Press release: New World Health Summit Reports 2025 showcase global health progress amid growing fragmentation



Highlighting global health progress in times of geopolitical tensions, the [World Health Summit Report 2025](#) presents the key outcomes and insights of this year's Summit. Following the leitmotif "Taking Responsibility for Health in a Fragmenting World," the report outlines how global leaders and changemakers advanced efforts to strengthen the global health architecture amid increasing global fragmentation. Key outcomes of the WHS 2025 include:

- **New evidence:** The newly released Global Burden of Disease Study 2023 revealed declining overall mortality but rising youth deaths and widening inequities.
- **New pledges:** Germany announced a €1 billion commitment to the Global Fund to fight AIDS, Tuberculosis, and Malaria.
- **New connections:** With more than 45,000 online participants and over 4,000 on-site in Berlin from 144 countries, the Summit once again demonstrated its strength as a truly global platform for collaboration. 90% of participants reported making new, relevant contacts.
- **New initiatives:** UNFPA and partners launched the Berlin Roadmap, calling for bold investments and collective action to close the global women's health gap.
- **New partnerships:** WHO and the EU introduced a joint initiative to drive digital transformation of health systems across Sub-Saharan Africa.

Published in conjunction with the Summit Report, the newly released [WHS 2025 Media Report](#) highlights the Summit's growing international recognition as the leading platform for global health and the increasing global media attention to the topic. The report shows strong momentum across all channels, with international media coverage and livestream audiences doubling. Key figures include:

- **2,900+ media reports worldwide**
- **45,000+ livestream views**
- **26% follower growth across WHS social media platforms since 2024**
