



# Generative AI Ethics (GAIE) Policy

As a leading voice in the intersecting worlds of education and technology, Crimson aims to promote technological innovation while critically engaging with its development and usage. The following policy is an agreement amongst all community members to prioritize transparency, accountability, and academic integrity as we strive to help our students succeed in all of their endeavors.

## Students will:

- Declare when and how AI has been used as an aid.
  - What tools were used?
  - How were they used?
  - Why were they used?
- Abide by Crimson's standards of academic integrity if using AI. All words and ideas must be your own.
- Take responsibility for the accuracy and integrity of your work.
- Use AI as an aid to deepen learning, rather than as a substitute for creative thinking.

## Crimson Staff will:

- Seek to understand AI beyond surface-level knowledge, including both benefits and risks.
- Advise on best practices, in line with the protocols of top universities.
- Employ AI detection tools if concerned about unethical AI usage, while remaining aware that detection tools are far from perfect and may produce both false positives and negatives.
- Enforce standards of academic integrity as related to dishonest or unthoughtful usage of AI.

All Crimson community members recognize that:

- This policy must be enacted and adhered to in good faith.
- Crimson team-members may employ a more restrictive approach to AI as they see fit to the benefit of their students.
- This policy may be revised as generative AI technology develops.
