


What Do We Understand About Gender-based Violence?

Gender-based violence (GBV) is an umbrella term for harmful acts directed at a person because of their gender, gender identity/expression, or socially ascribed gender roles (*UN Women, n.d.*).

Common forms include physical, sexual, psychological, and economic abuse; intimate partner violence; sexual harassment and assault; harmful practices; trafficking; reproductive coercion; and technology-facilitated abuse (*WHO, n.d.*).





Filipino women aged 15–49 had experienced physical, sexual, or emotional violence by an intimate partner at least once (NDHS, 2022).
