Please read this carefully. It contains important information about your enrollment, including fees, refunds, program changes, and other relevant information.

1. Introduction

- 1.1. Hult International Business School, Inc ("Hult"). is a Massachusetts U.S. non-profit 501(c)(3) institution and world-recognized provider of business education providing, in collaboration with Hult International Business School Ltd, Hult International Business School, Inc UAE Branch (license number 16360), Ashridge (Bonar Law Memorial) Trust and other organizations, business education in the United States, United Kingdom and United Arab Emirates.
- 1.2. Through its global reach, marketing capabilities, multicultural understanding, and experience, Hult attracts students from around the globe to its business education programs and makes various other services available to its students.
- 1.3. Students attending Hult's campus in Boston or attending rotations in any United States location will be provided their education in the US by Hult International Business School, Inc. (USA).
- 1.4. Students attending Hult's campus in Dubai will be provided their education in the United Arab Emirates by , Hult Investments FZ LLC (UAE), Hult International Business School, INC UAE Branch (license number 16360).
- 1.5. Students attending Hult's campus in London will be provided their education in the United Kingdom by Hult International Business School Ltd on behalf of Hult International Business School, Inc. (USA).
- 1.6. This document incorporates the terms and conditions for all campuses globally for all Bachelor programs at Hult. Local laws and regulations apply and will be set out in Hult's acceptance letter to the student. This document is the current version of Hult's terms and conditions and is subject to change. In the event of a material change, you will be provided notice.

2. Applying to Hult, being accepted and confirming your place

- 2.1 Hult is delighted that you are considering us for your undergraduate program. If Hult wishes to accept you onto the undergraduate program, the terms of that acceptance will be communicated to you in an acceptance letter.
- 2.2 Hult maintains an admissions policy that is intended to assess how an applicant might contribute to and benefit from an intensive undergraduate business education in a global institutional environment. Please refer to the Admissions Policy published on Hult's website for further information.
- 2.3 Hult awards merit-based and need-based scholarships to eligible applicants in accordance with its Scholarship Policy. As part of receiving a merit-based scholarship students are required to uphold the Hult Honor Code and Academic Performance for the duration of their academic studies at Hult. Failure to do so may result in a student's merit- based scholarship being reduced. Please refer to the Scholarship Policy published on Hult's website for further information.
- 2.4 To confirm your place, you must communicate this to Hult in the manner indicated in the acceptance letter by paying the confirmation deposit. This confirmation of your place including payment of the confirmation deposit creates a legally binding contract between you and Hult on these terms and conditions for the provision of education services. If a time period and/or conditions are specified on your acceptance letter and you don't confirm within this time period and/or meet the requirements of the conditions of your acceptance to Hult, your place will lapse and will not be available for acceptance by you. By confirming your place at Hult, you commit to comply with the Student Handbook, Academic Regulations and Policies.



- 2.5 Students may defer their admission to Hult. Restarting the enrollment process is subject to payment of a reactivation payment. The reactivation payment is an amount equal to the confirmation deposit, is non-refundable and will be held and deducted from the first tuition fee payment due following matriculation and will therefore be applied to your first invoice.

3. *Hult's provision of services and what you can expect*

- 3.1 The core service to the students is that associated with the production and delivery of the undergraduate program. In addition, Hult delivers additional services, including but not limited to: marketing, recruitment, visa support, admissions, academic registry, program management, coaching, co-curricular and wellbeing, careers and an alumni program supported by the infrastructure required to deliver these services globally, the management and maintenance of Hult's regulatory requirements and accreditations and the senior leadership team. Such services to be revised and updated at the discretion of Hult (acting reasonably).
- 3.2 Hult commits to providing the services relevant to the undergraduate program with reasonable care and skill. More detailed information about the different aspects of the undergraduate programs (including current expectations in relation to electives and assessment method(s)) are provided on Hult's website.
- 3.3 Hult commits to make available reasonably appropriate infrastructure and facilities to support your learning. This includes, as appropriate, use of teaching and learning space, digital libraries and IT facilities.
- 3.4 Hult commits to providing a learning, living (where applicable), working and social environment in which the rights and dignity of all its students and staff are respected, which is free from discrimination, prejudice, intimidation and all forms of harassment including bullying. This commitment means that Hult will work to provide an environment where its students are able to study or work free from discrimination, prejudice, intimidation and all forms of harassment or bullying. Where this does not happen, Hult is committed to responding to student concerns and complaints. Hult maintains community-wide policies addressing these topics.
- 3.5 Hult commits to providing you with ready online access to the Student Handbook and Academic Regulations and any other applicable school policies and ensure that these are maintained and kept up to date. It is important that you read the Student Handbook and Academic Regulations and remain up to date with them.
- 3.6 Hult commits to providing eligible students with the relevant award for an undergraduate degree and an opportunity to attend a commencement ceremony. If you have successfully fulfilled the requirements for the degree and have complied with these terms and conditions (including the Student Handbook, Academic Regulations and wider Hult policies), you will be eligible for the award of the undergraduate degree from Hult in accordance with the Academic Regulations.
- 3.7 Hult's commitments under this section 3 apply in respect of registered Hult students who have matriculated (and matriculated for each subsequent period of study where applicable), and the commitments are subject to the remainder of these terms and conditions, the Student Handbook, Academic Regulations and other Hult policies. For example, Hult may be entitled to suspend performance of these commitments if students have not paid outstanding program fees by their published due dates and/or are subject to disciplinary action.
- 3.8 Hult reserves the right to dismiss any participant at any time whose academic performance is unsatisfactory, whose conduct constitutes unacceptable professional behavior, who has not paid their fees, whose circumstances prevent them from being a successful community member, or who have otherwise violated Hult policies as set out in the Student Handbook, the Academic Regulations and all other applicable Hult policies. In such cases, the Dean will notify the participant in writing, a degree will not be awarded to the participant, and, as appropriate and legally permissible, the participant's sponsor



will be notified. For students on a student visa at their campus of study, a leave of absence, suspension, or dismissal from Hult will impact the student visa and immigration authorities will be informed. Please refer to the Student Handbook and Academic Regulations for further information.

- 3.9 The information provided in Hult's marketing, website, and other materials describes our programs as typically delivered but is subject to the provisions of these Terms and Conditions regarding program and curriculum changes. Students should refer to the program specification current at the time of their enrollment for definitive information about their program structure.

4. *Your responsibilities as a Hult student*

- 4.1 By confirming your place at Hult, you commit to following Hult's instructions and comply with all preconditions to enable pre-enrollment/matriculation.
- 4.2 By confirming your place at Hult, you commit to paying your program fees and any other fees that are payable to Hult on time and in full. Details of when fees become payable and how payments are made can be found in section 5.
- 4.3 By confirming your place at Hult, you commit to comply with the Student Handbook, Academic Regulations and all other applicable Hult policies.
- 4.4 By confirming your place at Hult, you commit to providing Hult with information about you and your academic progress. You will need to provide information to Hult about you and your satisfaction of any conditions related to your matriculation and/or continuing matriculation in each year of study and ensure that such information is true and accurate in all respects. Once you are a student at Hult you will need to ensure you keep Hult up to date with your personal details and respond to other reasonable requests for information from Hult. Fraudulent or otherwise inaccurate information may result in disciplinary consequences, including revocation of your offer of admission or dismissal.
- 4.5 You have a legal responsibility to take reasonable care of yourself and all others who may be affected by your acts and omissions, and to co-operate in enabling Hult to discharge its legal duties with regard to health and safety and anti-discrimination, including implementation of the relevant Hult policies. It is a condition of matriculation for students that they also co-operate with Hult in this respect.
- 4.6 The student confirms that they will comply with all applicable sanctions laws and regulations governing education and as applicable, online learning. The student must ensure that their participation in courses, online platforms, and related academic activities does not violate these laws. Hult reserves the right to restrict access to its programs where necessary to maintain legal compliance. 5. *Payment of fees*

- 5.1 The program fee is comprised of the tuition fee and enrollment fee as stated in your summary of total fees. The program fee assessed on this program is for the educational and tuition component of the program only based on a standard 30-credit academic year and does not include extracurricular events or other program benefits outside of the education and tuition offered. Additional services may be offered at an additional fee which will vary depending on the courses/electives that you choose. You should be aware that there may be other costs associated with your study at Hult that are your responsibility, and which are not covered by the program fees or otherwise by these terms and conditions. For example, you may purchase books and/or other materials in connection with undergraduate study or incur printing and photocopying charges; you may be required to make payments connected with your commencement ceremony; you may be taking a place in Hult accommodation or renting other accommodation. If you have any questions in this regard, please contact Student Financial Services.



- 5.2 Hult requires that you pay a non-refundable application fee of USD 95 when submitting your application. Upon acceptance, a non-refundable confirmation deposit (USD 1,650 for our Boston campus, GBP 1,050 for our London campus and AED 6,000 for our Dubai campus), known as the confirmation fee, is also payable after acceptance into the program, this fee contributes towards the program fees and will hold the student's place in the chosen program. Your confirmation deposit will be held and deducted from your final tuition payment due, but you will not be entitled to any interest accruing during the period that the confirmation deposit is held. Submitting an Early Action application indicates that Hult is the student's first choice institution.
- 5.3 In addition to the program fees, students may be required to pay additional amounts to cover any taxes, levies, surcharges, or fees imposed by governmental or regulatory authorities relating to the educational program. Hult will notify you in writing of any such additional charges at least 14 calendar days before they become payable, unless the charge is imposed by a governmental authority with less notice, in which case Hult will notify you as soon as reasonably practicable. Such charges will be invoiced separately from program fees and will be payable in accordance with the payment deadline specified in the invoice.
- 5.4 For the purposes of these terms and conditions, "matriculation" means the date on which the student matriculates in accordance with the Academic Regulations. The tuition fees are billed for the upcoming Academic Year, and payments are due as per agreed payment plan. Any additional credits attempted during the academic year are charged at the end of each term. Any additional summer credits signed up for are payable before the start of the summer classes (subject to summer course registration deadlines issued by the academic department).
- 5.5 The application fee, confirmation deposit and all remaining charges due can be paid by the online application portal payment service, which is powered by trusted third-party payment processor, Flywire. The online application portal provides customized payment solutions so that whenever possible, students can pay in their local currency and ensure the correct amount due in the invoiced currency is received by Hult and applied to the student account in the fastest way possible. Invoices will be raised in the currency of the student's registered campus and payments through Flywire should be made in the invoiced currency. All fees associated with remitting payments are the responsibility of the student. Students should ensure to state the full name of the applicant/student and the associated ID number on all payments. Bank detail requests and all other financial queries should be directed to our Student Accounts team via the [Support Portal](#).
- 5.6 You are responsible for ensuring your fees and any other charges or fines incurred by you at Hult or in connection with your studies are paid in a prompt and timely fashion. Where a third party is making payments on your behalf, you will remain responsible for ensuring that they pay in a prompt and timely fashion. We advise all students to be mindful of the risk of bank wire fraud and to take responsibility for checking that any bank transfer of funds is made to the correct location. Hult does not accept liability for payments that are made to incorrect third parties. For any additional questions and support needed related to making payment, please contact our student accounts team ([Support Portal](#)).
- 5.7 If any fees remain outstanding after the due date for payment, Hult will not be required to fulfil its obligations set out in these terms and conditions and reserves the right to do any or all of the following (if permitted by applicable law):
- (a) suspend your participation in undergraduate study by placing you on what we refer to at Hult as "Finance Hold"; and/or
 - (b) terminate your participation in the undergraduate program and/or registration as a student at Hult; and/or
 - (c) prevent you from matriculating into the undergraduate program (where applicable); and/or



- (d) withhold any award and/or transcript for your undergraduate degree you are entitled to (if permitted by applicable law); and/or
 - (e) update your payment plan to the Installment Flex Plan and add the corresponding flex plan fees
 - (f) apply a late payment surcharge of \$100 USD or equivalent in same currency as tuition charges; and/or
 - (g) place your account with a collection agency or attorney, or bring a lawsuit, and accordingly you acknowledge that you will be liable for all reasonable collection agency fees up to 30%, in addition to attorney fees and other applicable charges necessary for the collection of your debt; and/or
 - (h) report any debt to credit bureaus/agencies dependent on the laws of your campus location.
- 5.8 Hult may increase the program fees annually and if so, new tuition rates will be communicated during Spring before the next academic year. Any program fee increase will be driven by an increase in cost base, which may be the result of either inflation and/or investments made in the School. For students who matriculated after January 2020, the scholarship awarded amount will not increase throughout their time at Hult. All scholarships awarded at the time of acceptance and confirmation are always based on a 30-credit academic year unless stated otherwise and will be pro-rated in accordance with the number of credits invoiced to the student within that academic year.

6. Housing

- 6.1. Students on the Boston campus may (subject to availability) reserve a space at Hult House (Hult's on-site residence). Hult House Residents will be provided with a separate Housing and License Agreement detailing the conditions of their stay including invoicing, duration of stay, and payment schedule.
- 6.2. Any housing accommodations referenced or listed on Hult's website, other than Hult House, are owned, operated, and managed by independent third-party providers. While the Institution may maintain referral or commercial arrangements with certain accommodation providers, such arrangements do not constitute ownership, management, partnership, joint venture, or control by the Institution. The Institution does not inspect, supervise, or manage third-party accommodations and makes no representations or warranties, express or implied, regarding their availability, condition, safety, suitability, legality, or fitness for any particular purpose. Students remain solely responsible for conducting their own due diligence and for all arrangements, agreements, and risks associated with securing and occupying third-party housing. To the fullest extent permitted by applicable law, the Institution disclaims any liability arising from or related to a student's use of, or reliance on, third-party housing accommodations.

7. Cancellation or Changing of Programs, Specializations, and Rotation Locations

- 7.1. Where permitted and in accordance with applicable law, all programs, rotation locations, accommodation, and specializations are offered in good faith, but in the event that enrollments for a specific program or location are deemed not sufficient to viably run the program, Hult reserves the right to cancel or move any offered program, rotation location, accommodations, or specialization to another location. Hult will communicate any changes as early as possible, and provide any affected students with other programs, locations, or specializations to attend. Program curriculum may also be subject to change. Students must be in good academic standing and up to date on program fee payments to be eligible to select a new home campus or participate in summer rotations.

- 7.2. Prior to matriculation, students may request a program and/or campus location change in writing. All



requests must be reviewed and approved by Admissions to be finalized. After matriculation, students may elect to rotate to another campus location for the upcoming academic year on an annual basis, during the communicated campus selection timeframe.

- 7.3. Program and/or campus location changes may have additional impacts including but not limited to adjustments to transfer credits; fee structure; visa requirements, fees, and post-work authorization. Payments already completed will be applied to the new invoice(s), subject to currency conversion. Scholarship offers will be reassessed when campus changes are made as they are specific per campus.

8. Program Fee Credit Policy

- 8.1. The program fee entitles a student to study in classes totaling up to 30 credit hours per academic year. Students who attempt classes totaling less than 30 credits will have their tuition fee prorated at the end of the academic year and issue a refund if eligible. For students who attempt more than 30 credits, these will be charged pro rata per credit and must be paid during the same academic year they are attempted. In the final academic year invoice, students will be billed for the credits required to reach the 120 credits needed for degree requirements completion or credits otherwise taken. For completeness, students who attempt more than the 120 credits required will be billed for the additional credits attempted.
- 8.2. This program fee credit policy does not apply to a withdrawing or withdrawn student. In these circumstances, refunds will be calculated and paid by Hult in accordance with the refund policy set out in these terms and conditions.

9. Leave of Absence, Withdrawals, Dismissal and Refunds

- 9.1. Students returning from a leave of absence, withdrawal, or dismissal must pay any outstanding balance in full before rematriculating. If tuition, fees, or service costs have increased since their last enrollment, they will be subject to the updated rates upon their return.
- 9.2. The amount of any program fee refund will be based on the program fees paid for the current academic year, less any applicable non-refundable costs (e.g. student fees, insurance charges, etc.) and any institutional aid awarded (including all institutional financial aid, scholarships, and bursaries awarded by Hult), as per refund schedule in clause 10.1. This is known as the "net program fee" for the purposes of these terms and conditions
- 9.3. In accordance with regulations, special rules apply to U.S. citizens, Californian residents and other permanent U.S. residents receiving U.S. federal student aid. Copies of these policies are available on request from the Financial Aid Office.
- 9.4. The confirmation deposit is non-refundable, except under the following circumstances:
 - (a) In the case of an applicant confirming upon the condition of being granted a student visa for the desired campus and subsequently failing to obtain such a visa due to rejection or receiving written communication from the Hult visa team advising that the applicant cannot or should not proceed with the visa application, the applicant will be eligible for a refund of 100% of the value of the confirmation deposit upon providing written proof of visa rejection by local government or Hult visa team as applicable..
 - (b) In the case of an applicant confirming upon the condition of meeting admission requirements and subsequently failing to meet such standards, the applicant will be eligible for a refund of the confirmation deposit upon providing required final documentation.
 - (c) In the case of an applicant withdrawing, excluding the circumstances set out in sections 8.4(a) and 8.4(b), giving prior written notice that is received by Hult not less than 120 days prior to their designated program start date, the applicant will be eligible for a refund of 50% of the value of the confirmation deposit. Notice received by the school after that date means that the applicant is ineligible for refund of the confirmation deposit. Early Action applicants are ineligible for a refund



under either circumstance.

- (d) If an applicant has applied for the London campus, the applicant has the right to cancel within 14 days of having accepted the offer to attend Hult. The cancellation does not have to follow a specific format, but it must be made in writing through e-mail to the applicant's enrollment advisor.

9.5 Program fee refunds are calculated based on the date the official written is received by the Registrar's Office. Official written withdrawal notices received before 5pm EST will be calculated based on the date of receipt. Notices received after that time will be calculated based on the following business day. Non-attendance does not constitute official withdrawal. The schedule that follows will apply to students withdrawing voluntarily, as well as to students who are dismissed from the School for academic or disciplinary reasons.

10. Refund Schedule

10.1. Subject always to sections 10.2 and 10.3, the amount of any program fee refund will be based on the net program fee after deduction of non-refundable items in accordance with the following schedule:

- (a) Prior to matriculation: 100% of net program fee;
- (b) After matriculation and within end of first term: 50% of the net program fee;
- (c) After start of second term (including Summer terms): 0% of the net program fee.

10.2 Refunds will be sent to the method of payment received depending on the amount due back to the student. As such, amounts received directly from governmental and external loan providers will first be sent back to the loan provider before refunding the student. Any accommodation fee refunds are regulated in the student housing agreement.

10.3 If the student is on a student visa, withdrawal from Hult will invalidate the student visa, the immigration authorities will be informed, and no refund will be paid until evidence of departure from the host country of the campus location is provided to Hult.

11. Early Action benefit:

11.1. For students starting in September 2026 and onwards, the conditions of these benefits that are set out in this section 11.1 must be satisfied:

- (a) If accepted, the applicant must have confirmed their seat in class for September intake by February 15th of the same year.
 - For example, students starting in September 2028 must have confirmed their seat in class by February 15, 2028.

11.2 For students who matriculate Fall 2025 onwards, the Early Action candidates will get access to:

- (a) Exclusive Leadership Summit, this takes place in the 2nd year. Travel (economy class) and program expenses are included.
- (b) Priority access to student housing, first choice of accommodation.
- (c) Enhanced development coaching, access to your personal development coach prior to your start with Hult

11.3 For students starting in September, between Fall 2020 and Fall 2026, the conditions of these benefits that are set out in this section 11.3 must be satisfied:

- (a) "Early Action" means that the applicant considers Hult International Business School to be their number one choice school, and therefore, if accepted, is committed to confirming and attending Hult starting in the fall term following the student's application.
- (b) Applicants must have provided confirmation to be classified as "Early Action" by December 15th



- deadline of the year prior to the start of the Fall term.
- For example, for Fall 2025 starters, applicants must have provided confirmation to be classified as “Early Action” by December 15, 2024.
- (c) If accepted, the applicant is bound to make their confirmation deposit by February 15th of the year that he will start the Fall term.
- For example, for Fall 2025 starters, the applicant is bound to make their confirmation deposit by February 15, 2025. Same deadlines apply for previous intake as well.
- 11.4 In addition to the satisfaction of the conditions listed in section 11.1 above, students starting in January, from Spring 2021 onwards, are eligible to this benefit subject to the satisfaction of the criteria set out in this section 10.3:
- (a) We have opened the Early Action benefit for January intake only for students who graduate in December from their high schools or colleges, i.e. therefore couldn’t join Hult for their year in September.
 - (b) To be eligible for this specific offer, students must have applied to our BBA Program by 1st August of the year before and be able to demonstrate that they graduated from high schools or colleges in December of the year before.
 - For example, for January 2026 starters, students must have applied to our BBA Program by 1st August 2025 and in a position to demonstrate that they graduated from high schools or colleges in December 2025.
 - (c) In addition, all eligible students must have confirmed their seat in class for January Intake by 1st September of the year before.
 - For example, students starting in January 2026 must have confirmed their seat in class by 1st September 2025.
 - (d) Should eligible students defer their start date to the following September Intake, this specific Early Action benefit will be lost.
 - For example, a student that should have started in January 2026 defer their start date to September 2026 will no longer be eligible for this offer.
- 11.5 The Early Action offer cannot be combined with any other full-tuition scholarship offered by Hult. This includes, but is not limited to, the Hult Scholar Grant. This means that students who receive a full-tuition scholarship for their BBA do not qualify for the Early Action offer.
- 11.6 For students who matriculated at Hult International Business School between Fall 2020 and Spring 2024, Early Action candidates (formerly known as Early Decision) may earn a place in a specific master’s degree program following their bachelor’s program at no additional tuition cost (meaning that the tuition fee for that master’s degree program will be waived) (i.e. “Undergraduate Journey at Hult”). Students must register for a minimum of 30 credits during the core academic year. Conditions for this benefit are specified below. The conditions stated in clause 11.6-11.8 do not apply to Early Action students who are matriculating from Fall 2025.
- 11.7 In addition to the compliance with the conditions set out at sections 11.1-11.4 inclusive above, the following conditions would need to be met to maintain eligibility for the Undergraduate Journey at Hult:
- (a) The master’s program must follow directly after the student’s completion of the undergraduate program and may not be deferred or delayed in any way. This offer is not considered credit for later use, nor can it be redeemed for cash value.
 - (b) Students must graduate on time from the undergraduate program and have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 upon graduation.
 - (c) All students will need to pay a non-refundable deposit to hold their seat in the master’s program which will be used for materials and license fees. Payment dates will be specified and due during the student’s final year of the undergraduate program.
 - (d) Students must meet all deadlines for registration and payments to their Master program without



exception.

- (e) Students must always remain in good academic standing and must not receive any honor code violations or be placed on academic probation at any time.
- (f) Students may not be delinquent with payments for the undergraduate program at time of applying for their Master program and any charges from their undergraduate program or other charges from the institution must be paid in full for the student to be allowed to matriculate on their Master program.

11.8 This section 11.8 includes more information related to the master's program that will be offered provided all the conditions listed above are met:

- (a) The Early Action offer is pending final financial aid decision. Should a student be unable to attend Hult financially, he or she will no longer be bound by Early Action.
- (b) Students who qualify for the master's program upon successful completion of their undergraduate degree are eligible to partake in the following programs*:
 - Master's in Marketing
 - Master's in Finance
 - Master's in Business Analytics
 - Master's in Management**

*Please note that not all masters programs are offered across every Hult campus location and that offering is subject to change.

**Students will need to attend a mandatory meeting with the academic team prior the review of their application.
- (c) If any of the master's programs set out in section 11.8(b) above are unavailable at the time of your graduation, a substitution will be provided.
- (d) Because there is considerable curricular overlap, students may not pursue a specialized free tuition master program in the same discipline as their undergraduate major. Students who wish to pursue their free master's degree in a discipline in which they would also like to major or minor should discuss this with the Program Management team and should they wish to proceed, they must meet with the academic team of their master's program prior to submitting their application to that program.

- (e) Future master's programs may be created by Hult—the eligibility of those programs will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
 - Guaranteed campus location for the master program is not included in this offer. If the student's preferred campus is not available, that is not a valid reason for deferment of this benefit.
 - Visa restrictions may prohibit participation or require flexibility in choice of program, location, and timing.
 - Students who receive this benefit may not receive any additional master's degree (also known as the "Dual Degree") at no additional tuition cost.
 - Eligible Student are required to fill in the application form on time as sent to them by the Campus team. No student will be accepted into the free tuition master program without filling out the application form even if all requirements are met.

11.9 Students who enroll in the master's program in accordance with section 11 are responsible for all costs other than the tuition. This includes but is not limited to books, insurance, visa fees, housing, and extra-curricular fees.

12. Hult Scholar Grant

Hult Scholar Grant can only be awarded prior to enrollment with Hult. For Hult Scholar Grant students



starting in September 2024 and later, these additional conditions apply.

- 12.1. The Award amount is for full tuition and new student fee only. The award will be granted for each recurring year of study provided that you are enrolled at Hult as an undergraduate, full-time student.
- 12.2. Hult Scholar Grant students are fully responsible for their insurance, housing and any other living expenses.
- 12.3. The Hult Scholar Grant only covers credits required for graduation up to 120 credits including transferred credits upon admission to Hult. The student will be responsible for the cost of any additional credits less than a 65% scholarship. The student is also responsible for accommodation costs and any other living and travel expenses.
- 12.4. Hult Scholar Grant recipients are responsible for paying for any courses/modules they must retake if they fail to pass this course on the first attempt. These will be billed with a 65% scholarship.
- 12.5. Hult Scholar Grant recipients will be given a formal warning upon receiving their 1st Honor Code Violation. Subsequent Honor Code violations will result in scholarship reductions as per the Scholarship Policy published on Hult's website.
- 12.6. Upon receiving and accepting the Hult Scholar Grant, students who originally qualified are no longer eligible to receive the early action free tuition master's program.
- 12.7. If a Hult Scholar Grant student is dismissed from Hult, they are not eligible to receive the Hult Scholar Grant scholarship again upon potential readmittance.

13. Insurance Coverage

All students must maintain insurance coverage that meets the requirements of their campus of study during in-person enrollment. Students are automatically enrolled in the Hult-sponsored health or travel insurance program applicable to their campus unless a waiver is approved. This requirement applies throughout a student's enrollment, including during any campus rotation. Students may be enrolled in, and charged for, the health or travel insurance program applicable to the campus at which they are studying during the relevant coverage period. Students who wish to opt out of the Hult-sponsored insurance program must submit a waiver request and all required supporting documentation by the published deadline. Waivers will only be approved where the student's alternative insurance coverage provides comparable benefits and satisfies all applicable insurance requirements for the relevant campus. The published waiver process sets out the applicable criteria and deadlines. Where a waiver is approved, any associated insurance charge will be adjusted accordingly. Students whose waiver request is denied, or who do not submit a waiver request by the applicable deadline, will remain enrolled in the Hult-sponsored insurance program and are responsible for all associated fees.

Hult may share your personal data with our business partners both within and outside the United States,



including in the United Kingdom and EEA/Switzerland. Hult has put appropriate safeguards in place for international transfers of your personal data, including in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act and standard contractual clauses or other appropriate safeguards as required by applicable data protection law.

- 14.3. Hult and its business partners may also use your personal data, combined with information about you obtained from third-party sources, to inform you about our programs and services.
- 14.4. We will only keep your personal data for as long as it is necessary and for the purposes for which it has been collected, or in accordance with time limits stipulated by law and good practice, unless further retention is required for compliance with a legal obligation or for the establishment, exercise, or defense of legal claims. You have the right to withdraw your consent at any time, or object to Hult using your personal data for marketing purposes, by contacting us at the address set out below.
- 14.5. - 14.6. Information about the enrollment and/or financial status of a Hult student will be disclosed only in accordance with applicable laws, including the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act where applicable. Information will only be provided to student loan providers if the provider presents adequate consent from the student.

15. *Extraordinary Circumstances*

Where circumstances beyond Hult's reasonable control make it impossible or impracticable to deliver teaching or services as planned, Hult will take all reasonable steps to minimize disruption and, where possible, provide suitable alternative arrangements, which may include temporary relocation to another Hult campus, a shift to online or hybrid delivery, adjusted academic calendars, or modified program content.

If Hult provides such alternative arrangements in good faith, students will not be entitled to a refund, fee reduction, or compensation solely on the basis that the format, location, or timing of delivery differs from what was originally planned.

Hult will not be liable for any indirect, consequential, or incidental losses arising from such circumstances, including travel costs, accommodation costs, lost earnings, or visa-related expenses.

Such circumstances include but are not limited to natural disasters, epidemics or pandemics, government-imposed restrictions, acts of war or terrorism, damage to essential facilities, failure of essential utilities due to third-party provider failure, or changes in law or regulation that materially affect Hult's ability to deliver the program as planned.

Nothing in this agreement affects students' statutory rights under applicable consumer protection law.

16. *Miscellaneous*

Notices. Any notice required under these Terms will be sent to the student's Hult email address. Students are responsible for monitoring their Hult email and any notice is deemed received 48 hours after sending.

Entire Agreement. These Terms, together with the student's confirmation letter and any documents incorporated by reference, constitute the entire agreement between the student and Hult regarding



enrollment and participation in the program.

Amendments. Hult may update these Terms for future academic years. Material changes will be communicated to enrolled students with reasonable notice prior to taking effect. Continued enrollment following such notice constitutes acceptance of the updated Terms.

Severability. If any provision of these Terms is found to be unenforceable, the remaining provisions will continue in full force and effect.

Assignment. Students may not transfer or assign their place, scholarship, or any rights under these Terms to another person.
