Cloud Hill Wind Farm consists of 11 x 6 megawatts (MW) turbines with a tip height of 180 metres. The turbines will be co-located with a Battery Energy Storage System (BESS). The Wind Farm design was finalised following consultation with the local community, statutory consultees and Dumfries and Galloway Council.



Projects facts

- Capacity over 60 MW
- Potential to generate electricity to approximately 59,000 households*
- Over £10.5 million in community funds over 35 years of operation
- Site located outside any environmental designations or protected landscapes
- Bespoke biodiversity enhancement plan to improve local ecology and peatlands
- The project will contribute to Scottish Government's Energy Strategy targets of 20 gigawatts (GW) onshore wind

Cloud Hill powering new opportunities

Scottish based renewable energy developer, BayWa r.e. UK has submitted plans for Cloud Hill Wind Farm near Sanquhar and Kirkcubbin in Dumfries and Galloway. If successful, the proposed development will bring job opportunities and millions of pounds in direct investment into the local area and Dumfries and Galloway as a whole.

Opportunities for businesses

Cloud Hill Wind Farm presents opportunities for local economic benefit and employment. Whilst we must follow current legislation and go through a competitive tender process for the work packages, we expect local suppliers and contractors with the right skills, to be well placed to bid for contracts.

The construction phase involves over 300 contractors and we would always look to use local firms and suppliers wherever possible. Skills and businesses needed include civil engineering, site management, various construction trades, equipment operators, fencing, and security services. Local hoteliers could also benefit as they can provide accommodation for site workers, offering a valuable income stream, especially during the off peak season.

Investing in local communities

Cloud Hill Wind Farm will generate an annual community fund of about £308,000 (indexed linked) if consented and becomes operational, which equates to £5,000 per megawatt. Over 35 years, this would result in an investment of over £10.5 million in local communities. Additionally, it will yield broader economic, social and community advantages, including several million pounds in non-domestic business rates to Dumfries and Galloway Council, as well as the multi-million pound community benefit.

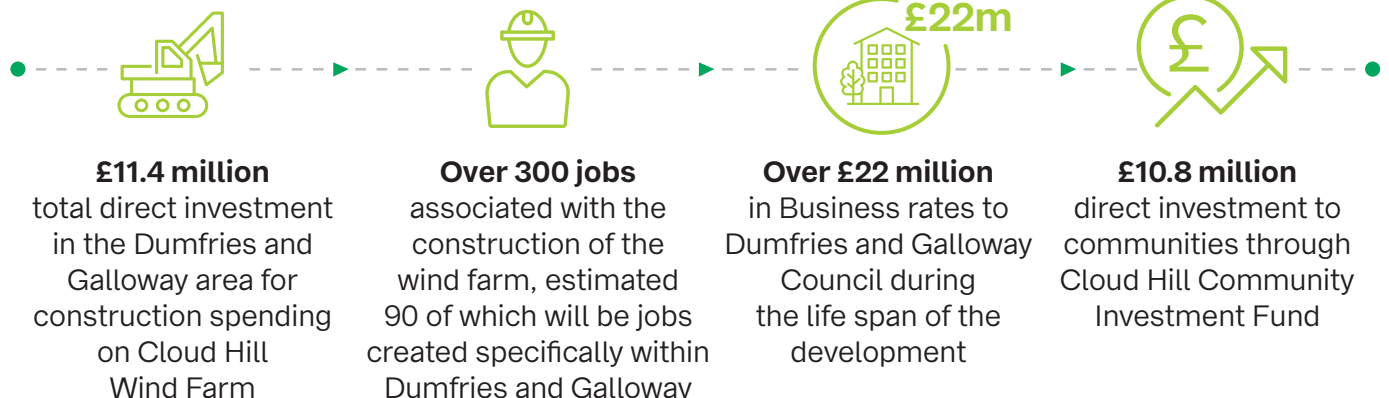
