APRIL IS MATHEMATICS AND STATISTICS AWARENESS MONTH Celebrating how maths and statistics help solve real-world problems, from cybersecurity to technology and logistics.

In the British Army, maths supports everything from engineering and data analysis to route planning and technical trades - **showing students how mathematical skills lead to real, impactful careers.**



CLASSROOM SUBJECTS TO CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

FROM THE ICT CLASSROOM TO CAREER PATHWAYS IN THE ROYAL SIGNALS

The ICT and Computer Science curriculum develops digital skills that are essential across the modern British Army. Many Army roles rely on coding, cybersecurity, networking, data handling and understanding how communications systems operate — **all of which are core elements of KS3–KS5 ICT and Computer Science.**

ICT LESSONS

CYBERSECURITY FUNDAMENTALS

Staying safe online, spotting threats and using secure practices - directly linked to protecting Army networks.

NETWORKS & SYSTEMS

Understanding how devices connect and how data moves - essential for running Army communications and IT systems.

DATA HANDLING & ANALYSIS

Use data as the foundation to analyse information and share vital information with other branches in the Army such as intelligence teams.

ROYAL SIGNALS

A Royal Signals Operator keeps the Army connected worldwide, using advanced communication and IT systems to ensure information is sent quickly, securely and reliably in any environment.

WHAT THEY DO

- Set up and maintain communication networks, including radio, digital, and satellite systems used across the Army.
- Operate secure communication tools, ensuring messages, data and intelligence reach the right people at the right time.
- Troubleshoot network and system issues under pressure, keeping communication lines open during missions.

ARMY APPLICATION: AT A GLANCE MAKING THAT FINAL STEP: TRAINING

HINTS AND TIPS

Any application to join the British Army starts with an online application.

- 1** Encourage them to build up their fitness gradually
Basic Training is tough, so encourage steady improvement in running, strength, and fitness. Remind them that effort and progress matter more than perfection.
- 2** Help them establish healthy habits before they go
Discuss the importance of good sleep, regular hydration and balanced meals. Highlight that getting 7–8 hours of sleep and drinking plenty of water can make a big difference to how well they cope with training.
- 3** Support them in developing organisation and routine
Explain that much of Basic Training involves daily admin: keeping kit tidy, following routines and preparing for inspections. Encouraging them to practise these organisational skills now will boost their confidence.
- 4** Prepare them for the mental side of the training
Encourage positive thinking, realistic goal-setting and self-belief — traits that help them stay resilient during tough moments.
- 5** Talk to them about early exposure to teamwork and basic skills
Teamwork, problem-solving and outdoor activities are core parts of Basic Training. These experiences can help them feel more prepared when they start learning fieldcraft, first aid and equipment use during training.
- 6** Encourage them to stay in touch with their recruiter
Remind them that their recruiter is there to guide them through the process — whether they need help preparing, have questions about assessment, or want reassurance before they begin.
