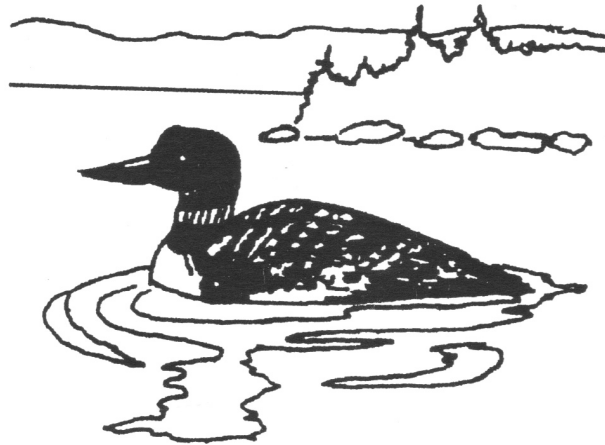

Have you ever taken a trip around Cold Stream Pond and noticed the explosion of a craft known as a “party boat”? Seems they are everywhere with more each year. Back in the early sixties, my Dad came up with the notion of building a flat deck boat to enjoy on CSP and with the help of friends he procured some barrels from the local tannery and had them welded together at what was known at the time as Shorey’s Garage. While welding, one of them forgot to take out a pitcock and the end barrel sizzled away, blowing all the windows out of the garage. Luckily no one was hurt, only a few wild-eyed onlookers happy to have din-din again. Next, the decking and enclosure was built out of plywood and a 25 horse green Johnson to power it.

Over the next five years, we partied and barbequed most every weekend on the lake and spent the hot days sometimes overnight at Sandy Beach. Everyone wanted to be on it and many friends had countless days with us cruising the lake. It was slow and fun. Mom and Dad then bought a camp near Morgan’s Beach so our sailing days came to an end, but not the memories of leisurely boating on this beautiful lake of ours. My Dad was called “Noah” by his friends, his adventurous spirit made him, as far as we can tell, one of the first party boat owners. For a kid, it was a great way to spend time with family and friends.

What, no contact person for your road?! Then whom do you call? It would be nice if every road had a contact person and it doesn't take much to be one. All you need is a set of eyes (or even just one eye would do!) to look at the road, potholes, ditches and culverts. You could even check while walking your dog! Or cat! Unkept roads, ditches and culverts lead to erosion. Erosion heads to the lake and that isn't good. Too much erosion will contaminate the lake. It could even lower the value of your property. So who is going step up and be the Road Contact person for your road? You get to bond with your neighbors and meet with other Road Contacts once a year.

Report from Nels Kramer, Fisheries Biologist

Penobscot Region - Enfield

As is often the case, last fall on October 16, we set two trapnets at Cold Stream Pond. One net was fished at Webb Cove and one by the outlet. We fished those nets until November 1. In total, we handled 117 togue (lake trout) and 182 landlocked salmon. Mean length and weight of all togue handled was 20.6" and 2.9 pounds, respectively.

The mean length and weight of the landlocked salmon are as follows:

We also conducted a creel survey last winter and were able to interview 331 anglers, and measure 46 brook trout, 85 togue and 66 landlocked salmon. Anglers released 11 legal brook trout, 61 legal lake trout and 48 legal salmon. There were on 2 sub-legal lake trout reported by anglers.

As most area anglers and campowners are aware, someone illegally stocked smallmouth bass into the Cold Stream Watershed sometime in the 1990's. The bass have established themselves and are now caught regularly by anglers fishing all the lakes in the drainage. While smallmouth bass are an popular gamefish, they are not native to Maine and where illegally stocked can create problems with predation and competition with our native stocks of fish.

They certainly do prey on small trout, salmon and togue at certain areas of the lake at certain times of the year, but the biggest impact may be through competition for food. Smallmouth bass will consume smelts when available, and will venture outside their "normal" habitat to feed on smelts, thus competing with salmon and trout and impacting their rate of growth.

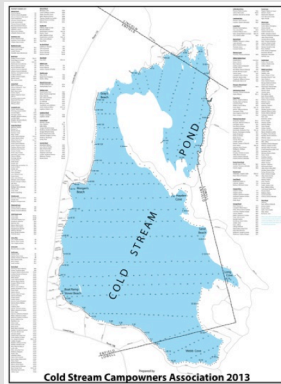
Loon Nesting Platforms: Your Help is Needed
