This year has seen tremendous forward progress and key milestones for the Bullawah Wind Farm. We have delivered two Community Grants Programs, held numerous stakeholder meetings, funded a Plains-wanderer education program, supported First Nations cultural activities, provided further Country Education Foundation and hosted community briefings. We're excited about what's to come.

Key planning and development stages have also been achieved. In mid-2024 we submitted both the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and tender for South West REZ Access Rights.

As we move closer to project approval, BayWa r.e. has also developed and strengthened relationships with local councils, business and training organisations. We are working with delivery partners and will continue to work with local businesses and First Nations groups throughout 2025.

Bullawah Wind Farm progress



The Bullawah Wind Farm achieved key planning and development milestones in 2024.

In July the team submitted the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) to the NSW Department of Planning. This report represents years of detailed scientific work and community engagement.

We received submissions from local community members, businesses and government agencies. The team is now responding to submissions, and you can read more about them at the NSW Planning website.

BayWa r.e. also submitted a tender for the South West REZ Access Scheme in June 2024. This scheme is being run by AEMO Services and will determine which generation and storage projects may connect to local network infrastructure. This process is still underway and you can read more about the South West REZ on the EnergyCo website.
