

# 5 FUN GAMES TO BOSS YOUR REVISION

Feeling the crunch of revision season?

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## DID YOU KNOW?!

Did you know, you're **75% more** likely to take in information if you act it out? And **95% more** likely if you teach it to someone else?

So, **set up a revision group** with some pals and use these 5 fun revision games to make your notes more memorable.

# JENGA QUIZ

- Start by building your Jenga block
- Choose a topic to focus your questions on
- Everytime you pull out a jenga block, you must answer a question from the quiz master (they can have their notes to hand)
- If you're correct, you get a point and add the block to the top
- If you get it wrong, you don't get a point and the block gets put to the side
- Keep going until the tower topples over
- Make sure to swap roles so someone else is quiz master each time!

# CHARADE IT

- Pick a topic to focus on
- On individual bits of paper, each person writes down 5-6 words or phrases that are relevant to the topic
- Pop them in a bowl
- Set the timer for 30 seconds
- Each person picks out a paper and acts the word or phrase while the others have to guess
- Once they've guessed correctly, pick out another piece of paper until the timer stops
- Keep going with as many different topics as you like!

# GET CRAFTY

- Mind maps are a great way to visualise your notes
- Grab some pens and large pieces of paper
- Between you and your friends, create mind maps on different topics
- Write down the theme in the centre of the page and fill the surrounding space with all the essential information you associate with it
- Once you're done, use the mind map to quiz each other on what you've written down!

# POST-IT CHALLENGE

- Write out one sample question per post-it note, plus the answer on the back
- Make sure you do at least 10-15 of these so you have a good batch
- Stick the notes all over the house in places that you'd least expect to find them – inside cupboards, jacket pockets and bathroom cabinets
- Run around trying to find them, and when you do answer the question
- When you answer correctly, move onto the next!

# MESSAGE IT

- Create a group message with one or two friends who are preparing for the same exam as you
- Flick through your notes and pick out some key facts that you can turn into questions
- Take it in turns to ask each other questions, texting them to each other throughout the day
- This method will force you to not only open up the books and dig up new facts but answer questions you aren't expecting!



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
