

## Room Overview - Pavillon - World Health Summit

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### General Information

Session format of room *Pavillon*: **Panel Discussion (PD)**

Our Panel Discussions allow for a multi-stakeholder debate on some of the most pressing global health challenges. Ministers, parliamentarians, representatives from civil society and business discuss with experts from all sectors what are the most important obstacles and solutions towards a healthier and fairer world.

Participant capacity on-site of room *Pavillon*: **250 PAX** regular and optional **64 seats** on grandstands

### Technical Infrastructure & Equipment Information

On the **speaker area** of room *Pavillon*:

- Fish bowl set-up with a maximum of six seats on the central stage, including one hot seat.
- If the panel is larger than the designated number of speaker seats, the additional speakers will have a seat reservation in the front row and they will then be able to step up to the lectern to speak.
- Eight TV screens placed in the room to show slides, videos etc. Video messages in other languages than English require English subtitles.
- Speakers are wired with microphones. Handheld microphones will be provided as a backup for questions from the audience.
- Additional presentation software can be added to the presentation of a speaker, but will have to be checked beforehand to see if it can be implemented. Please inform our speaker department at least two weeks prior to your session, if you plan to use additional software such as Mentimeter, Slido etc. in your presentation.

In the **audience area** of room *Pavillon*:

- Seating for up to 314 participants, 250 regular seats and 64 seats on the outer grandstands. The seats will be distributed on a first come first serve basis and reservations will not be possible. There is no guarantee of attending every session due to capacity limitations.
- The production crew will sit at the left side of the entrance. This area is not accessible for participants.
- The conference language of the World Health Summit is English. Interpretation equipment will not be provided for participants. Video messages in other languages require English subtitles.
