become part of a second roving exhibition, for no less than six months.

Entry fees are non-refundable. All prize money will be paid in sterling.

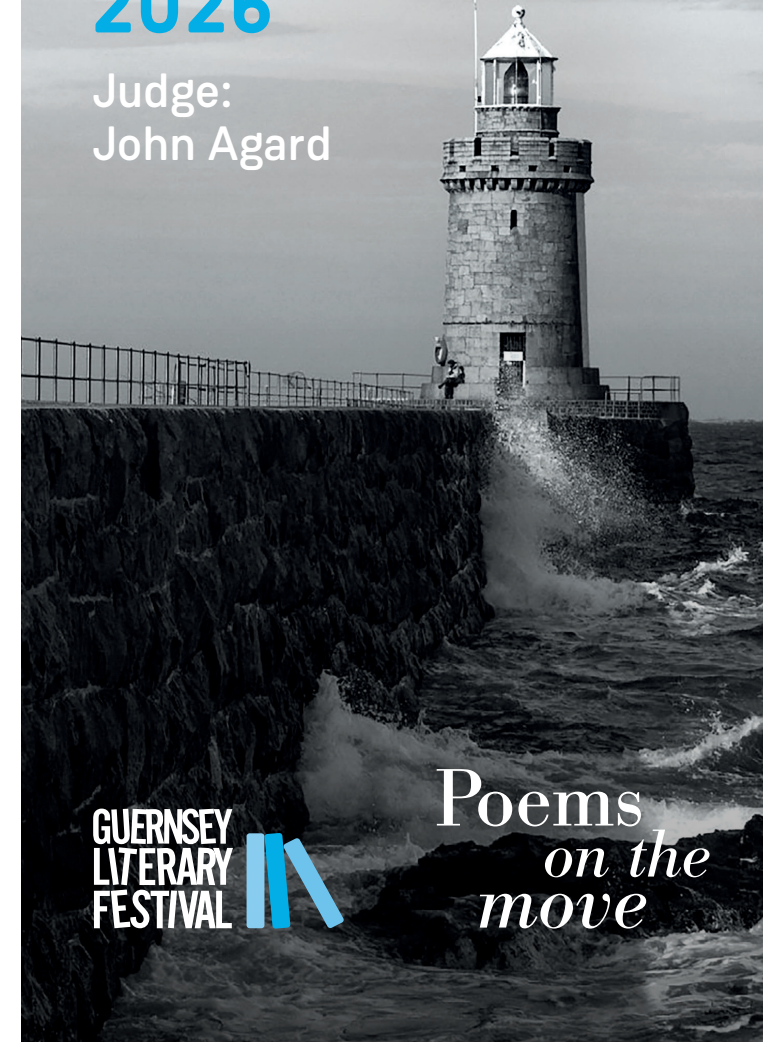

John Agard is a nationally and internationally acclaimed poet, playwright, short story writer, and performer, who over his long career has become known and loved for his playful, witty style and charismatic performances.

In 2021, he was awarded the BookTrust Lifetime Achievement for his outstanding contribution to literature, and has previously been awarded the Queen's Gold Medal for Poetry, the Smarties Book Prize, and many more. He is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Literature and is studied on the National Curriculum in GCSE English. Based in East Sussex, John continues to travel the world, performing at literary festivals and delighting audiences with his signature blend of thought-provoking themes, exhilarating wordplay, and infectious humour.
