CARAVAN SITES AND CONTROL OF DEVELOPMENT ACT 1960

**PARAGRAPH 5
CERTIFICATE OF EXEMPTION**

Subject to the provisions of paragraph 12 of the First Schedule to the Caravan Sites and Control of Development Act 1960, the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (hereinafter called the "Secretary of State") may grant a certificate of exemption for the purposes of paragraph 5 of the said Schedule to any organisation as to which they are satisfied that its objectives include the encouragement or promotion of recreational activities.

THEREFORE the Secretary of State in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Schedule hereby grants:

this certificate under the said paragraph 12 dated the 22nd day of October 2025.

Notes

1. This certificate is withdrawable at any time, and in any event will cease to be valid on the 12th December 2030
2. This certificate is granted only for the use of the organisation named and is not transferable to any other organisation.
3. This certificate is granted only for use in England.



RESPONSIBILITIES OF HOLDING A PARAGRAPH 5 EXEMPTION CERTIFICATE

Certificates can only be used by the named organisation and cannot be transferred to other organisations.

Any changes to the details recorded on the exemption certificate, the Code of Conduct, or Constitution must be reported in writing to Natural England.

Organisations exempted under paragraph 5 may issue certificates to particular sites, stating that the land has been approved by them for use by their members for the purposes of recreation, valid for up to 12 months at a time. No more than 5 caravans / motorhomes can be stationed on a paragraph 5 site at one time.

Events are not permitted to be held on certified sites. Events being operated under Paragraph 4 or 6 must be on clearly separate land with a permanent border in between.

Natural England expects that before issuing a certified site certificate an exempted organisation has a system in place for consulting neighbours and the relevant local planning authority and any other appropriate authorities such as highways and designated landscapes.

Each organisation has to send details of the certificates it has issued to the relevant planning authority and Natural England every quarter.

Organisations must be sensitive to the concerns of local residents who may be affected by frequent or large-scale caravanning activities and avoid overuse of sites.

Organisations must be responsive to all valid complaints about the use of a site and to make every effort to reach agreement with those concerned.

Organisations should not use sites where planning permission has been refused or where enforcement action has been taken.

Any changes to the details recorded on the exemption certificate, the Code of Conduct, or Constitution must be reported in writing to Natural England.

Permission to use land within the following designated sites must be sought prior to authorising land for exempted use.

- a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI), Special Areas of Conservation (SAC), Special Protection Areas (SPA), Ramsar, or National Nature Reserve (NNR), you must request permission from Natural England by emailing protectedsites@naturalengland.org.uk
- a National Landscape (previously Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB)), you must request permission from your local National Landscape Unit. Contact details can be found at the following website: [National Landscapes - Home \(national-landscapes.org.uk\)](http://national-landscapes.org.uk).
- a National Park: you must notify National Parks England of your intention to meet in the National Park by 30 May, the year before your rally or event is going to take place, by emailing enquiries@nationalparksengland.org.uk.
