Attention!

Before you start



Make sure to have a scratch-free surface when connecting your **IXXI Cards**. We recommend placing a blanket underneath, for example.

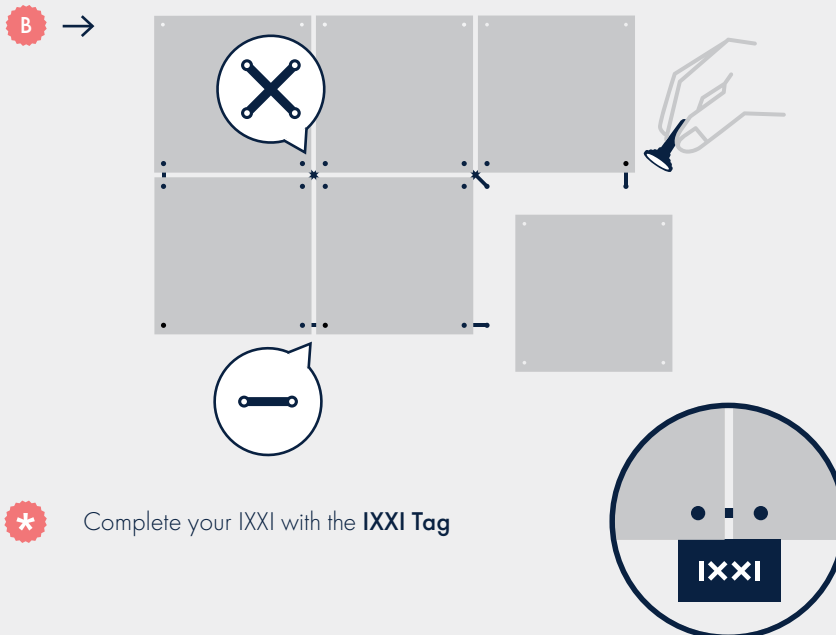
Wipe your wall with a **dry cloth** to make sure it is completely free of dust.

Step 1

Connect the IXXI Cards

- 1 Lay out the **IXXI Cards** (they're packed in the correct order), according to the provided preview with the image facing upward.
 - A Connect the cards using the **X - and I Connectors**.
Use the **Click Tool** to prevent any damage.
 - B Leave the top row empty. This row will be attached to the **Wall Clips** in Step 5.



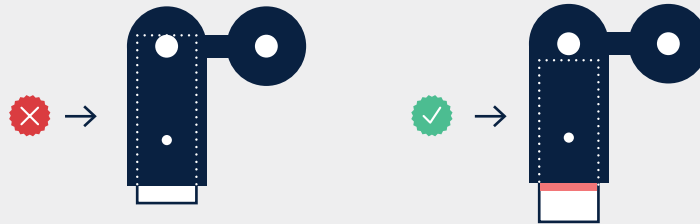
- * Complete your IXXI with the **IXXI Tag**

Step 2

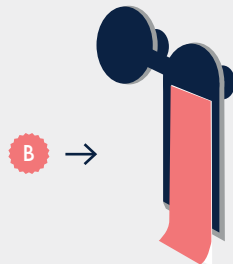
Prepare the Wall Clips

- 1 Attach a **Powerstrip** to the back of each **Wall Clip**.

- A Make sure the red line sticks out from under the Wall Clip.



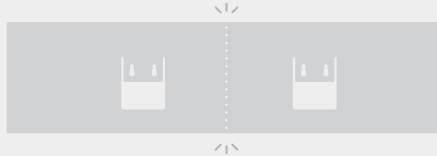
- B Don't remove the protective cover on the back just yet.



Step 3

Prepare the Hanging Tool

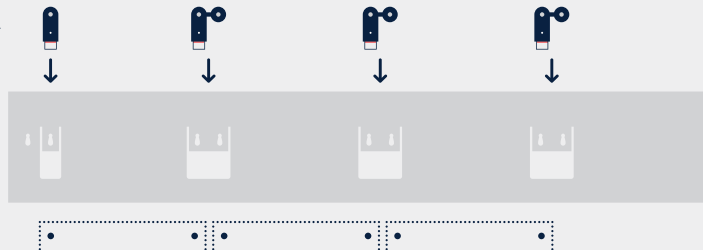
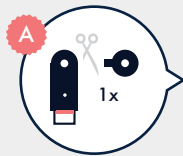
- 1 Unfold the **Hanging Tool** and make sure it's completely flat.



- 2 Fill the Hanging Tool with the **Wall Clips**.

A Cut the first Wall Clip in half and add it to the first slot.

B Add 1 extra Wall Clip to the amount of Cards

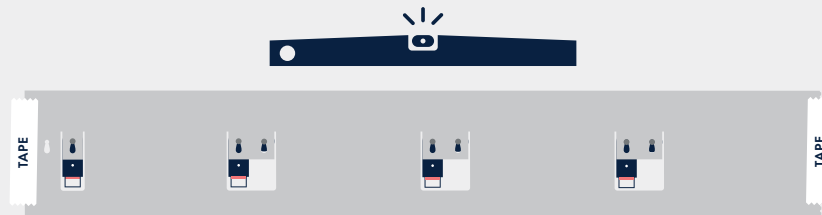


B → **Example:** 3 Cards = 4 Wall Clips

Step 4

Position the Hanging Tool on your wall

- 1 Place the **Hanging Tool** at the desired height on your wall and secure it with tape.
- A Make sure it's flat and leveled (use your **Water Level**).

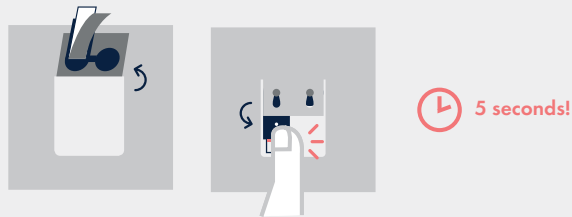


*Is your **IXXI** wider than the **Hanging Tool**? After Step 5 we'll explain how to extend it.*

Step 5

Attach the Wall Clips to the wall

- 1 One by one:
 - A Fold up the hatches of the **Hanging Tool**.
 - B Remove the protective cover from the **Powerstrip**.
 - C Fold down the hatch and press the **Powerstrip** to the wall during 5 seconds..



- 2 Carefully remove the **Hanging Tool** from the **Wall Clips**.

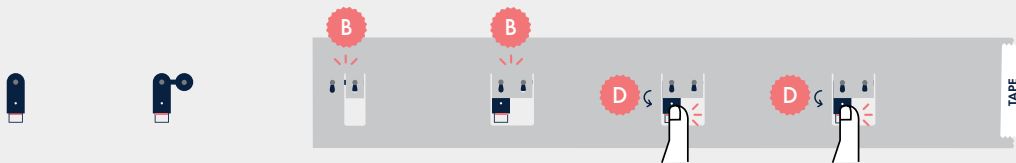


*Is your IXXI **wider than the Hanging Tool**? In the next step we'll explain how to extend it.*

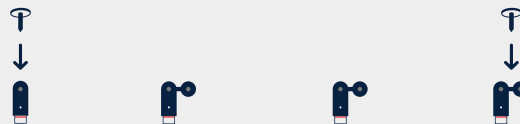
Step 5+

For IXXI's wider than the Hanging Tool

- * If your IXXI is **not wider than the Hanging Tool**, you can skip this step.
- 1 When you've chosen a large-sized IXXI, the **Hanging Tool** may not be wide enough. Let's re-use the Hanging Tool to add more clips to your wall.
 - A Refill the **Hanging tool** with additional **Wall clips** (leave the two first hatches empty).
 - B Attach the first two hatches to the last two **Wall Clips** on the wall.
 - C Level the **Hanging Tool** and secure the far end with tape.
 - D Fold down the hatches and press down the **Powerstrips**, as in Step 5.



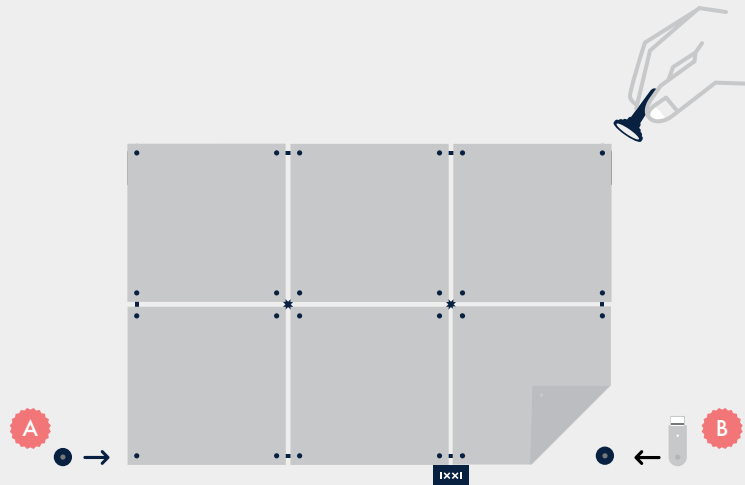
- * **Tip:** For extra support, fasten the first and last **Wall Clip** with a **Push Pin**.



Step 6

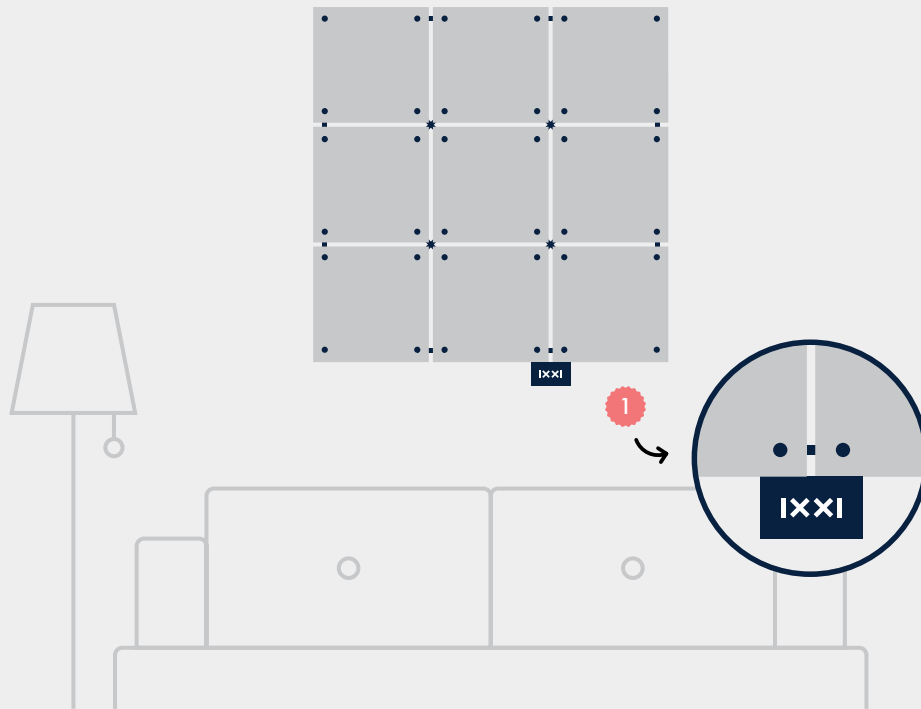
Place your IXXI on the wall

- 1 Click your **IXXI** onto the **Wall Clips** on your wall.
- 2 Cut the last **Wall Clip** in half.
 - A The two **round Wall Clip** parts that you cut off, can be clicked onto the bottom corners.
 - B Alternatively you could use two **long Wall Clip** parts upside down and attach these to the wall with **Powerstrips**, for extra reinforcement.



All finished!

- 1 Complete your IXXI with the **IXXI Tag**!
- 2 Share your masterpiece with the world using **#ixxi**
- 3 Well done! You've just taken your first steps into IXXI'ing your world!



How to Carefully remove your IXXI

- 1 Remove your IXXI from the **Wall Clips**.
- 2 Underneath the **Wall clip** you see part of the **Powerstrip** sticking out.
 - A Put pressure on the **Wall Clip** with one hand.
 - B With your other hand, gently and slowly pull the **Powerstrip** down bit by bit.
 - C **Important:** Do not pull the Powerstrip towards you!



Tip: If the **Powerstrip** doesn't come loose easily, you could try carefully heating the Powerstrip with a blow dryer.
