

# **Guidelines for Postdoctoral Researchers Applying for Research Grants**

Postdoctoral researchers with an appointment at Unity Health Toronto can apply for and hold select research grants provided that **all** of the following criteria are met:

- a. If a postdoc is paid from their supervisor's Tri-Agency grant, they are **not eligible** to simultaneously apply for and hold a Tri-Agency research grant. They may be eligible to hold research grants from other granting agencies.
- b. If a postdoc is paid from a Tri-Agency <u>fellowship</u>, they are **eligible** to apply for and hold a research grant should they meet the granting agency's eligibility criteria.
- c. The grant program guidelines explicitly indicate postdocs as eligible Principal Investigators (PI).
- d. The postdoc's supervisor must approve and agree to be Co-PI and account holder.
- e. The term of the grant does **not exceed** the term of the postdoc's contract. Postdocs are eligible to apply for grants after successfully competing their **probationary period** (i.e. 6 months).
- f. The institutional approvals are obtained.

# Important Notes

- Postdoctoral researchers must discuss any grant applications with their supervisor, agreeing on the time commitment and use of any of the supervisor's or department's resources to carry out the proposed research activities.
- The postdoctoral researcher's supervisor must agree to be Co-PI and account holder of the grant.
- Postdocs are not eligible to apply for or hold any NSERC grants, CIHR Project Grant or other grants that do
  not explicitly permit applications from trainees, unless the postdoc will take up an academic appointment
  before the start date of the grant or within the timeframe permitted by the granting agency.
- If a postdoc grant holder accepts an academic appointment in an eligible postsecondary institution, their grant may be transferred to their new institution (if allowed by the granting agency).
- If a postdoc grant holder leaves their position prior to the end of their contract without securing an eligible academic appointment, their grant will be transferred to the supervising PI (after obtaining granting agency approval).

# **Tri-Agency Grant Programs**

Under Tri-Agency guidelines, postdoctoral researchers are generally not considered independent researchers and are therefore ineligible to apply for most grant programs. However, there are specific grant programs where their guidelines explicitly name postdoctoral researchers, postdoctoral fellows or postdoctoral scholars as eligible applicants. Examples of these programs are listed below:

## Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR)

<u>Planning and Dissemination Grants</u>: The <u>Institute of Health Services and Policy Research (IHSPR)</u> provides support for dissemination activities that will contribute to the advancement of research consistent with the mandate of CIHR. The Planning and Dissemination Grants program is administered through ResearchNet and is launched twice per year: July and January. Postdocs are eligible to apply as <u>trainees</u>.

### Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC)

<u>Insight Development Grants</u> are expected to respond to the objectives of the <u>Insight Research program</u> and support research in its initial stages. These grants are valued at \$7,000 to \$75,000 over **one to two** years. Postdocs can apply as <u>Emerging Scholars</u>. For SSHRC to release grant funds, successful applicants must formally establish an affiliation with an <u>eligible Canadian postsecondary institution</u> within <u>three months</u> of the grant start date and maintain such an affiliation for the duration of the grant period.

Insight Grants are expected to respond to the objectives of the Insight Research program and support research excellence in the social sciences and humanities. These grants are valued at \$7,000 to \$100,000 (Stream A) and \$100,001 to \$400,000 (Stream B) for **two to five years**. Postdocs can apply as Emerging Scholars. For SSHRC to release grant funds, successful applicants must formally establish an affiliation with an eligible Canadian postsecondary institution within five months of the grant start date and maintain such an affiliation for the duration of the grant period.

Partnership Engage Grants are expected to respond to the objectives of the Insight program and the Connection program. These grants provide short-term and timely support for partnered research activities that will inform decision making at a single partner organization from the public, private or not-for-profit sector. These grants are valued at \$7,000 to \$25,000 for one year. Postdocs are eligible to be applicants (Principal Investigators/Project Directors) if they have formally established an affiliation with an eligible institution at the time of application, and maintain such an affiliation for the duration of the grant period.

<u>Connection Grants</u> are expected to respond to the objectives of the Connection program. These grants support events and outreach activities geared toward short-term, targeted knowledge mobilization initiatives. Connection Grants supporting events are valued at \$7,000 to \$25,000 over **one year**. Connection Grants supporting outreach activities are valued at \$7,000 to \$50,000 over one year. Postdocs are eligible to apply as <u>applicants (Principal Investigators/Project Directors)</u> if they have formally established an affiliation with an <u>eligible institution</u> within <u>three months</u> of the grant start date and maintain this affiliation for the duration of the grant period.

# **How to Apply**

Eligible applicants must follow the application instructions as outlined below:

# 1. Find Funding and Confirm Eligibility Search for research grant funding opportunities while ensuring that the "Eligibility" sections state that postdocs can apply.

#### 2. Obtain Supervisor's Approval

Research

Complete the <u>Supervisor Agreement Form for Postdoctoral Researchers Applying for Research Grants</u> that confirms the supervisor's commitment to cover the postdoc's salary during the grant's term. Postdoc must obtain the approval and signature of their supervisor on this form.

### 3. Obtain Institutional Approval

Send completed <u>Supervisor Agreement Form for Postdoctoral Researchers Applying for Research Grants</u> to <u>PeerReview@unityhealth.to</u> a *minimum* of 10 business day before the grant deadline to obtain institutional approval and signature.

## 4. Document Tracking Form and Mandatory Peer Review Process

Complete the mandatory <u>peer review process</u>, as required for all grant submissions at Unity Health Toronto. This includes submission of the <u>Document Tracking Form (DTF)</u> and peer reviewer reports to <u>PeerReview@unityhealth.to</u>.

### 5. Final Submission

Unless otherwise noted, applicants are responsible for completing the final submission to the granting agency.
