This inspiring youth empowerment event features renowned speakers, innovative thought leaders and dynamic performers with WE Co-founder, Craig Kielburger, co-hosts Keshia Chante, Millie Davis, Maripier Morin and Tai Young, alongside Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Celebrity Marauders, Connor Franta, Twin Flames, Elle Mills, Now United, Johnny Orlando, Tyler Shaw, Lizzie Velasquez, Spencer West and <u>more</u>.

More than a one-day event, WE Day is connected to the free, yearlong educational program <u>WE Schools</u>. The program is designed to enhance a school or community's existing social initiatives or spark new ones. WE Schools provides participants with curriculum, educational resources and action campaigns, encouraging students to further their curricular learning and develop life skills to succeed beyond the classroom. In the 2017/2018 school year, 3,200 schools and school groups across Ontario improved the world through WE Schools, volunteering over 1.8 million hours and raising more than \$4.8 million in support of over 1,900 global and local causes including bringing awareness to homelessness, food security, LGBTS+2s rights, access to education, access to clean water and the environment.

WE Day is free of charge to students and educators across Canada thanks to the generous support of partners led by National Co-Title Sponsors <u>RBC</u> and <u>TELUS</u>. This means students can't buy a ticket to WE Day Ottawa—youth from across the province earn their way by taking action on one local and one global issue of their choice.
