After-school tutoring program resumes activities in 2026 in Vila do Conde

The after-school tutoring program of Espaço Artemyn, in Vila do Conde, Barcarena, next to Artemyn industrial facility, resumed its activities in March 2026, with classes from Monday to Friday for children from communities in the region.

The initiative serves 97 students from 1st to 5th grade, with lessons in Portuguese, mathematics,

and reading, in addition to providing uniforms and school supplies free of charge.

Among the students is Diogo Nunes. According to his mother, Michele Nunes da Silva, her son's performance improved after joining the project, with progress grades, and increased confidence, resulting in his promotion to the next grade.

After-school tutoring reaches the Acuí community

In the Acuí community, in Barcarena, the after-school tutoring program of Espaço Artemyn (house managed by Artemyn that offers free projects to local) has also resumed classes in 2026, serving 34 students from 1st to 5th grade free of charge, with lessons in Portuguese, mathematics, and reading. Activities take place Monday through Friday, in the morning and afternoon shifts, with uniforms and school supplies provided.

What sets the Acuí program apart is that classes are held in the community's own space, making it easier for students to attend. According to teacher Maria Sueli Carvalho Coelho, the expectation is to promote progress in learning, reading, and overall school performance throughout the year.





More than 100 people participate in the Digital Inclusion Program in Barcarena in 2026

The Digital Inclusion program of Espaço Artemyn resumed its activities at the beginning of this year in Vila do Conde, in Barcarena, offering free basic and advanced computer courses to young people and adults from surrounding communities.

In the first half of 2026, the initiative serves 120 people from locations such as Vila do Conde, Industrial, Ilha São João, Curuperé, Canaã, and Acuí, focusing on expanding access to digital knowledge and providing new opportunities for work and study.

Sports social project in Vila do Conde receives donation from Artemyn



The "Unidos pelo Esporte" project, which promotes the development of children and adolescents through martial arts, received a donation of 100 tatami mats from Artemyn in January, ensuring greater comfort and safety during training sessions in Vila do Conde, Barcarena

initiative has offered free classes to around 150 participants in modalities such as muay thai, jiu-jitsu, karate, and capoeira. The donation responded to a request made through the Fala Comunidade channel, reinforcing support for initiatives focused on inclusion and quality of life.

Fifteen women from Bairro Industrial, in Barcarena, were certified in March after completing a cooking course offered by Espaço Artemyn as part of the Income Generation Program. The training covered basic concepts of gastronomy and food safety.

Among the participants is Maria Joana, 59, a resident of Bairro Industrial. "This training was very good. I enjoy learning new things, especially those that can help supplement my income, such as the culinary course," she says.

With initiatives like this, Artemyn strengthens entrepreneurship and encourages the financial autonomy of women in communities surrounding its operations.



Program boosts female talent and entrepreneurship



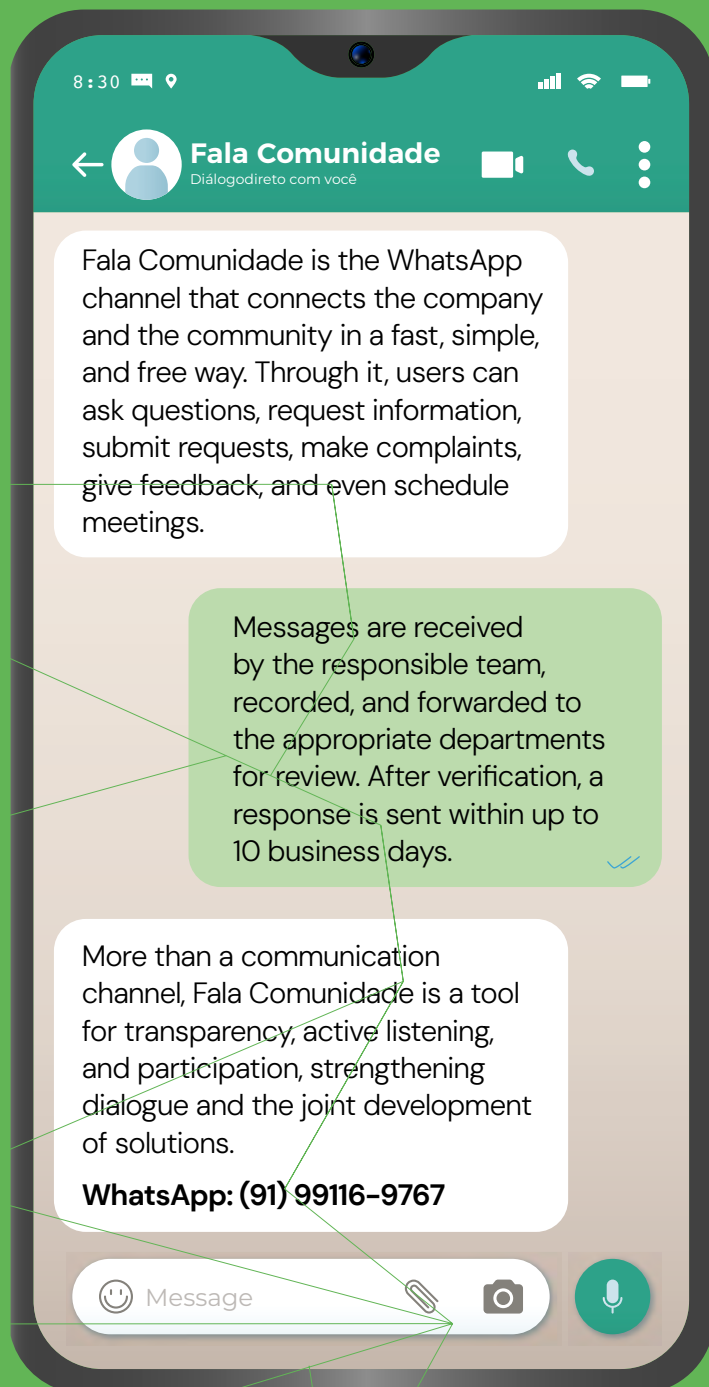
Women from communities surrounding Artemyn industrial facility in Barcarena, Brazil, started the year with in-person Sustainable Entrepreneurship classes at Espaço Artemyn in Vila do Conde. 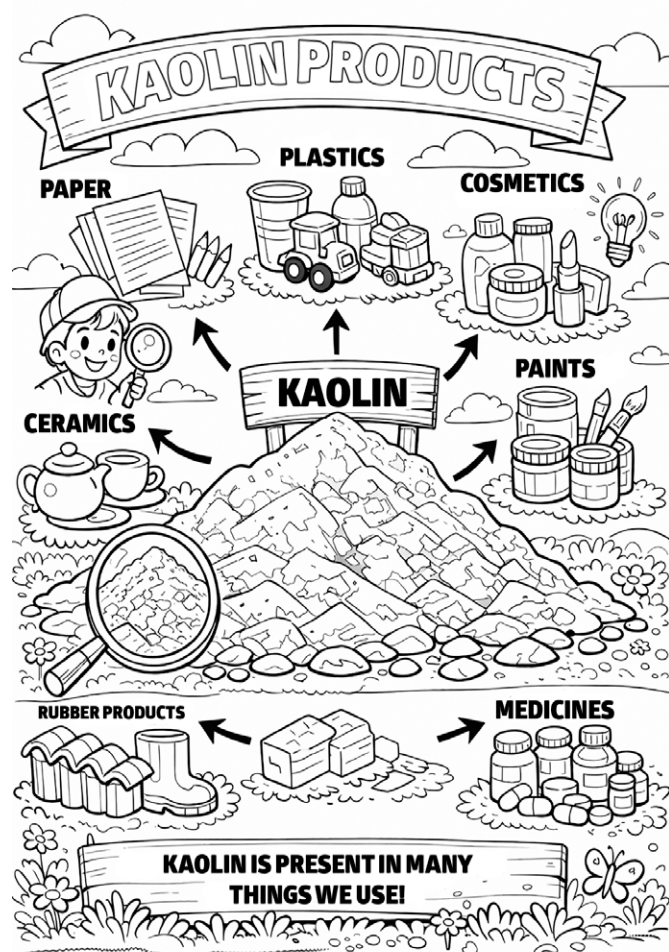

More than 3,000 plant seedlings donated to communities in Ipixuna



In January, the communities of Fé em Deus and Deus Por Nós, both located in Ipixuna do Pará, close to Artemyn Kaolin mine, received from the company a donation of 3,200 plant seedlings. In this initiative, 1,600 seedlings were allocated to each community, including cupuaçu and cocoa species. The initiative aims to contribute to the enrichment of productive home gardens and the implementation of Agroforestry Systems (SAFs).

In addition to strengthening environmental preservation, the action also seeks to generate income opportunities and improve intercropping production systems in both communities.



We are very happy to receive these fruit seedlings, which will enrich our home gardens and also generate income for families in the community. In addition to ensuring food for us, in the future we will be able to sell the production and help support our families. It is a very important opportunity, as we do not need to spend money buying seedlings."

Survey maps reality and strengthens communities served by Artemyn

At the beginning of 2026, Artemyn conducted a survey in communities close to the kaolin mine in Brazil (ARCC mine), carrying out door-to-door visits to 100% of households. The action covered Cajueiro, Santa Maria do Bacuri, Santo Antônio, Nossa Senhora Aparecida, Deus por Nós, and Fé em Deus communities.

The objective was to map the reality of families, gathering data on population, infrastructure, and investments. The initiative aims to provide greater transparency to the company's actions and guide the planning of social projects, allowing the impact of initiatives in the area to be assessed. The data is also shared with residents at the end of each cycle, strengthening community autonomy.



TRANSPARENCY THAT STRENGTHENS

The data collected is also shared with residents at the end of each cycle. By understanding their own figures and the source of investments, local groups gain greater autonomy to organize themselves, identify priorities, and plan the development of their territory.

Residents of Ipixuna join Artemyn's team

“Being part of the Artemyn team represents a major step in my professional growth,” says Alfredo de Cristo Lopes, 38, a resident of the Nossa Senhora Aparecida community in Ipixuna do Pará, close to the kaolin mine. He is among three residents hired by the company at the beginning of 2026 to work as equipment operators at the Artemyn site, where they started working in March.

The local hires are the result of a selection process that began at the end of 2025, focused on valuing local labor. The initiative aims to expand job opportunities in the region and contribute to strengthening the municipality's economy.

Donation of water tank ensures access to water for community in Ipixuna do Pará

At the beginning of the year, Deus Por Nós community in Ipixuna do Pará received a donation of a 5,000-liter water tank from Artemyn, with the aim of improving access to water and ensuring a better quality of life for residents.

The water tank is a request

made through the Fala Comunidade communication channel. According to resident Maria José Oliveira, "the previous structure was damaged and the community sometimes went days without water, a situation that has now been resolved with the company's support."

Christmas initiative delivers food to families in Ipixuna

In December 2025, Artemyn donated 265 boxes of non-perishable food to families in communities surrounding the ARCC kaolin mine in Ipixuna do Pará. The initiative aimed to contribute to a more complete holiday meal for residents of areas such as Fé em Deus, Deus Por Nós, Cajueiro, Santa Maria do Bacuri, Nossa Senhora Aparecida, and Santo Antônio.

The initiative had the support of Santo Antônio community health agent Leide Tocantins, who assisted in mapping local families and distributing the boxes including to residents in hard-to-reach areas.

Artemyn's family farming practices gain recognition at UFRA



The best practices for supporting family farming developed by Artemyn in communities surrounding the ARCC kaolin mine in Ipixuna do Pará were highlighted at the "20th Café com Agroecologia", held in February at the Federal Rural University of the Amazon (UFRA) in Paragominas. The event brought together students, professors, and researchers, and included a workshop on the production

of bio-inputs, such as biofertilizers and water glass.

Organized by the Agroecology Studies Center (NEA), the event invited Artemyn to share its experience in using these techniques to strengthen family farming. According to Professor Luiz Freitas, the initiative drew the attention of the academic community due to its positive impact on the production of the families supported in the region.



WATER GLASS: NATURAL PROTECTION FOR YOUR PLANTS

Water glass is a natural solution that helps protect plants against small insects, such as aphids and mealybugs, while also strengthening the leaves.

WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- ✓ 4 cups (200 ml) of clean, sifted ash
- ✓ 1 cup (200 ml) of lime
- ✓ 5 cups (200 ml) of hot water
- ✓ 90 cups (200 ml) of cold water (approx. 18 liters)
- ✓ 1 plastic bucket (40 to 45 liters)
- ✓ 1 wooden spoon

HOW TO PREPARE?

1. Place the ash and lime in the bucket.
2. Add the hot water and mix well.
3. Let it cool.
4. Add the cold water and mix again. Ready! Your water glass is prepared.

HOW TO USE IT?

- ✓ Apply to plants 6 times, with a 3-day interval between each application.
- ✓ Result: more protected, strong, and healthy plants.
