Associate Professor Kim Moloney is ANZSOG's Academic Director of Programs and the lead faculty of the EMPA. She is subject leader for XXXX, and also teaches into XXXX and the Work-Based Project sections of the EMPA.

She has held senior positions at Murdoch University (Australia), University of Miami (USA), and Kyung Hee University (South Korea), and previously served as an ANZSOG Academic Fellow. Kim has vast experience of designing and delivering executive education programs in public administration, having dedicated her professional life to public service whether in government, in non-profits, or in the research of and teaching of, public servants.

Kim is joining ANZSOG from Hamad Bin Khalifa University (HBKU) where she has led master programs and accreditation processes, and is currently an Associate Professor in Public Administration.

Her research interests engage three inter-related areas: transnational administration, international organizations, and comparative administration. She is co-editor of the Australian Journal of Public Administration, Associate Editor of Public Administration Review, Associate Editor of Administrative Theory & Praxis, and Associate Editor of the Asia Pacific Journal on Public Administration.

Her books include the sole authored "Oxford Handbook on Global Policy and Transnational Administration" and the "Routledge Handbook on Crisis, Polycrisis, and Public Administration" (Routledge, 2025).

Evidence-Based

Grounded in contemporary public administration research and behavioural science.

Applied

Assignments and discussions drawn from real public-sector challenges, including the capstone Work-Based Project.

Collaborative

Cross-jurisdictional learning with peers from multiple agencies.

Reflective

Reflecting on how theories apply to your circumstances or could be applied through self-assessment and facilitated debriefs to deepen understanding

Supported

Guidance from experienced educators, facilitators and subject matter experts

EMPA graduates leave the program with:

- **Applied professional capability.** You will benefit immediately and apply learning to real organisational challenges. The Work-based Project produces evidence of applied cross-jurisdictional problem solving to tackle a real agency issue that matters to your organisation.
- **Whole-of-government perspective.** Whole-of-government perspective - you will understand how public value is created and governed across jurisdictions, institutions, and policy domains, not just within your home agency.
- **Sophisticated judgement under uncertainty.** Confidently weigh evidence, manage competing priorities, and make defensible decisions in politically complex and resource-constrained environments.
- **First Nations perspectives.** Complete an in-depth module covering Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander and Māori history and culture during your first year. Continue learning about Indigenous perspectives as they are woven through the program, particularly the place-based component.
- **System-level leadership.** Lead strategically - shape organisations and systems, not just manage teams - with the political astuteness required at the most senior levels of the public sector.
- **Cross-sector influence.** Build and sustain coalitions across agencies, jurisdictions, and sectors - including with First Nations and Māori communities - and engage as credible peers with a diverse range of stakeholders.
