

BullawahWind Farm

Renewable energy developer BayWa r.e. and its Bullawah Wind Farm project 30km southeast of Hay made solid progress in its first year of development, this year.

It can take three to five years to complete the development stage of a project, and two or three years more to construct. So, it's still early days.


The company with the tricky German name (pronounced Buy-var R.E.) arrived in the region at the start of 2022 introducing the project with the name True Blew, changing it later to Bullawah to better reflect the location.

In February, we started a round of project presentations to the Edward River, Hay Shire, Murrumbidgee councils.

In March, BayWa r.e. Projects Australia Managing Director Fleur Yaxley and Bullawah's Project Manager Aidan O'Mahony enjoyed being on hand to announce Lenny O'Hara of Crighton's Rural Engineering as the Apprentice of the Year, part of BayWa r.e's now ongoing sponsorship of the Hay Business Excellence Awards.

In May, we hosted community information sessions in Coleambally and Hay and later completed our project presentations to the councils.

Following the community information sessions it was decided to change the project name to Bullawah to better reference its geographical location.

Talks started also with First Nations' communities in Hay, Deniliquin and Griffith, as well as TAFE and Landcare groups.

In September, we welcomed Hay businesswoman Krista Schade to the Bullawah team. Krista is the project's community liaison, a local point of contact for Bullawah (krista.schade@bayware.com, 0406 624 447).

In November, we submitted our Scoping Report to the NSW Department of Planning and Environment (DPE). This is our first formal submission to the authority about the Bullawah development. The NSW DPE will issue a list of all the requirements that BayWa r.e. and specialist consultants must address for the next stage – the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the proposed project.

A very important document, one of several more to come over the next few years as we move carefully and methodically through the development of the project. A copy of the Scoping Report can be found on our website (bullawah-windfarm.com).

Bullawah Scoping Report: Message From The MD

It was great to see our 477-page scoping report for Bullawah completed in October.

The report is part of the excellent work already put into this State-significant infrastructure project by the BayWa r.e. Projects Australia team and our expert partners in preparing the report, Umwelt Environmental & Social Consultants.

The report is an early part of the State Significant Development (SSD) application process under which the project is being assessed by the NSW Department of Planning and Environment (DPE).

The report among other things describes the project in simple terms, takes in early community views, describes a community engagement plan, and identifies matters for further assessment in our Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). The EIS comes next.

The scoping report also identifies environmental, social and economic matters of relevance to the project to inform the preparation of the Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements (SEARs).

The SEARs identifies specific assessment considerations relevant to the Bullawah project that must also be addressed in our EIS.
