Artemyn Provides Guidance to Communities on Emergency Plan in Barcarena

In May, Artemyn held an informational seminar in Barcarena, Brazil, for the communities surrounding the industrial plant, as part of the 2026 Emergency Action Plan for Mining Impounds (PAEBM). The activities brought together more than 1,000 residents and employees to provide guidance on how to respond in emergency situations reinforcing the importance of prevention and safety.

Preparations for the PAEBM began in April with outreach activities for communities surrounding the company's industrial plant. Artemyn's specialized safety team engaged residents through dialogue, surveys, door-to-door visits and the distribution of informational pamphlets. The initiative helped clarify questions, share information, and strengthen residents' connection with the company's safety initiatives.

According to Lemaire Monteiro, principal of Bairro Industrial School, a community neighboring to the Artemyn industrial plant where one of the activities took place, "the initiative was informative and necessary.

We learned how to remain calm in emergency and safety situations."



Environmental Education Sparks Children's Interest in Nature and Sustainability

Under the theme "Cuidar do planeta também é um ato de amor" [Caring for the Planet Is Also an Act of Love, freely translated], Artemyn conducted environmental education activities in May across six communities near its operations in Barcarena, Brazil. The initiative provided learning opportunities, raised awareness,

and encouraged sustainable practices among local children.

More than 270 children participated in activities held at schools in these communities. The program included workshops on recycling PET bottles, planting seedlings, and proper waste sorting, along with interactive theatrical performances that made the learning experience more engaging, enjoyable, and fun.

Soccer That Transforms Lives in Barcarena

More than simply teaching soccer, the Soccer School in the Canaã community, community neighboring to the Artemyn industrial plant, in Barcarena, Brazil promotes social inclusion, sports, health and well-being for local children and adolescents. In May, the project began receiving support from Artemyn, strengthening and expan-

ding the activities offered to the communities.

Currently, more than 70 children and young people participate in classes held three times a week on the community field. According to the project's coordinator, Edinaldo Cardoso, "Artemyn's support represents a very important step forward in strengthening this

social project, as it directly contributes to its continuity while promoting social inclusion for the children and adolescents in our community."

The initiative also reinforces Artemyn's commitment to supporting local service providers, thereby contributing to the region's economic development.





Barcarena Communities Receive Support for Income Generation and Sustainability

Between April and May, communities surrounding Artemyn's operations in Barcarena, Brazil, participated in initiatives focused on income generation and environmental sustainability. In Bairro Industrial and Ilha São João communities, nearly 40 residents participated in resin workshops, learning artisanal production techniques while exploring new opportunities for income generation and local entrepreneurship.

In Curupeté community, 22 residents participated in a bio-inputs workshop focused on sustainable agricultural practices. In Açuí, a community poultry farm was established as an initiative that will also be expanded to other communities, strengthening food security and promoting greater economic autonomy for residents across the region.



What motivated me to participate in the workshop was the opportunity to gain more knowledge, learn the techniques and proper handling of the product and earn some extra income,"

Artemyn's Environment Week Highlights the Work of Female Entrepreneurs

Women from the Canaã community, one of the communities surrounding Artemyn's operations in Barcarena, Brazil put into practice the knowledge they acquired during the natural cosmetics workshop by producing gifts for Artemyn's internal Environment Week, held in June. The initiative created new income opportunities for women involved.

For Viviane Araújo, one of the participants, the experience demonstrated that learning can become an opportunity. The initiative strengthens women's leadership, encourages sustainable entrepreneurship, and promotes the use of natural products and more environmentally responsible practices.

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New Automated Artesian Well Offers More Drinking Water to the Community

In Cajueiro community in IPIXUNA DO PARÁ, a community neighboring the Artemyn kaolin mine (ARCC Mine) is experiencing a new reality when it comes to access to drinking water. In March, Artemyn delivered a fully automated artesian well to the residents of Cajueiro, equipped with smart sensors that control water pumping, preventing waste and ensuring a continuous water supply for the community's 28 households.

"This well will contribute greatly to our community because it will make it easier for our families to access water, improving our quality of life and ensuring safe water consumption," says resident Taciane dos Santos.

With the implementation of the new system, the Cajueiro community is making significant progress in quality of life, health, and well-being, ensuring greater dignity and water security for its residents.



Teachers from the After-School Tutoring Program Participate in Social and Pedagogical Training

In March, teachers from Artemyn's After-School Tutoring Program participated in a technical and engagement workshop organized by the company's Socioeconomic Department in IPIXUNA DO PARÁ, Brazil, close to the company's kaolin mine (ARCC Mine). The meeting reinforced guidelines on community relations, ethics, and social responsibility for activities carried out in the region.

The training also provided guidance on pedagogical planning, student monitoring, and the organization of project activities. The initiative strengthens the quality of education offered to the communities. It also contributes to increasingly effective learning while remaining committed to the educational development of students in these communities.

In 2026, the initiative was expanded to include new classes and professionals from the beneficiary communities, reinforcing Artemyn's support for the local workforce. Currently, the program serves more than 90 students across eight classes in the region, led by six local educators.

Children from the Aparecida Community Participate in an Environmental Awareness Initiative

Under the theme “Mãe Terra” [Mother Earth, freely translated], residents of communities near the Artemyn kaolin mine (ARCC Mine) in Ipixuna do Pará, Brazil, participated in an environmental education initiative focused on their local surroundings.

The activity took place at schools in the Aparecida, Fé em Deus, Santa Maria Bacuri, and Cajueiro communities, bringing children together for a hands-on learning experience centered on environmental preservation.

During the program, the students took the lead by presenting the animals, trees, and natural beauty found on the school grounds, drawing on their own experiences. The initiative transformed the school into



a true living laboratory for environmental conservation, reinforcing the importance of caring for the environment and valuing nature in the region's communities.

The words of Luiz Carlos Moreira, a teacher at the Aparecida commu-

nity school, reflect the initiative's impact on the children's daily lives. “After the lecture, the change happened quickly. During recess, I saw the students picking up trash. The teachers will also incorporate these practices into their lessons.”



Free Administrative Assistant Course Benefits Communities in Ipixuna do Pará

Residents of the Fé em Deus, Deus por Nós, Santo Antônio, Aparecida, and Santa Maria do Bacuri neighboring communities of Artemyn's kaolin mine (ARCC Mine) in Ipixuna do Pará, Brazil, began a free Administrative Assistant course in May. The choice of this course is based on a survey conducted to assess community interest in vocational training opportunities. A total of 50 young people and adults are participating in the program, with daily classes held at Nossa Senhora Aparecida School.

The initiative is part of Artemyn's Local Workforce Absorption and Training Program and aims to expand professional training opportunities within the communities. It also seeks to prepare participants for the job market.

“I think the course will help me become more professional by providing me with certification and making my résumé more attractive for a future opportunity at the mining company,”

said Fabiana de Souza, a student in the course.





Mining Sector Introduced to Students at Career Fair

High school students from Irmã Agnes Vincquier School in Ipixuna do Pará, Brazil, very close to ARCC Mine, participated in an April initiative that brought the classroom closer to the realities of the job market. During the school's Career Fair, students learned about careers in the mining sector through a career-oriented workshop organized by Artemyn.

The program featured analysts Gleyce Miranda and Simon Tenório, who delivered the presentation “Mineração, áreas de atuação e princípios da sustentabilidade” [Mining: Career Opportunities and Principles of Sustainability, freely translated]. The initiative introduced young people to new career opportunities while highlighting the importance of sustainability in the mining sector.

According to Francirleide Medeiros, a teacher at Irmã Agnes Vincquier School, “the topics were presented in an excellent way, providing students not only with knowledge about the mining industry but also with valuable information about the many professions within this sector, inspiring them to explore this field further.”
