## Jean Royère, Roberto Platé and the Global Journey of Designers and Artists

After World War II, many designers and artists traveled worldwide seeking freedom and new opportunities. Jean Royère exemplified this nomadic spirit, starting in Paris during the 1930's and expanding his work internationally with projects in Beirut, Lima, and São Paulo, giving birth to a transatlantic aesthetic.

Meanwhile, Brazilian modernism flourished through the vision of European émigrés, such as Joaquim Tenreiro, each fusing memory and heritage with a lifestyle shaped by local climate and craft. As Europeans headed south, Latin American artists like Roberto Platé moved north, escaping the censorship of their homelands' dictatorship. Platé's art work blends abstraction and symbolism. As Marguerite Duras once wrote, he paints "signs that look as though they are things". Platé became a recognized painter and scenographer in France, close to the avantgarde art, theater, and literary circles.

By weaving together the itineraries of these restless spirits, the exhibition reveals a transcultural constellation: a singular space where Europe and Latin America respond to one another. Forms, colors, and materials become vessels of a shared longing to cross borders, and break disciplinary boundaries to invent new horizons.

This shared ground is the beating heart of the exhibition: the works do not unfold in isolation but gather together in deliberate proximity, sparking echoes, frictions, and resonances. Visitors are invited to feel this dialogue both physically and emotionally: to sense a painting by Roberto Platé reverberating with a piece by Jean Royère, a Brazilian chair by Joaquim Tenreiro responding to an Italian light by Gino Sarfatti and Maria Pergay. Together, they compose a scene unlike any other; a story of unexpected encounters, fertile crossings, and the mingling of perspectives.













(1902–1981) a French designer and decorator, widely celebrated for his innovative and whimsical approach to furniture and interior design. Royère's work redefined modernism, blending a playful sense of fantasy with functional design, and he became one of the most important figures in 20th– century decorative arts.

Supported by an increasingly international clientele, Royère expanded internationally after World War II.

Royère was already a famous interior designer in France in the 1940's when he met Nadim Madjalani, a Lebanese architect. He opened an office in Cairo, Egypt in 1946, quickly followed by one in Beirut, in association with Majdalani.

During the course of Royere's frequent visits to Lebanon, a profound friendship between the two men naturally evolved, and Majdalani responded by being able to introduce numerous prospective clients; together they completed several successful projects like the Beirut luxury hotels "Le Capitole" or "St Georges". With the construction in 1955 of Majdalani

"L'atelier" gallery on Avenue Sleiman-Boustani, Royere now had a vitrine through which he could continually exhibit his new design, until the mid 1960's.

His work for royals and elites helped solidify his international reputation. The decorator gained the favor of regional leaders and royalty, including King Hussein of Jordan, the King and Queen of Saudi Arabia, and the Shah of Iran.

Jean Royère's furniture is a testament to the seamless blending of design, form, and materials. His creations, like the Eiffel Tower console, exemplify his ability to balance elegance and structure, while the Ruban coffee table showcases his playful use of lines and curves, bringing a sense of fluidity to modern interiors. Royère's Ondulation light chandelier, with its undulating forms, adds a poetic touch to any space, combining aesthetics and functionality with grace. Similarly, his Écusson pair of armchairs, with their distinctive shield-shaped backs, demonstrate his mastery in merging comfort with a unique sculptural quality.



The stem of this lamp is composed of a single undulating tube in black-patinated wrought iron, interspersed with polished bronze spheres alternating between the upper and lower sections. A circular metal plate, painted in its original black finish, tops the stem and supports a central rod holding the lampshade (not original). The whole rests on a square base of black marble.

This lamp model is well documented in Jean Royère's archives preserved at the Musée des Arts Décoratifs in Paris, as well as in period publications. It is notably visible on a coffee table in Jean Royère's own apartment on rue du Faubourg Saint-Honoré, Paris, in a series of photographs dated 1946.

(1919 – 2001)Born in Bahia, in the north of Brazil, Jose Zanine Caldas is a self-taught designer, artist and architect. He moved to Rio and started an architectural scale model workshop where he worked with modernist pioneers such as Lucio Costa and Oscar Niemeyer.

Working with plywood for his models, he realised how the innovative material was also adequate for furniture that he started designing in the 1940s. For 12 years, he produced innovative and elegant furniture in plywood under the name "Moveis Artisticos z". With the military coup in 1964, he lost his position of professor at the University of Brasilia. Persecuted by the authoritarian regime, he lived between Rio de Janeiro and Bahia, and had the most creative period of his life.

A pioneer in the respect of the environment, he experimented with more organic designs and vigorously protected Brazilian forests. The line "denuncia" was born from this will to denounce deforestation which ravaged brazil. Rescuing abandoned logs and trees, he carved from them highly sculptural pieces which stand out between art and furniture. The fascination with that work has grown since the 1980s, as they resound with contemporary concerns of sustainability and protection of crafts. Zanine's work has been exhibited in the Musée des Arts Decoratifs in Paris and throughout the US and Europe.

# JOAQUIM TENREIRO



(1906 – 1992) Joaquim Tenreiro was a pioneer of modernist Brazilian furniture, earning him the title of the "father" of modern furniture in Brazil.

Tenreiro was born in Portugal into a family of woodworkers and carpenters. In the late 1920s, he emigrated to Rio de Janeiro and began working for the firm Laubisch Hirth. In the early 1940s, Tenreiro established his own furniture studio, where his work started to gain wider recognition.

His design philosophy centered around the concept of "lightness," focusing on elegance, grace, and the use of space.

This vision strongly resonated with architects who embraced modernism, and his most notable client was Oscar Niemeyer, for whom he designed furniture for various projects.







# JORGE ZALSZUPIN



(1922 - 2020) Jorge Zalszupin grew up in Warsaw, Poland, and studied architecture in Bucharest before moving to Paris to work as an architect, and then to Brazil

In the late 40s. In 1959, Zalszupin started the furniture firm L'atelier. Emphasizing a high level of craftsmanship, L'atelier saw near-immediate success and eventually had two factories producing his designs.

Zalszupin was heavily inspired by Danish design and while he was known for his refined work in jacaranda and other Brazilian woods.

L'atelier thrived in Brazil, having ten shops at the height of zalszupin's career. His furniture also won numerous commissions, including in brasilia.

Jorge zalszupin is considered one of Brazil's most important designers of the twentieth century.







# FRANCOIS MONNET



(B 1946 - )Monnet grew up in the 1960s and was inspired by the artistic atmosphere of that time. In the art world, a multitude of powerful changes were also taking place. Pop Art, through the works of Andy Warhol, Roy Lichtenstein, and Tom Wesselmann, was progressively dismantling the foundations upon which the production and reception of art were built by embracing mass media culture. Drawing inspiration from popular culture imagery and mass consumption, pop artists challenged the authority of high art and created an avant-garde movement. Simultaneously, minimalism rejected any form of emotional expression and focused on the theoretical aspects of art, aiming for pure visual responses. Simplicity and the absence of emotions were key concepts of the highly influential Minimalist movement.

Less concerned with the gestural elements of abstract expressionism, minimalist artists concentrated on creating artworks primarily composed of clean, sharp lines and geometric elements.

The very first emergence of conceptualism was strongly influenced by the purity of minimalism but went further by rejecting all preexisting conceptions inherent to art, akin to what pop artists were attempting to achieve by elevating popular culture to the status of high art.







# RENÉ-JEAN CAILLETTE



(1919–2004) Son of a woodworker, Caillette always intended to follow in his father's footsteps. For him, the beauty of furniture came from functionality and simplicity of line.

George Charron, a French furniture manufacturer, discovered Caillette's work in 1950. This led to the creation of Group 4, a collaboration among Caillette, Alain Richard, Genevieve Dangles and Joseph André Motte. Caillette went on to design for Charron until 1972.

Caillette received the René Gabriel prize in 1952 and the silver medal at the Milan Triennale in 1962. The Diamond Chair, designed in 1958 and editioned by Steiner, remains one of the most signature chairs of this period. "It is," he said, "the most pure and the most easy to fabricate of my models in molded plywood. I designed it with a piece of cardboard, telling myself that if the cardboard could fold, then so could wood." (From Favardin, Patrick, Les Décorateurs des Années 50, 2002.)



# GINO SARFATTI



(1912–1985) Sarfatti was an Italian lighting designer and entrepreneur, widely celebrated for his contributions to modern Italian lighting and is often seen as a central figure in relation to Italian Rationalism. Trained in naval engineering, Sarfatti founded the influential company Arteluce in 1939, which quickly became a hub for innovation and collaboration among Italy's leading mid-century designers.

His work redefined the possibilities of lighting, blending technical ingenuity with elegant, often minimalist, forms to create over 700 original luminaires during his career. Sarfatti's lamps are renowned for their sculptural qualities, with a unique approach that began by designing the bulb's structure before shaping the full design. His innovative use of new materials,

production techniques, and light sources including early adoption of halogen bulbs and neon strip lights—set new standards in the industry.

The company Arteluce earned several prestigious awards, including the Compasso d'Oro in 1954 and 1955, solidifying Sarfatti's position as a leading figure in 20th-century design.

Throughout his career, Sarfatti fostered lasting collaborations with architects and fellow designers such as Franco Albini, Vittoriano Viganò, and Marco Zanuso. His work extended beyond private homes to include public buildings, cruise ships, theaters, and museums, significantly influencing Italy's post-war architectural landscape. His work is highly sought after by collectors for their clarity, innovation, and timeless elegance.



# ANGELO LELLI



(1915–1979) In 1947, Lelli founded Arredoluce, a premier manufacturer of furniture and lighting, in Monza. During the same year, at the VIII Triennale di Milano, he exhibited Lamp 12128, which became known as the Triennale Floor Lamp.

Angelo Lelli became an influential designer in postwar Italy, especially in the field of modern lighting design. During the 1950s, Arredoluce started to collaborate with such designers as Franco Albini, Achille, Castiglioni, Gio Ponti, and Ettore Sottsass, and also started to experiment with halogen lightbulbs, for his designs. Out of this experimentation, Lelli increased the use of transformers for his designs and created the recognizable Arredoluce Switch.

Angelo Lelli's lamps and lighting objects stand out for their extremely simple designs that strive for minimal complexity and for their strong sense of unadorned sensitivity. Thanks to Angelo Lelli's unique approach to design, Arredoluce quickly built a reputation for creating premium quality products based on clean, simple, and functional designs.



# LICEU DE ARTES



Founded in 1873, the Liceu de artes e ofícios in São Paulo was established in order to lead the Arts & Crafts movement to Brazil. Robert Guillerme studied design and architecture at the Boulle School in France, graduating at the top of his class in 1934. Jacques Chambron, on the other hand, graduated from the School of Applied Arts in Reims, France. Sharing a profound passion for interior design, it was only natural that these two men would form a deep friendship during the tragic events of World War II. Jacques Chambron quickly resigned from his job as a painter and decorator in Paris in 1948 to join the Guillerme family in northern France.

In 1949, Guillerme and Chambron crossed paths with Émile Dariosecq, a master cabinetmaker. Not only was Emile Dariosecq a skilled cabinetmaker, but he also had a workshop in their region. It was from this encounter that they decided to establish the company "Votre Maison." By combining functionality and design, Guillerme and Chambron would create their global reputation while leaving a lasting mark on the world of design. In the 1970s, Hervé Chambron, the son of Jacques Chambron and a design graduate, joined "Votre Maison" and took over the business in 1983.





Pierre Guariche (1910 - 1991) After graduating from the Ecole Nationale Superieure des Arts Decorative in Paris, Pierre Guariche began an internship with Marcel Gascoin, an important designer of the postwar period. His career began to take off as a designer in 1950 after his first light was produced, the "Rotaflex" lamp. Pierre Guariche then went on to show many objects in the "Salon des Arts Menagers" and in the "Salon des Artistes Decorateurs." In 1951, he collaborated with a number of different companies, producing furniture and design objects, such as the Mai Gallery, the Airborne Company, or the lighting manufacturer, Pierre Disderot. Cantù Móveis e Interiores Ltda., a notable player in Brazilian modern design during the 1960s, was led by architects Jorge Jabour Mauad and Osires Cunha Meale. 

Maxime Old (1910 - 1991), born, in Maisons-Alfort, a Parisian suburb, came from a lineage of fine cabinet makers in the Faubourg St. Antoine, a hub of this craft. #### Biography

Interior architect and designer Michel Boyer, studied under renowned decorator, André Arbus and began his career specializing in office furniture in corporate interiors, offices and banks. He is known for his clean sleek shapes and monoblock designs with a luxurious undertone. Boyer played with solids and voids in familiar geometric shapes and established a certain standard of 1970s style. By the end of the 1960s, Boyer began receiving many private commissions for prestigious clients such as Elie de Rothschild, Lilian Betencourt and Karim Aga Khan. One of his most well known commissions was for the interior architecture of the Rothschild Bank in the 70s. He also worked with fashion designers including Lanvin, Dior and Balmain. His designs emanate the inviting comfort of objects and interiors made for people not for buildings.

#### Biography

A descendant of an eminent Ticino-based family of artists, he opened his own glass making shop in 1921 after working as an apprentice at the Giannotti glassworks. In the early 1920s, he took part in the Venice Biennale, the Monza Biennale, the Exposition des Arts Décoratifs in Paris and exhibitions in Cologne and Barcelona. His work combines extreme modernity with outstanding technical ability. His creations include the glass windows of the Trieste Stock Exchange, the windows of the Motorship Victoria as well as those of the transatlantic liner Conte di Savoia.

In 1932, Pietro Chiesa was asked by Gio Ponti to share in the artistic direction of the newborn FontanaArte, a role that would enable him to give full expression to his creative flair by designing over a thousand different objects (furniture, tables, lamps, glass windows, objets d'art etc). Some of these pieces took their place in the history of design and are still produced by FontanaArte today, such as the Fontana curved table (1932), the Cartoccio vase (1932) and the Luminator floor lamp (1933)..

#### Biography

Luciano Frigerio (1928-1999) was an Italian artist and designer. As early as 1889 Frigerios father opened his own workshop manufacturing high-quality cabinets and libraries. Seeing the opportunities which were opening up for designers and architects in post-war Italy, the young Luciano Friggerio decided to carry on his fathers work and set himself the task of turning the family workshop into a large-scale business. Friggerio began to visit the workshops of renowned architects, including Franco Albini and Carlo De Carli, and applied what he had learned to his own work. After a short time, Frigerios company grew into a large design studio, Frigerio di desio, which was oriented not only towards Italy, but also towards the international market.


Luciano Frigerio made design history with his Mobili Scultura concept. Frigerios signature furniture-sculptures were the skilful combination of decorative elements in wood and metal, which went far beyond the standard production of industrial design objects of the era. During his career, Frigerio collaborated with renowned Italian architects such as Franco Albini, Sergio Asti and later Paolo Portoghesi. By the 1970s Frigerio had opened more than ten shops for his sculptural pieces all over Italy, the largest being on the famous via Montenapoleone in Milan. Nowadays many pieces of furniture designed by Luciano Frigerio are displayed in major art galleries in Europe and the USA.







#### Biography

The 1950s was a significant period for contemporary ceramics, with the Accolay factory playing a key role. During this time, artists and ceramicists were experimenting with various techniques, such as hollow decorations, layering slip and colored enamels, creating different textures, and using challenging red enamels. The Poterie d'Accolay refers to a community of potters based in Accolay, Yonne, led by André Boutaud, Louis Dangon, Slavic Paley, and Raude, who were former students of Alexandre Kostanda. Later, decorators like Raphaël Giarrusso, Georges Pelletier, and sculptor Pierre Merlier made their mark on this artistic period.

The ceramics were known for their unique decorations and a variety of forms, including pots, wall plates, lamps, and masks. This creative period was so successful that by 1958-1960, the ceramic industry employed around sixty people and opened several exhibition stores along major roads, including RN6 in Vermenton, Arcy sur Cure, and Appoigny, RN7 in Pouilly sur Loire, and the road from Dijon to Fixin.

#### Biography

Jean Derval is a French ceramist. A graduate of the School of Applied Arts in Paris as a graphic designer and poster designer, Jean Derval pursued his vocation for ceramics following the creation of stoneware services for the goldsmith house Christofle. It was during his stay in the Maubrou-Pigaglio workshop in 1945 that he learned the trade of ceramist by learning various techniques and turning. The artist joined his comrades Robert Picault and Roger Capron in 1947 in Vallauris and entered the famous Madoura workshop in 1949 where he worked alongside the Andalusian master for two years. It was in 1951 that Jean Derval chose the difficult path of the "unique piece" after founding his own workshop "Le Portail". By reinterpreting lessons from cubism and abstraction, the artist then offers a vast repertoire of domestic pottery of mainly anthropomorphic and zoomorphic inspiration, but also religious subjects that his Christian fervor pushes him to treat, leaving all the same a important place in Greek mythology which echoes its Mediterranean roots.

The end of the 1960s was marked by a shift in taste towards sandstones with austere hues, at the expense of the colored earthenware favored by Jean Derval, who moved towards architectural ceramics at the end of the 1960s and created his works with a vision of sculptor.

Mado Jolain was born in Paris in 1921. Trained at the Ecole des arts décoratifs in Paris, Mado Jolain also attended the workshop of La Grande Chaumière where she met her husband, the painter René Legrand. In 1946, she moved to a studio on Rue d'Alésia.

#### Biography

Roger Capron (1922 – 2006), a versatile ceramic artist who made a mark in the 1960s and 1980s, is celebrated as one of the leading ceramicists of his time. In 1946, Capron relocated to Vallauris, France, a renowned pottery town, and established his studio. His journey in Vallauris included interactions with none other than Picasso, who joined the community a year later to explore his own ceramic endeavors. Capron was a pioneer of the "formes libres" movement during the 1940s, and his work was characterized by playful undulating forms, vibrant colors, and lighthearted touches.

As the years progressed, Capron's style evolved towards mid-century modernism, drawing inspiration from Scandinavian design from the 1950s and 1960s. He crafted colorful tiled tables in sleek, simple, and functional forms.

He established the "Callis" ceramic workshop in 1946, embracing the motto of his mentor René Gabriel: "to make the beautiful within the reach of all." In doing so, Capron significantly contributed to the revival of ceramics in Vallauris, rubbing shoulders with other notable artists like Picasso. In 1952, he took a significant step by founding the "Atelier Capron," a small factory that employed around fifty skilled artisans.

#### Biography

Gilbert Valentin, (1928 – 2000) born in Nancy in 1928, had his first encounter with ceramics in 1946 in Dieulefit, where he was introduced to the fundamental techniques of this art. Following this initial experience, he embarked on a professional apprenticeship in the ceramic section of the National School of Vierzon (now Lycée Henri-Brisson). Subsequently, he worked as a ceramic engineer at the pottery of Lunéville-Saint-Clément. With a solid grasp of ceramic techniques, particularly enamels, he embarked on his ceramic career.

In 1950, Gilbert Valentin made the decision to relocate to Vallauris, where he established Les Archanges. Here, he welcomed numerous artists, including painters, sculptors, musicians, and writers, forming friendships with notable figures such as Pablo Picasso, Jacques Prévert, Georges Braque, and Jean Cocteau. Valentin actively contributed to the evolution of forms and decorative styles. His preference for robust pieces led to innovations in design, such as handle-less pitchers and the exploration of zoomorphic forms in smaller and medium-sized works.

A distinctive feature of this period, easily recognizable, was the abstract decoration set against a backdrop of black or grey granite, with vibrant splashes of pure colors.

Based in Beirut, Zein Daouk is a multidisciplinary architect with a passion for ceramics and an obsession for creating.

Her journey into clay begins in 1999, but it is only in 2020 that it becomes her voice and she devotes herself to ceramics professionally.

Her work embraces the dialogue that links disciplines and highlights the fluid narrative between functional art and sculptural design.

She explores form by working with the four elements; water stretches shapes into earth, air commits them to form and fire becomes the founding act that brings them to life. ### FRERES CLOUTIER



The twin brothers Robert and Jean Cloutier were French ceramists and sculptors with a long and prolific career. They worked with a variety of materials, ranging from ceramics and glazed earthenware to porcelain, stoneware, plaster, and terracotta. Their work occupies a unique place in French ceramics of the second half of the 20th century.

The Cloutier brothers drew upon a mastery of techniques acquired under the tutelage of Lafourcade, Georges Jouve, and Pol Chambost, skills they continued to hone in their own workshop, which opened in 1955. Their work, which is part of the revival of French ceramics, is most often utilitarian and decorative, comprising tableware, pots, vases, lamps, ashtrays, and trinket trays; but it also includes elements of interior architecture such as screen walls, glazed tiles, tables, and more.

Through their ever-evolving, dreamlike world, the work of the Cloutier Brothers, initially influenced by Georges Jouve and Marie Vassilieff, ultimately shifted towards a more decorative style towards the end of their careers.

Throughout their careers, the Cloutier Brothers remained unaffected by trends and changes in their discipline, exploring a style that art critics describe as "naive, humorous, poetic, dreamlike, mythological, biomorphic, anthropomorphic, and anthropozoomorphic." In the 1960s, they developed new firing techniques, as well as a red glaze, "Cloutier Red," which achieved international success and became a hallmark of the Cloutier Brothers. Their creations are recognized in France and abroad, notably in Japan and the United States.



His work was devoted to the creation of furniture, jewellery, glass, lamps, objects for the home and office, as well as the design of many buildings and interiors. Raised in Turin, he graduated in Architecture at the Turin Polytechnic in 1939. In 1947 he founded his own architecture and industrial design studio in Milan, where he worked with various media. In 1956, Sottsass moved to New York where he began working in the studio of the designer George Nelson. His return to Italy was marked by the beginning of an important association with Poltronova (1957) and Olivetti (1958).


