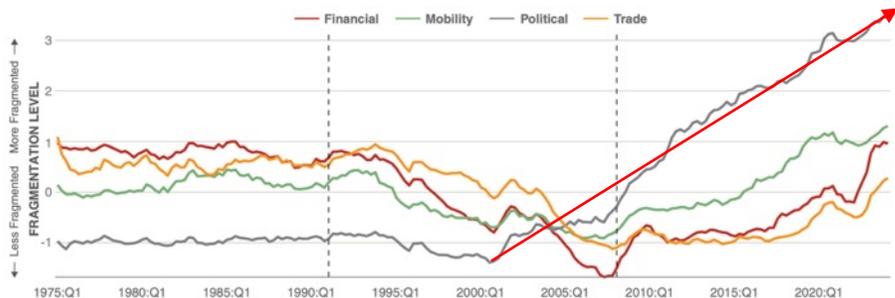

Slower consumption

Back to the basics

Rather than marketing fluff, people value products that show their worth through reliability, longevity, and genuine quality.

De-commercialization

People are discovering their own creativity, turning to analogue practices and co-authoring their experience.

Pride in the local

People embrace local heritage and craftsmanship, valuing authenticity and cultural identity of place above generic, mass-market products.

Recrafting lux

Future luxury will celebrate the irreproducible, the handmade, the beauty shaped by time, and the intentional presence of human connection.

Experience-rich gatherings

People are looking for more meaningful encounters and soul-nourishing moments like concerts, exhibitions, and shared events as enriching forms of social commerce.

Spending on personal expansion

Seeking transformative life experiences, people are investing in personal growth by learning new skills or expanding their worldview through life-changing travel.

Orchestrated and hyper-niche retail

Joyful, high-value moments emerge when brands craft hyper-personalized, multi-sensory experiences that connect deeply with people’s emotions and values.

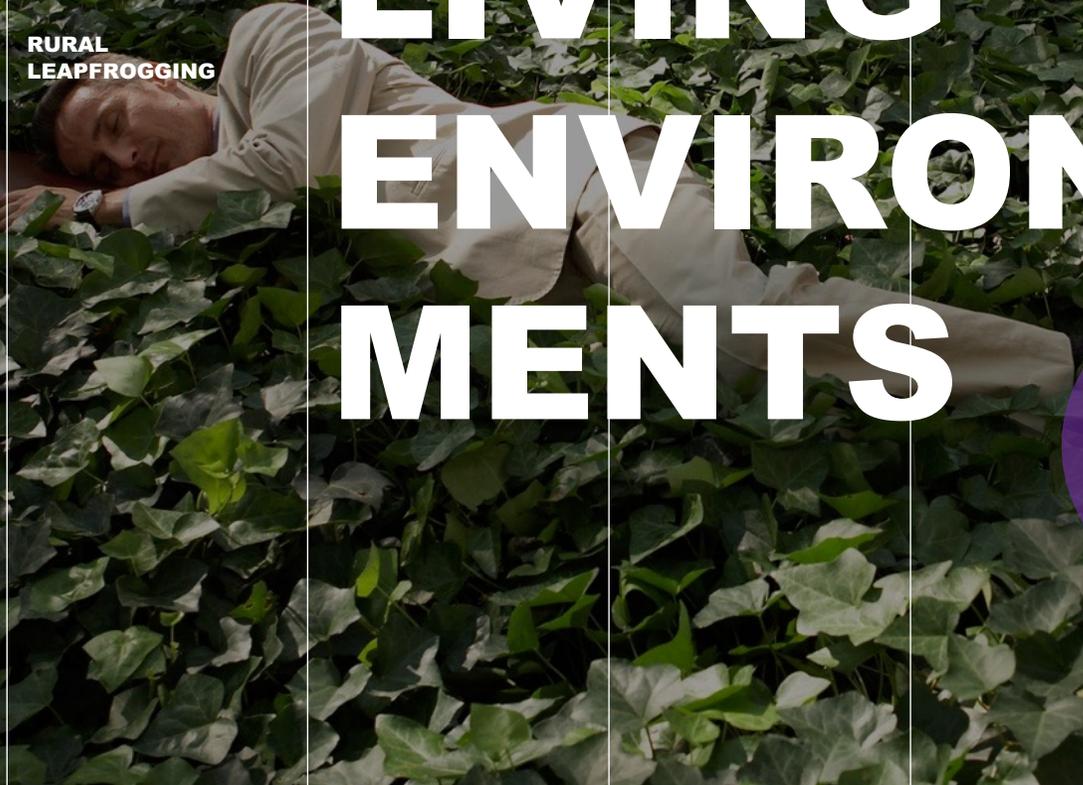

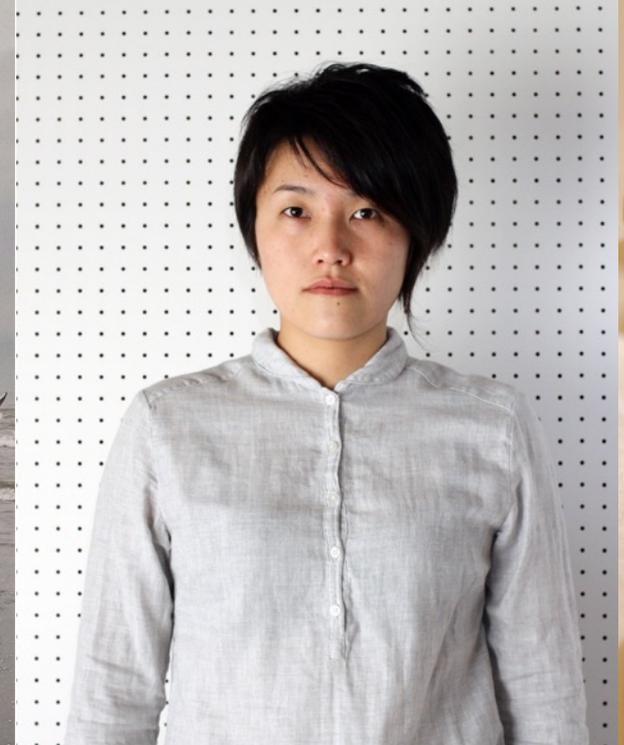
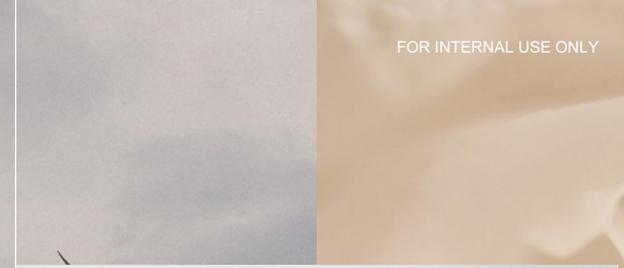

Reclaiming full-body awareness

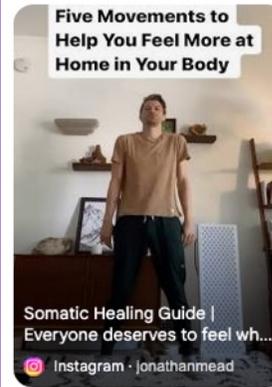
Reconnecting with our physical presence and embodied intelligence means re-learning to inhabit our body as an intuitive, perceptive guide for experiencing the world.

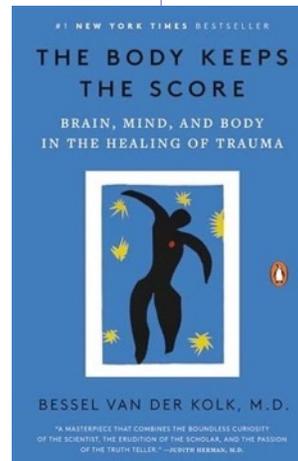
Breaking the trauma loop

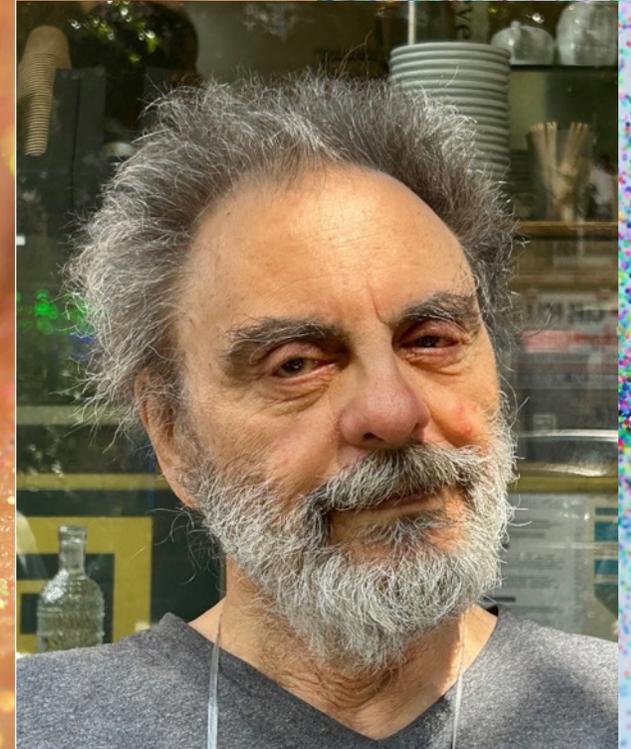

We must support older adults in defining their own pathways of aging, rejecting discriminatory standards in favor of personalized choices about meaningful later life.

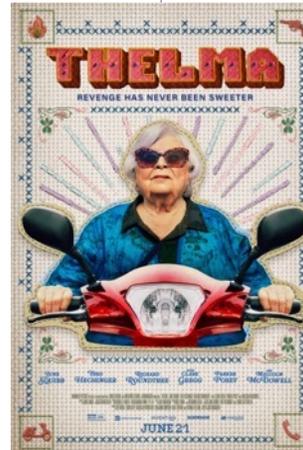

Curated digital presence

People are navigating a fragmented infosphere by using big platforms strategically for visibility and reach while turning to niche and encrypted spaces for safety, openness, and genuine connection.

Post-addiction media literacy

Digital natives are developing emotional resilience and filtering skills, which could evolve into complex information-processing abilities as they learn to handle overwhelming stimuli, preparing them for AI-saturated environments.

Freedom and the many voices

People envision digital platforms as spaces of agency and freedom, where they engage across perspectives, explore multiple sources of truths, and form their own opinions without censorship or manipulation.

Beyond the scroll

As attention-driven platforms devour themselves in sensationalism and eroding trust, social media as we know it may be approaching its limits, opening the way for more nuanced, values-based networks built on regulations, ethics, and trust.

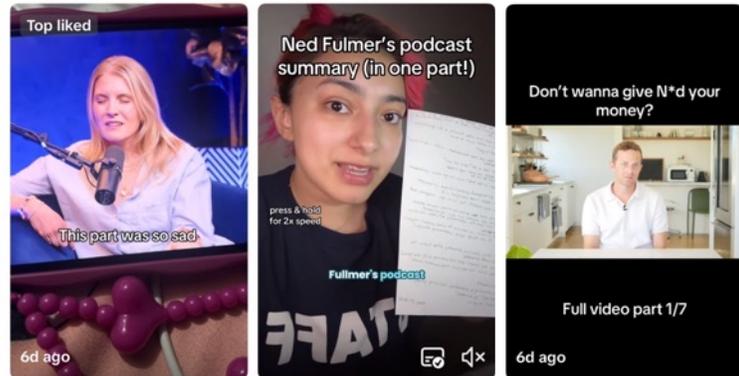

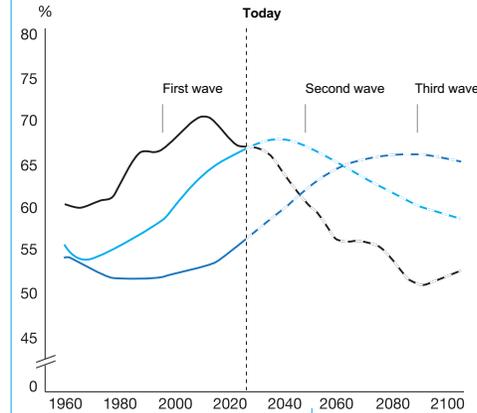

NAVIGATING MANY WORLDVIEWS

Value-system diversity

Mutually beneficial exchange among cultures will depend on recognizing fundamentally different beliefs about individual freedom and social responsibility.

Alternative leadership models

Emerging leadership models emphasize consensus-building and collective decision-making, offering alternatives to individualistic, hierarchical, and male-dominated modes of governance.

Communication across worldviews

In a multi-polar world, we must develop translation skills across different worldviews, while exercising cultural humility to facilitate meaningful dialogue.

Pluralistic legal frameworks

Global reordering demands more flexible legal systems that integrate customary law and community justice alongside existing structures for business and dispute resolution.

DEEP DIVE ALTERNATIVE FUTURES

NAVIGATING MANY WORLDVIEWS

Due to the inherent complexity of navigating pluralistic worldviews, key facets from the Alternative Futures Report have been included to illuminate how fundamental concepts – freedom, human rights, development, governance – carry vastly different meanings and priorities across cultures. Understanding these diverging interpretations is essential for businesses operating in a multipolar world, where assumptions about universal values no longer hold and success depends on recognizing legitimate differences in what societies consider desirable and just.

Diverging perspectives on human rights

Western democracies prioritize political freedoms and civil liberties, while emerging powers emphasize economic development, social stability, and collective prosperity as foundational rights of the state.

Sovereignty over globalization

Major emerging economies like China, India as well as Russia increasingly assert national autonomy in policy-making, reshaping global governance structures to reflect multipolar rather than Western-centric priorities.

Development vs. climate commitments

Developing regions like India, South Africa, and Argentina put priority on economic growth and poverty reduction rather than on immediate emissions reduction.

Individual liberty vs. collective welfare

Different societies like China and Russia navigate the tension between personal freedoms and communal responsibility, prioritizing stability and prosperity over unrestricted individual rights.

Socioeconomic equity and well-being as priorities

Emerging powers like India and South Africa frame human rights discussions around economic well-being, food security, and community development, challenging the assumed moral superiority of the West.

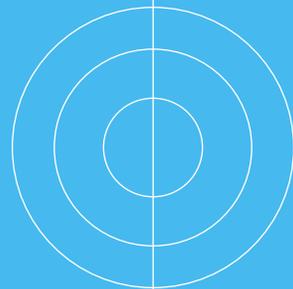
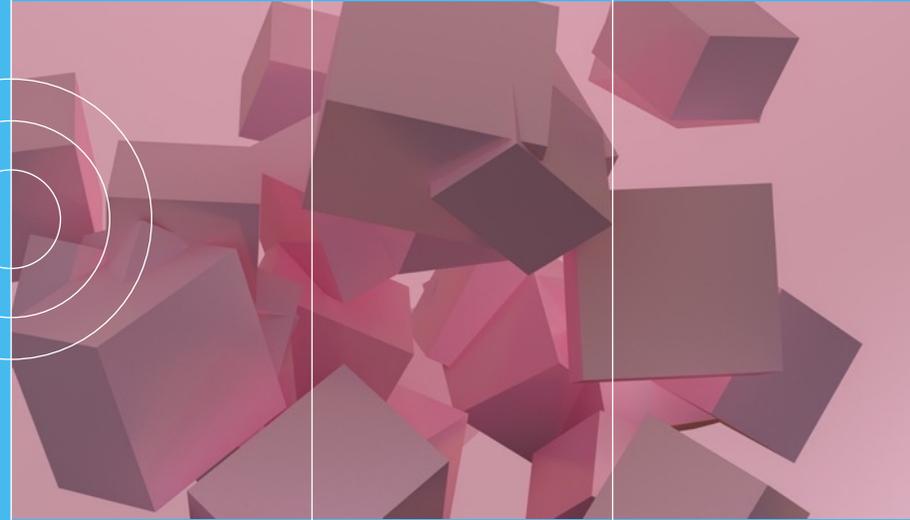

From corporations to entrepreneurs

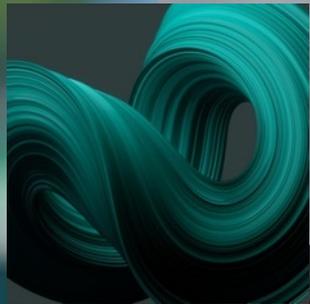

Eye-level partnerships

To remain viable, companies will abandon top-down centralized thinking to build collaborative relationships based on mutual respect and shared decision-making.

Place-based systems change

Understanding local realities and cultural context enables effective solutions that honor each place's distinct challenges rather than using generic, copy-paste approaches.

Skin in the game

Companies build trust through lasting commitment to communities by sharing risk and choosing to partner and co-create rather than extract value without giving back.

Long-term accountability

Business success will be measured by long-term positive impact on people and environments, moving beyond quarterly performance metrics.

New KPIs beyond growth

To remain viable, companies will adopt assessment frameworks that track contributions to ecosystem health, community resilience, and human flourishing alongside financial returns.

AI tools eliminate barriers to monetization, allowing individuals to professionalize passion projects without corporate infrastructure or venture capital.

Adaptive micro-economies

Small businesses become more viable as AI automation makes regional production profitable, while global supply chain vulnerabilities reward adaptability over size.

The micro-company goes large

Single-person “unicorn” companies compete with industry giants by leveraging accessible AI tools, redefining market power through agility rather than scale.

Autonomy over dependency

Professionals choose entrepreneurship over traditional employment or platform gig work, preferring independent ventures to corporate or algorithmic gatekeepers.

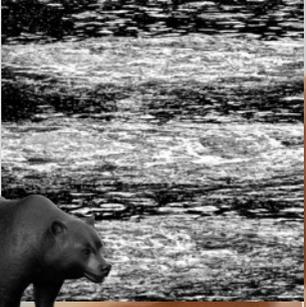

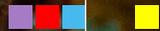
