CASINO BARRIÈRE

The legendary Casino Barrière welcomes visitors in to the town center in a shining embodiment of Le Touquet's trademark elegance. Expect iconic architecture, games, shows and a glamorous, hushed atmosphere, all just a stone's throw from the sea.

2 THE ANGLO-NORMAN VILLAS

Go streaming down the lanes lined with majestic Ango-Norman villas, where pointed rooves, half-timbered architecture and gardens in full bloom provide a taste of Le Touquet's chic timelessness.

3 LE TOUQUET-PARIS-PLAGE

With sandy beaches stretching as far as the eye can see, bustling streets and century-old pine trees, Le Touquet is definitely the place to be: a stunning seaside town where surprises await around every street corner.

4 PARC DE L'ESTUAIRE

Clasped between sand dunes and forestland, the Parc de l'Estuaire on the banks of the Canche is teeming with wildlife and scattered with trails and viewing points, making it a peaceful place to commune with nature.

**OBSERVATORY AT THE BAIE DE CANCHE** 

This observatory on the shore is the perfect spot for spellbinding views of the estuary and a well-hidden vantage point for observing migratory birds, seals, the shifting light and landscapes that ebb and flow with the ide.


**BAIE DE CANCHE NAUTICAL CENTER** 

This center tucked away between the sea and forest is a well-equipped base for visitors interested in sailing, kayaking and stand-up paddle-boarding: great for getting moving and unwinding in the great outdoors.

**1** LE TOUQUET RACETRACK

Le Touquet's racecourse is the place to be for all things horse-riding and equestrian sports. This local landmark puts on major races and is known for its warm, welcoming atmosphere and strong sporting tradition.

**1** THE PHARE DE LA CANCHE LIGHTHOUSE

The majestic, iconic Canche lighthouse has risen over the town for more than a century now, and offers up awe-inspiring views of the resort, forest and sea if you can climb its 274 steps.

INDOOR MARKET

A must for foodies! The covered market is open year-round on Thursday and Saturday mornings and is bursting at the seams with fresh produce, local specialties and mouthwatering smells and flavors.

3 JARDIN D'YPRES

Opened in 1905, Le Touquet's very first public garden is a tribute to WW1's Belgian refugees and sets out to safekeep Europe's history and collective memory. The park was restored in 1949 and is planted with commemorative trees from all over the world.

**4** GOLF DU TOUQUET

Amidst pines and dunes, three golf courses for all levels await in a stunning location where style and sport collide against the backdrop of the sea.

**5** COMMUNAL FOREST

A haven of peace, pines and greenery right on the town's doorstep, cut through with walks, cycle paths and trails for a fully immersive taste of nature.

MUSÉE DU TOUQUET-PARIS-PLAGE

This museum's extensive collections unfold in a series of paintings, photographs and temporary exhibitions, along with a jam-packed line-up of contemporary culture bites.

🕡 CENTRE TENNISTIQUE PIERRE DE COUBERTIN

France's top tennis club and sports center boasts an outdoor pool, padel courts, a 900-seat center court and over 20 outdoor clay courts where some of the game's greatest legends have played.
