NAPLES BEACH CLUB, A FOUR SEASONS RESORT SITUATED IN OLD NAPLES ON FLORIDA'S GULF COAST IN AMERICA, HAS OPENED ITS DOORS. THE 125-ACRE RESIDENTIAL, RESORT AND RECREATIONAL COMMUNITY EMBRACES A SENSE OF EASE, ROMANCE AND GRACE. »

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Champallimaud Design, an interior design studio committed to creating transformative spaces and unparalleled products, designed the interior spaces while, design firm, Hart Horwton, created the architecture and landscape design. For the Naples Beach Club, the design team took inspiration from the nostalgia of South Florida and the botanicals of Naples.

Ed Bekos, Partner and CEO at Champallimaud Design said: “The hotel feels a bit like you’re entering someone’s home. It is grand yet full of warmth and hospitality, rather than imposing or intimidating.”

Upon entering the club, guests are greeted in the Main Lobby, a grand and tall space adorned in crisp toned white paint. The Lobby is enlivened by a dowrlit bas relief depicting Naples’ lush flora that integrates the interior with the site’s surrounding landscape. Classic southern architectural details, including shutters are contrasted within the space by contemporary, stylish furnishings, like the green-hued millwork bookcases.

Further enhancing the Main Lobby, bleached Pecky Cypress, a rare wood native to Florida and characterized by its unique pattern of spots and voids was used on the ceiling coffers. This subtle addition provides a contrast to the crisp interior by adding a local warmth to the space, while showcasing the authentic Florida soul within the room.

The Merchant Room, located behind the Main Lobby and overlooking the sea, is the resort’s restaurant and bar. The space has an old world charm, with birdcage-inspired pendant lighting pitched upon the ceiling and a 1920’s-inspired bar with rattan barstools. Dean Berger Studio created the centerpiece, a moody mural depicting a scene of flamingos and mist emanating off the mangroves. Dining chairs crafted with textured leather and piping details are tucked under wood and bronze tables, anchored by towering palm trees in a central seating group.

Corridors leading to the above guestrooms have been meticulously designed to feel elevated and in keeping with the overall design. Wide corridors of wood floor borders with a contrasting striped runner were created.

To complete the project’s look and feel, Century Industries worked closely with Champallimaud Design, collaborating hand in hand on custom creations throughout the public spaces of the Four Seasons Naples Beach Club. Through detailed shop drawings, 3D renderings, and curated finish samples, the teams ensured that every element fully embodied the shared creative vision—capturing the nuance, intention, and character envisioned for each space. ■

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Within the high-ceiling guestrooms are two-poster beds with striped slipcover headboards that face the windows looking out to the ocean. A television sits upon a carved teak wood console but hidden behind pocket doors to highlight the coastal design. Enhancing the residential appeal, a walk-in wardrobe was added to each room with a play of leather and metal detailing.

Ed added: “We worked with Tappan Creative for the art selection in the guestrooms. The featured art is contemporary yet timeless, a combination of mediums fusing classic inspiration with a fresh perspective. The pieces come together to embody warm sunshine, colourful Naples’s flora, and the glimmer of the Gulf.”

Each guestroom has a designated dining space designed for a relaxed dining experience and anchored by sea glass pendant lighting to create a delicate diffusion of light. Bespoke mini bars in shades of flamingo pink or periwinkle blue sit beneath the glass and metal shelves. For guests to enjoy the tranquility of the surrounding landscape each room has a generously spaced terrace.

Champalimaud Design have created the space as a place for guests to enjoy quiet sophistication and comfort, while rooting the club within its landscape by adding subtle Naples and South Florida touches. The newly designed Naples Beach Club is a hotspot for anyone wanting a calm coastal retreat. ■
