Auto theft in Canada is a national crisis:

vehicles were stolen in the first half of 2023 in Canada











Ontario is seeing the greatest number of thefts (+31%), followed by Quebec (+17%) year-over- year in the first half of 2023



Organized crime rings are focusing their efforts on stealing new/luxury vehicles for maximum profit in overseas sales

Auto theft is a public safety issue:

Polling is based on an online survey commissioned by Équité Association and Insurance Bureau of Canada among members of the Angus Reid Forum, from September 12 to September 18, 2023, with a representative sample of 2,503 Canadian adults (aged 18+). The survey results were balanced and weighted on age, gender, region and education according to the latest census data. For comparison purposes only, a sample of this size would yield a margin of error of +/- 1.8 percentage points at a 95% confidence level.
